



★ SAFEGUARDING THE NATION FROM THE AIR AND SEA ★

Air and Marine Operations (AMO) is an operational component of U.S. Customs and Border Protection, with over 1,800 federal agents and mission support personnel conducting its mission in the air and maritime environments at and beyond the border, and within the nation's interior. AMO operates throughout the United States, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Agents pilot over 200 airplanes, helicopters, and unmanned aircraft, command and oversee over 300 marine vessels, and operate surveillance systems to detect, interdict, and prevent acts of terrorism as well as the unlawful movement of people, illicit drugs, and other contraband into the United States.

AMO interdicts unlawful people and cargo approaching U.S. borders, investigates criminal networks, provides domain awareness in the air and maritime environments, and responds to contingencies and national taskings.

- 244,781 lbs of Cocaine
- 43,374 lbs of Marijuana
- 2,235 lbs of Fentanyl
- 3,096 lbs of Heroin
- 3,061 lbs of Methamphetamine
- 1,499 weapons
- \$12.5 million

Enforcement action:

- 48,609 apprehensions of illegal aliens
- 1,009 arrests
