COASTAL INTERCEPTOR VESSEL

The 41-foot SAFE boat, also known as the Coastal Interceptor Vessel, is used by Air and Marine Operations (AMO) in coastal waters to combat maritime smuggling and defend the waterways along our nation's borders from terrorism.

With its advanced hull design, safety equipment and electronics, this vessel provides agents with the protection, mobility, and reliability to intercept and apprehend maritime smugglers.

A Coastal Interceptor Vessel 3-person (minimum) crew works together with AMO's aviation assets and other federal, state, and local law enforcement entities to accomplish the homeland security mission.

The Coastal Interceptor Vessel is integral in AMO's strategy to secure U.S. borders and enforce U.S. laws.
