

Automation of the Electronic Vessel Manifest Confidentiality Request Process

On May 22, 2020, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will deploy an automated online application for submitting electronic vessel manifest confidentiality requests. This enhancement will enable ocean carriers, importers, exporters and consignees utilizing ocean transportation to manage their own confidentiality requests electronically via an online application.

What will change?

Currently, carriers, importers, exporters, or consignees may submit mail or email requests for confidential treatment of their name and address on inward and outward vessel manifests, which typically requires 60-90 days for processing. The new enhancement will automate this process via an online application, located on CBP.gov, reducing the processing time of confidentiality requests to as little as 24 hours.

In addition, the new online application will enable companies and individuals to directly input all applicable name variations as part of their confidentiality request. This will enhance the requesting party's ability to ensure that a name provided matches the name entered electronically in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE).
