Quarantine Material Interceptions (QMI)

The goal of this data dictionary is to provide insight into how users should read and analyze the raw data available for download.

I. Tips when working with QMI data:

- 1. Statistical information is subject to change due to corrections, systems' changes, change in data definition, additional information, or incidents pending final review.
- 2. Counts are available for *Ag Passenger Interceptions* and *AK9 Passenger Interceptions* in this datasets:
 - a. *Ag Passenger Interceptions*: the number of total QMIs.
 - b. *AK9 Passenger Interceptions:* the number of QMIs by Agriculture K-9 officers. This number is a subset of *Ag Passenger Interceptions* and is not additive.
 - c. **Example of how to read data:** In the example scenario below, the data should be read as "500 total interceptions were made, of which 50 were by K-9 officers." It should *not* be read as "550 total interceptions were made."
