Emergency Phone Call Leads To Double Rescue *Border Patrol Agents Respond*

TUCSON, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents rescued four individuals after an injured hiker makes an emergency phone call.

Yesterday afternoon two U.S. citizens became stranded in the mountains after one fell and sustained head and back injuries. The hikers were near Baboquivari Peak, approximately 35 miles southwest of Green Valley, when they used a cell phone to call for help. Border Patrol agents working on the search, trauma and rescue team – known as BORSTAR – were immediately dispatched on a CBP Air and Marine Blackhawk helicopter. Due to the rough terrain, responding agents requested a Department of Public Safety helicopter with hoist capabilities to assist in the extraction of the injured hiker. Following the rescue, the hiker was flown to Tucson for further treatment.

After the initial rescue, agents regrouped to launch a new search for more individuals reportedly lost in the same mountain range. Agents assigned to the Casa Grande Station and BORSTAR as well as multiple helicopters, to include Life Flight and DPS, assisted in the search. Two individuals from El Salvador were located and immediately given medical treatment by Border Patrol emergency medical technicians for heat exhaustion. One individual was transported to Tucson for further evaluation.

The Border Patrol is committed to saving lives. Tucson Sector has more than 200 Border Patrol agents trained as EMTs capable of rendering aid to anyone in distress.

Border Patrol Rescues Guatemalan National

TUCSON, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents conducting training operations north of Sasabe, Ariz., discovered a Guatemalan male face down in the desert Saturday evening. The man, who had entered the U.S. illegally, was found alive but unconscious approximately 17 miles north of the border in the Sonoran desert.

Due to the remote terrain, emergency medical services were contacted immediately while agents prepared a helicopter landing zone. A Customs and Border Protection Office of Air and Marine helicopter was diverted to the scene to extract the man and fly him to SR-286 for transport to a hospital for further evaluation and treatment.

The blistering heat is but one of the many dangers encountered by illegal aliens attempting to cross the desert on foot. Between Oct. 1, 2011, and May 1, 2012, Border Patrol agents rescued 200 individuals in distress. As agents prepare for another hot summer, the community is encouraged to share these stories with individuals considering illegal entry into the country.

Flashlight Saves Honduran Citizens Life

TUCSON, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents working near Arivaca, Arizona last night rescued a Honduran National who had apparently injured himself and was not ambulatory.

Following the apprehension of an illegal migrant, Border Patrol agents, were advised by the male Honduran that upon their illegal entry his cousin had injured his foot and was unable to walk. Agents assigned to the Border Patrol Search, Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR) team, assisted by a CBP Air and Marine helicopter searched for the male Honduran National in a remote location nine miles south of the town of Arivaca. Agents spotted the injured individual signaling with a flashlight. After an immediate medical evaluation BORSTAR agents determined he would require further medical treatment. The 28-year-old was transported to a local area hospital and treated for a fractured left foot.

The Arizona Sonora desert is a dangerous and treacherous place. Temperatures can fluctuate from below freezing to 120° degrees Fahrenheit. People stranded in the desert are at risk of death or illness due to exposure, an additional injury furthers the risk. The U.S. Border Patrol is committed to saving lives, by working closely with federal, state, local and tribal agencies to prevent illegal entries, less migrants at risk of dying.

Border Patrol rescues eight abandoned by smuggler in the desert

TUCSON, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents rescued eight Mexican nationals late Thursday night after their smuggler abandoned them in the desert west of Tucson.

BORSTAR -- the Search, Trauma and Rescue unit of the Border Patrol -- responded to a 911 call on Thursday evening from an individual who said that he and his group had been abandoned by their smuggler and were lost in the desert. According to the caller, one member of the group had not been feeling well as a result of the heat and insufficient water and died just minutes prior to the 911 call.

BORSTAR immediately began searching and continued for four hours until a CBP fixed wing air asset spotted the stranded group. BORSTAR was then able to make contact on the ground and provide assistance.

The Tohono O'odham Police Department is leading the investigation into the cause of death. The remaining eight, all from Oaxaca, will be processed for removal.

To avoid detection by Border Patrol, smugglers often lead illegal aliens through the most treacherous and harsh terrain, exposing them to extreme conditions for which they are not prepared. Following their rescue, the overwhelming majority of migrants tell agents they were abandoned by their smuggler when they became fatigued and were unable to continue. Furthermore, carrying a cell phone can give a false sense of security because, in many remote areas along the border, cell signals are limited or nonexistent.

Border Patrol rescues two stranded by flood waters

AJO, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents rescued two Mexican nationals early Saturday after monsoon rains left them in waist deep waters in the desert west of Tucson.

BORSTAR, the Search, Trauma and Rescue unit of the Border Patrol, along with Customs and Border Protection air assets, responded to a 911 call from an individual who said he and another man were lost and stranded in waist deep water and mud in a wash on the Tohono O’odham Nation. After determining that a safe landing was not possible, three agents rappelled from a CBP helicopter to quickly rescue the individuals. The two men were medically evaluated at the scene and then transported to the Ajo Border Patrol Station for processing.

In addition to extreme heat, the monsoon season poses an added danger for those attempting to cross into the United States illegally through the southern Arizona corridor. Dangerous flash floods fill dry riverbeds in minutes often with little to no warning.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) said "it got so busy that the BORSTAR commander at the time decided to have a cellphone that was designated for the 911 dispatchers in the 3 counties that surround this AOR (area of responsibility)... once they determined it was Border Patrol-related they would transfer the call to that phone... and then the phone would ring, and an agent would answer it and start working the call."

What are the 3 counties that surround the AOR he mentioned here?

BORSTAR agents respond to calls throughout the entire Tucson Sector area of responsibility which ranges from the (b) (7)(E) to the (b) (7)(E). The three counties that SBPA (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was referring to are Pima, Pinal and Santa Cruz counties.

-Is there a way to know how many 911 calls BORSTAR got were Phase 1 or Phase 2, and how many were reports from second or third-hand parties (like Derechos Humanos)? I'm interested in all years since 2007, but at least for 2012 - 2014.

We do break down calls that are directed to the 911 on-call BORSTAR phone according to phase one or phase two coordinates. Statistics of how many reports were from second or third-hand parties are not compiled. The calls that are transferred to the 911 on-call BORSTAR phone originates with a county dispatcher. If the county dispatcher decides that the call would be best handled by Border Patrol or BORSTAR, the call is routed to the 911 on-call phone. The dispatcher provides the agent who answers the phone whatever information he/she were able to gather from the caller and then puts the requester through to the BORSTAR agent. The agent then begins to interview the caller to determine the gravity of the situation and where that person is located.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) mentioned that he had written down somewhere the number of 911 calls BORSTAR has gotten this year. **I'd love to follow up on getting that number, and for previous years as well, as available.**

In fiscal year 2013, BORSTAR agents received 305 phone calls via the on-call 911 phone. In fiscal year 2014, BORSTAR agents received 138 phone calls via the on-call 911 phone. The fiscal year 2015 number is not yet available.

I sent these questions to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) as well:

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) from BORSTAR said that there is a checklist/ flowchart BORSTAR has made for nighttime dispatchers — and soon, JFC call-answering — to determine if a 911 call needs to go to BORSTAR, or to a Border Patrol station. **Is there a way I can see this checklist?**

A flowchart is currently being developed to determine who may be best to handle a call received on the BORSTAR 911 on-call phone. This flowchart is in the beginning stages and may be used in the future.

Currently, when a call is made to the 911 on-call phone, agents ask a series of questions, such as the individual's location and health status, to best determine the nature of the call. Any missed call made to the 911 on-call BORSTAR phone is directly routed to our dispatch center with multiple lines. If an agent is on the phone and a second call is made to this same 911 on-call phone, the call will go to voicemail and an agent will respond to the voicemail.

- I got these numbers during the ridealong:

In 2013, Tucson sector BORSTAR responded to 336 medical calls, 600 rescues, 35 of those were agents in distress. In 2014 that number went from 336 to 119 medical calls. Rescues dropped to 297. 13 agent rescues. So numbers trending down significantly. For all of Border Patrol, in 2013 BP had over 800 rescues for whole sector, and then a little over 500 for 2014.

What percentage of those rescue and medical calls came through the 911 phone?

Please see response to previous question.

Also, the BORSTAR 911 on-call phone was implemented in order to expedite the response by BORSTAR agents to medical emergencies. Between 2013 and 2014 traffic patterns began to change and Tucson Sector experienced an overall decrease in activity. Within the same time period BORSTAR noticed an increase in calls from individuals that wanted to turn themselves into Border Patrol, as opposed to individuals in need of medical assistance. In response, BORSTAR began to filter calls in a different manner and restructured how they classify a rescue. Beginning in fiscal year 2014, individuals that made calls to the 911 on-call phone and stated that they were in good physical health but wanted to turn themselves into Border Patrol were no longer classified as a rescue. In such an event, an agent working at one of the eight Tucson Sector Border Patrol stations may respond so that BORSTAR agents may focus efforts to any individual in medical distress. This change took place in FY 14.

As far as restrictions go, we are unable to film or photograph any agents without their permission. Some agents live in border communities and may feel their safety is at risk if they appear on television or in print media. Some agents may feel okay if you are able to blur out their image, so please let me know if this is possible. Illegal aliens on the fence or running away may be filmed, but we must have their permission to film/photograph them once they are in our custody. We have forms the aliens must fill out in order to be photographed or filmed. Filming/photographing their backs as they walk or sit is usually

okay. Also, please do not speak to any illegal aliens or smugglers that we encounter as it can jeopardize our ability to prosecute them.

Safety will be the top priority while we are out in the field. Do not run up behind or toward any agents at any time. They do not know who you are and this presents an officer safety issue. You may appear to be a threat and he/she could respond to you in such a manner.

Stay close to us at all times. This helps to identify you as media and a non-threat. This also helps to ensure your safety.

Please wear dark clothing, good shoes or boots, pants and long sleeves. If you have work gloves, you may want to carry them because the brush is very sharp. Please do NOT wear reflective gear or bright/fluorescent colors. You may also want to have a light jacket with you as the temperatures can fluctuate in the areas we will be traveling.

Always close the door and roll the windows up when exiting the vehicle. You never know how long we will be out on foot and smugglers WILL steal items from our vehicle if they are left unsecured.

I recommend that you keep a bottle of water and food/snacks with you during the day. If we do get out on foot, since we never know exactly how long we will be, having water and nourishment is a must in the dry desert.

While in the field, we will do our best to guide you and provide answers to your questions. However, while in enforcement mode we may not be able to stop and explain exactly what is going on at the exact moment things are happening. Although we cannot guarantee any action during our day, action often happens suddenly and can be over in seconds. If you are not ready to react quickly and/or run, you may miss out. We will be able to follow up with an explanation after we stop or get back to our vehicle.

If you have any specific scenes you would like to photograph, please send me a list. We will review the list, and do our best to accommodate your requests. However, we make no guarantees as to what we will or won't see throughout the day.

I am attaching a waiver for you to fill out and return on the day of our tour. Should you have additional questions, please don't hesitate to ask.

CBP rescues migrant in Huachuca Mountains

TUCSON, Ariz. – Agents from the Tucson Sector Border Patrol and the Office of Air and Marine’s Tucson Air Branch rescued an injured illegal immigrant in the Huachuca Mountains near Sierra Vista, Arizona.

On Feb. 3, at approximately 4 p.m., agents from the Brian A. Terry Station apprehended a group of illegal immigrants. During field processing, agents noticed a male subject with severe injuries to his arm, clavicle and face. Agents contacted the Border Patrol Search Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR) team to request additional assistance for the man.

At approximately 8:45 p.m., BORSTAR agents arrived on scene, assessed the man’s injuries, and requested air support. However, due to rugged terrain, a helicopter landing was not be feasible and Air agents certified as Emergency Medical Technicians deployed to prepare the man for extraction.

By 9:55 p.m., agents extracted the victim and delivered him to Emergency Medical Services personnel for further evaluation and transport via Life-Flight to a local hospital.

After the man was treated and medically cleared, agents processed the man for removal in accordance with Tucson Sector guidelines.

CBP agents frequently shift from law enforcement to rescue mode to assist anyone found in

dire situations. Tucson Sector has more than 50 full-time BORSTAR agents, 255 EMTs, 16 paramedics and 32 rescue beacons. The Tucson Air Branch has six EMTs.

Armed smugglers force migrant into well

TUCSON, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents rescued multiple illegal immigrants who had been abandoned by smugglers over the past three days. *(Photos available)*

Early Monday evening, Border Patrol agents on patrol heard cries for help emanating from a dry well in the desert near Topawa, Ariz. The agents quickly located a man trapped at the bottom of the well. A Border Patrol EMT and other agents successfully extricated the illegal immigrant, who did not appear to be injured. The Guatemalan national reported that he was forced into the well by two armed smugglers when he refused to carry a bundle of narcotics during his journey into the United States.

On Sunday evening, Office of Air and Marine's Tucson Air Branch and Border Patrol BORSTAR agents rescued a mother and two young boys near Covered Wells, Ariz. The family had been abandoned in the desert by their smuggler three days prior. After receiving a 911 call, a coordinated air and ground search effort was launched to locate the small group. The three individuals were located and airlifted to a local hospital where they were treated for dehydration.

All of the individuals will be processed for removal proceedings in accordance with Tucson Sector guidelines.

Smugglers continue to victimized illegal immigrants by exposing them to dangerous situations, including being forced to carry narcotics, long walks through isolated terrain, and the threat of violence and abandonment.

Mexican consulate confirms the validity of any official Mexican documents found with the body.

Once (b) (7)(E) and Mexican consulate provide the (b) (7)(E) with sufficient information in regards to the identity of this subject, then the Chief Medical Director makes the official identity of the deceased.

This can take at least 2 days.

For the meantime, Mexican consulate contacts family members and informs them that there is a "very high" possibility that the missing person has been located.

I am writing to inform you of the ongoing situation regarding (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) born (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) from Mexico. This person has been missing since September 3 between the hours 8-9 in the evening, when he was left in the desert in poor health.

The Missing Persons Hotline with Derechos Humanos received a call on September 9th, 5 days after (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had been left behind. The volunteer who answered was told that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had been left in the desert on September 3, with one other person: (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) born (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). According to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) after they two of them had been left behind he walked 30 minutes straight ahead to reach a rescue beacon and a dirt road where he pushed the button on the rescue beacon. When Border Patrol arrived (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) told them about (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). They looked with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) for one to one and a half hours without success. They then took (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to a holding cell where he was rapidly deported.

El testimonio de (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

2 de septiembre a las 8 o 9 de la noche. Caminaron hasta las 12 o 1 de la madrugada. Durmieron hasta la mañana. Empezaron a caminar otra vez como a las 4 o 5 de la tarde. Cruzaron (b) (7)(E). Caminaron un buen pedazo, empezaba a anochecer y (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) empezó a sentirse mal. Empezaba (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) Estaban cerca de un rescue beacon- (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) caminó muy rápido y llegó en media hora. Cruzó (b) (7)(E). Se podía ver la luz del rescue beacon desde donde dejó a (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) fue a empujar el botón. Llegó la migra y les dijo (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) que venía con otro compañero. Llevaron a (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) a buscar una hora/hora y media. Eran las 10 de la noche cuando llegaron por (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). Le dijeron a (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) que iban a esperar otra vez en la mañana para buscar pero él todavía no aparece. Lo dejaron 7 galones de botellas negras de agua.

Volunteers at the Missing Persons Hotline attempted to gather information to assist in the search for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). The spoke with agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), (b) (7)(E) who said that there had been no rescue beacon involved in the arrest of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) but that he had called 9-11 and had been found based off of the phone call. According to Border Patrol (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) did not report another missing person at that time, and there was no search attempt made.

Because they were considering the possibility of a search and rescue operation for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) volunteers with the Hotline obtained apprehension coordinates for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) through Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) with the the International Liaison Unit. These apprehension coordinates are (b) (7)(E) and place the arrest of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) as being far from any rescue beacon or road.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) wife arrived to the area and wanted to go out and search for her husband. Ajo Samaritans volunteers took her out to the general area on September 13. The Search team encountered 3 men on the side of the road who wanted to turn themselves into Border Patrol. These men reported passing a body earlier in the same day, west of (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) Although this location would match neither (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) nor the Border Patrol accounts, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) wife wanted to halt any further searching until this body was found and identified.

Info given about location of body:

Description from (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) brothers):

Near the mountain called (b) (7)(E) From the the base of (b) (7)(E) directly below (b) (7)(E) there is a smaller trail that cuts off to the right (west, based on his description) of the main trail. This smaller trail that cuts off to the right leads up to an area where people (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) The body is found near this trail that leads to (b) (7)(E) and near some (b) (7)(E) There is also a lookout on a smaller hill nearby here. The trail up to the lookout (separate trail?) goes up through some rocks in the form (b) (7)(E)

Notes:

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) mentioned that the body was intact, with the eyes having been scavenged, and a very strong odor coming from the body. However, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) said that he did not see the body himself. Apparently other people in his group climbed up the side trail to get water and they mentioned the body. Not clear if (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) smelled the body or what. When BP agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) arrived he questioned the brothers extensively and determined that he knew the exact location they were describing as an area below (b) (7)(E) where people climb to find water (b) (7)(E) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) repeatedly told us and Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that he would be willing to lead us to the area where the body was located. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) seemed willing to go to the location with us and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) but after talking with his supervisor informed us that they would not be able to begin searching the area until the next day (Monday).

Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) from the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), (b) (7)(E) took down an account of the location of the body and said that they would go out and look the following day. The following day (9-14) passed without any one from the (b) (7)(E) going to look for the discovered body. The agents at the (b) (7)(E) have said that they are too busy, and will go look when they are able.

Throughout this process, volunteers at the Hotline and Ajo Sams have been working closely with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) wife. Out of consideration for the ordeal that she is going through, and the tragic fact that there is now the chance for two potentially deceased people in the area to be found and identified **we ask the following:**

That agents in the (b) (7)(E) area be told that this case should be considered a high priority, and efforts should be made immediately to recover the body reported on 9-13.

That agents revisit the case of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and try to investigate the discrepancies in what (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) experienced and what the arresting agents experienced. That Border Patrol and (b) (7)(E) continue to think of the search for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) as a high priority and dedicate resources to finding him.

That all pertinent information be communicated to (b) (7)(E) so they can mobilize their own response to the report of a set of human remains and a missing person in their county.

Additionally, to assist volunteer search and rescue operations:

That the agent who recorded the apprehension coordinates be spoken to about the accuracy about the coordinates before any further searches are mobilized with those coordinates as the one piece of solid information. That volunteer search and rescue are communicated with about the accuracy of these coordinates.

That the incident report for the arrest of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) be shared with volunteer search and rescue so they can get to the bottom of any confusion regarding his testimony and the Border Patrol account of what happened.

A comprehensive map of all rescue beacons in (b) (7)(E) AOR and (b) (7)(E) AOR be shared with volunteer search and rescue.

That updates on the situation continue to be shared with volunteer search and rescue, who will be spending their time and resources in the desert searching for this one (possibly two) individual(s) and deserve to receive current updates.

Border Patrol rescues and assists six individuals in separate incidents this past weekend

TUCSON, Ariz. – Tucson Sector Border Patrol agents rescued three individuals and assisted three others involved in vehicle accidents over the weekend. Early Monday morning, Casa Grande agents responded to a rescue beacon activation that resulted in the rescue of an illegal immigrant from Mexico.

Casa Grande agents also assisted a man and woman Sunday evening after receiving a request from the Pinal County Sheriff's Office to locate individuals reportedly involved in an ATV accident near Arizona City. An agent, certified as an EMT, found the individuals who subsequently refused medical treatment but allowed agents to assist them in getting back to their residence.

In a separate incident Sunday, agents from the Office of Air and Marine and Casa Grande station worked jointly to locate a male Ecuadorian lost in the desert after being separated from his group that crossed into the U.S. illegally.

On Saturday morning, an off-duty Border Patrol agent with EMT certification, responded to a

car accident outside his home and discovered a female occupant with severe injuries. The agent started performing CPR on the woman and attempted to revive her using a defibrillator. Unfortunately, the woman passed away from her injuries.

Douglas agents rescued a man lost in the desert and suffering from severe dehydration and rhabdomyolysis Friday morning after crossing into the U.S. illegally. Rhabdomyolysis is the breakdown of muscle tissue that leads to the release of muscle fiber contents into the blood.

Border Patrol agents frequently shift from law enforcement to rescue mode. With over 50 full-time Border Patrol Search Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR) agents, 255 EMTs, 16 paramedics and 32 rescue beacons, agents are able to assist those who find themselves in dire situations. Many migrants become victims of unscrupulous smugglers concerned only with monetary gain; not with the lives of people they lead into the treacherous Sonoran desert.
