

Use of Force Incidents and Officers/Agents Using Force

The goal of this data dictionary is to provide insight into how users should read and analyze the raw data available for download.

I. Tips when working with Use of Force data:

- 1. Statistical information is subject to change due to corrections, additional information, or incidents pending final review.
- 2. The month is when the incident took place, not the month of final adjudication. As incidents are reviewed, they may be added to the dataset retroactively.
 - a. For example, an incident that occurs in May 2020 may not complete review until September 2020. After final review is completed in September 2020, the stats will be updated for May 2020 to reflect the final statistics of the incident.
- 3. The sum of force types or officers/agents involved may be greater than the total incidents. Multiple force types and/or officers/agents may be involved in a single incident.
 - a. For example, consider a hypothetical CBP utilization of one less-lethal device against three subjects. This is counted as one incident involving one use of force type.
