

## **Nationwide Drug Seizures**

The goal of this data dictionary is to provide insight into how users should read and analyze the raw data available for download.

## I. Tips when working with seizures data:

- 1. Statistical information is subject to change due to corrections, additional information, or incidents pending final review.
- 2. For Land Border analyses, users should apply the following filters:
  - a. For Southwest Land Border: Region = "Southern Border" and Land Border = "Land Only"
  - b. For Northern Land Border: Region = "Northern Border" and Land Border = "Land Only"
- 3. The data represents incidents at the area of responsibility levels (e.g., U.S. Border Patrol [USBP] Sector, Office of Field Operations [OFO] Field Office, Air and Marine Operations [AMO] Branch); it is not available at individual ports of entry (POE), stations, checkpoints, states, etc.
