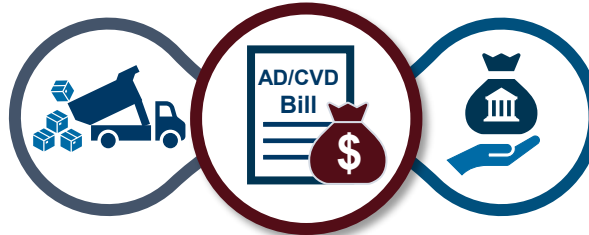
EAPA RESULTS*

- Prevented the evasion of **\$215M** unpaid AD/CVD in FY20
- 30 foreign verifications
- 131 investigations launched
- Identified over **\$533M** AD/CVD owed to the USG

EAPA INVESTIGATES AD/CVD EVASION

Dumping
Goods sold in U.S. below the sale price in the producer's "home market" or below cost of production



AD/CVD Duties
Offset the dumping and/or subsidy value to level the playing field for injured U.S. industries

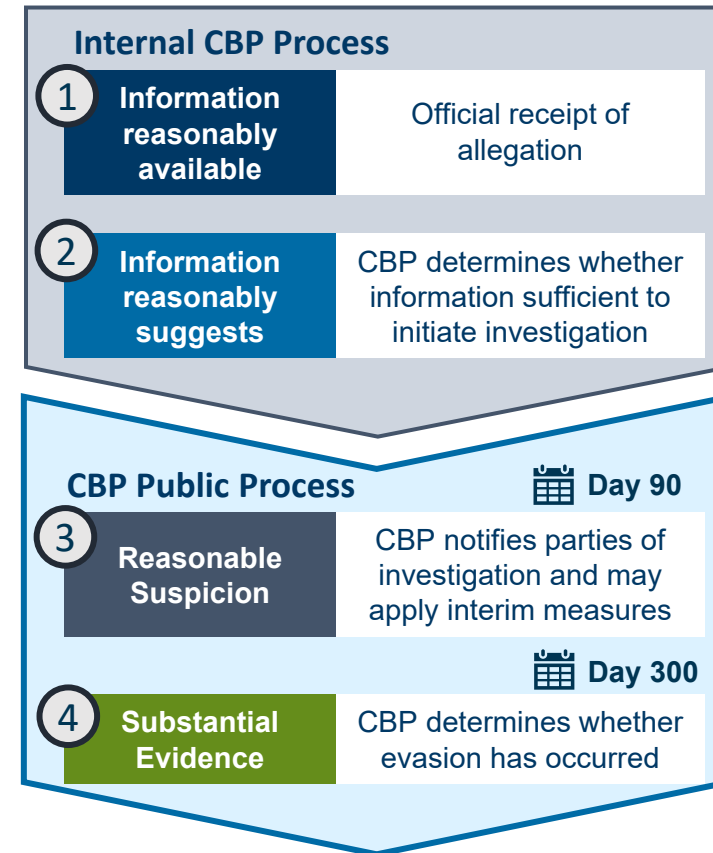
Subsidization
Foreign subsidized industries sell goods at lower prices in the U.S. that do not reflect market

What makes an EAPA allegation unique?

- Only interested parties (defined in 19 C.F.R. § 165.1) may file and allegations must be specific to AD/CVD evasion
- Allegers must provide their identity and contact information
- Allegers must include a description of covered merchandise and the applicable AD/CVD order(s)
- Allegers must provide reasonably available information that suggests evasion of an AD/CVD order
