

United States – Mexico – Canada Agreement: Drawback Changes Information Notice

Last Updated: February 18, 2021



On March 13, 2021, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will complete changes to the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) for Drawback processing as part of the implementation of the United States – Mexico – Canada Agreement (USMCA). This enhancement will further align Drawback processing with the USMCA's requirements.

What will change for trade users?

- Following this deployment, a new USMCA indicator will be available for trade users to signal when USMCA is being claimed on a Drawback (Entry Type 47) submission.
- The following two new provision codes will be available for Drawback:
 - 76 - TFTEA 1313(b) USMCA SUGAR MFG EXCEPTION
 - 77 - TFTEA 1313(j)(2) USMCA Exceptions
