# AD/CVD Flags for EAPA Evasion and Injunctions

Last updated: December 21, 2020



On January 16, 2021, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will deploy to the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) the Antidumping and Countervailing Duty (AD/CVD) indicator flags for Enforce and Protect Act (EAPA) investigation and court injunction actions.

This capability will provide trade users with two new suspension/extension codes that indicate whether an Entry Summary is subject to EAPA investigation or a court injunction action. This enhancement includes Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) impacts.

## What will change for trade users?

## • Additional Extension/Suspension Status Code 1

- Once an Entry Number Query Request (J1-Record) has been made, users will be able to see the following two new codes that indicate the reason for the extension or suspension of the Entry Summary liquidation:
  - Code 65 alerts users if an Entry Summary is subject to Court Injunction.
  - Code 66 alerts users if an Entry Summary is subject to EAPA investigation.

# What actions will users need to take to see the new reason codes?

- System Updates
  - Trade users will need to update their software to see the two new reason codes in the system.
  - o CBP recommends that users allow ample time to test the codes and query requests.
