<u>Risk Assessment:</u> Incomplete information regarding incubation, infectious period, and transmissibility, as well as evolving circumstances make a definitive risk assessment challenging. In light of this, awareness and operationally-informed precautions are warranted. The general risk to CBP personnel and the general public for COVID-19 is considered low to moderate, provided disease prevention guidelines, social distancing, the use of PPE, any required face coverings, and other public health guidelines are followed. There are certain groups at higher risk, please reference Notes Pages. Risk levels increase with exposure to persons potentially infected with COVID-19, warranting enhanced precautions described herein. The hierarchy of controls, "Engineering Controls, Administrative Controls, and PPE," should be used to control hazards. CBP will continue to monitor the situation closely and will adjust guidance as appropriate. CBP personnel should continue to maintain situational awareness regarding this outbreak. Of note, with the growing incidence of COVID-19 in the USA, there is less of an exposure risk distinction between high risk foreign travelers and persons in the USA, and CBP employees need to be vigilant regarding workplace, along with home and off-duty exposure.

While COVID-19 is a respiratory disease and the use of N95 respirators and other PPE is needed in certain conditions and work environments as outlined in this JHA, the use of PPE is but one component of COVID-19 disease prevention. All personnel should take these basic steps to prevent exposure to and transmission of COVID-19: practice good hygiene, wash hands frequently, cover your cough or sneeze, stay away from work if you are ill, avoid unnecessary congregate settings, vanpools, and transit systems where COVID-19 exposure is more probable. Follow CDC guidance for social distancing, the use of "face coverings", and PPE. KEEP YOUR HANDS BELOW YOUR CHIN and avoid touching mouth, eyes, nose and mucous membranes. Where applicable, follow state/local/national social-distancing and face covering guidance. NOTES PAGES:

- 1. <u>CBP Respiratory Protection</u>. All CBP Frontline Personnel, Officers, and Agents in work situations that place them at increased risk of exposure to COVID-19, due to processing passengers or travelers potentially infected with COVID-19. CBP Officers and Agents who are in close contact situations with potentially ill passengers/travelers are considered to be in "mandatory use" N95 Respirator Programs. As such, the mandatory use of an N95 respirators requires a medical clearance, fit testing, and personnel must have no facial hair between the mask seal and the face in accordance with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134 and CBP HB 5200-08B policies. Frontline and uniformed personnel have had these programs in place for years within CBP due to other work situations that also require an N95, such as exposure to TB, handling of Fentanyl and other Narcotics, Ebola Response, CBP Pandemic and Emerging Infectious Disease (PEID) Plan, and now COVID-19.
- 2. Voluntary Use of N95 Respirators. The voluntary use of N95 respirators or surgical masks is allowed by employers when there is no work task that makes the N95 use "mandatory." In situations such as allowing mission support, administrative, or Headquarters personnel that do not typically wear a mask, who would like to wear one for protection to exposures that are not related to specific work tasks, such as traveling to and from work, in congregate settings such as large metropolitan transit systems, buses, etc., use of a <u>surgical mask</u> would be considered "Voluntary Use." In these cases, "Voluntary Use" of surgical masks may be allowed to meet the requirement of CDC recommendations for "Face Coverings" in social settings outside of work to protect others, since surgical masks are not designed to protect the wearer, they are designed to protect others (see CDC "Face Covering" Reference below for more guidance). Such use requires approval from a supervisor to ensure the use won't create a hazard for the employee, impact PPE supplies needed for critical front line "Mandatory Use" situations, or that would cause undue confusion and conflicting policy guidance such as "Voluntary Use" of N95 respirators by frontline officers in primary passenger processing when they aren't performing any work that requires "Mandatory Use" as outlined above. All Respiratory Protection Programs, whether "Mandatory Use" or "Voluntary Use," situations will be managed in accordance with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134 and CBP HB 5200-08B policies, Chapter 26. N95 respirator use should be reserved for those frontline personnel and high risk work situations for which they were intended

3. People Who Are at Increased Risk for Severe Illness

- COVID-19 Risk Related to Age:
 - Among adults, risk increases steadily with age, and it's not just those over the age of 65 who are at increased risk for severe illness.
 Age is an independent risk factor for severe illness, but risk in older adults is also in part related to the increased likelihood that older adults also have underlying medical conditions.
- Medical conditions that can cause an increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19:
 - o Chronic kidney disease
 - COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
 - o Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from solid organ transplant
 - Obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 or higher)
 - o Serious heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies
 - o Sickle cell disease
 - Type 2 diabetes mellitus
- Medical conditions that might cause an increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19:
 - Asthma (moderate-to-severe)

- Cerebrovascular disease (affects blood vessels and blood supply to the brain)
- o Cystic fibrosis
- o Hypertension or high blood pressure
- Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from blood or bone marrow transplant, immune deficiencies, HIV, use of corticosteroids, or use of other immune weakening medicines
- o Neurologic conditions, such as dementia
- o Liver disease
- o Pregnancy
- Pulmonary fibrosis (having damaged or scarred lung tissues)
- o Thalassemia (a type of blood disorder)
- Type 1 diabetes mellitus

Question 8a ((b)(7)(E)): The American people are marching in the streets because law enforcement responsible for keeping us safe have too often disregarded the value of Black lives.

During the June 25 hearing, we discussed troubling data illustrating a culture of impunity for misconduct at CBP. Specifically, we discussed a 2014 analysis conducted by the American Immigration Council of 809 complaints of abuse by Border Patrol agents that occurred between 2009 and 2012, including complaints of hitting someone's head against a rock, stomping on someone's back, touching women inappropriately, and kicking a pregnant woman, causing her to

miscarry. According to the analysis, in 97% of cases in which an outcome was reported, no action was taken against the officer. In a 2017 follow-up report by the American Immigration Council on 2,178 complaints from 2012 to 2015, the percentage of cases with reported outcomes where no action was taken against the officer was 96%.

On July 7, 2020, ACLU Foundation of San Diego and Imperial Counties and the ACLU Border Rights Center filed an administrative complaint documenting reports of abuse and mistreatment of individuals in CBP custody based on 100 interviews between March and July 2019. The ACLU's complaint documents verbal abuse, bullying, harassment, and threats of violence.

RFA REQUEST FOR CONTINGENCY PLANNING IN ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI From DHS OPS:

BLUF: At this time for St. Louis, the FBI continues to plan on having adequate resources in the city and do not have plans on utilizing DHS contingency forces at this Therefore, DHS will only execute our contingency if something totally unexpected were to o At this point, there is a low probability that any DHS forces will be needed in St. Louis.

FBI and DOJ forces along with other State/local agencies have the situation well in hand. That said, DHS OPS is offering contingencies.

- 1. <u>Air surveillance</u>: CBP/AMO can offer up (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) with (b)(7)(E) capability. It will take these aircraft approximately hours to get on scene from initial request (about hours for pre-flight preps and about hours flight time to St. Louis).
- 2. Ground Forces: In addition to funding limitations noted last evening and authorities issues
 - 1. FPS:
 - 1. Inside St. Louis, FPS will have District Commander, Area Commanders and officers (total wire). Within a hour radius of St. Louis, FPS could call in an additional wire officers for a maximum of the structure.
 - 2. FPS will also provide LNOs to the various command posts and EOC inside St. Louis for coordination.

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- 3. FPS was going to inquire with SAC on how to get local authorities/powers crossdesignated to DHS LEOs if DHS LEOs were requested for suppor <u>off</u> of Federal property. If used for security around federal facilities, we are all set with our own organic authorities to include other DHS components who could be brought in to augment FPS. Currently though, no DHS component has LE powers off of federal property unless the locals convey such authority. If your SAC ever sought about using DHS LEOs in that role, we would seek assistance in coordinating with the locals to get the appropriate legal authorities cross-designated to DHS.
- 4. Funding for DHS support on non-federal property is the other issue requiring a funding solution to avoid an Anti-Deficiency Act (ADA) violation. Funding is a <u>non-issue</u> if DHS is kept to securing federal property.
- 2. ICE:
 - ICE has a standby Rapid Deployment Team of on a (b)(7)(E) tether at Benning, GA. If additional DHS ground forces were requested, we would launch this team first. USCG would be the transport provider. Once this team arrived in St. Louis, the aircraft could gas up and relaunch to Detroit to pick up the ICE team and return to St. Louis.
 - Both teams in GA and MI are proactively working to get USMS deputization completed today. If this ICE contingency were utilized and the team(s) were employed off federal property, they would both need local authorities transferred as well. And there's the funding piece noted above for off federal property support.

 - 1. USCG can transport the ICE team(s) as noted above.

Reps from the following components were on the call: FPS, CBP, ICE, TSA, USSS, USCG, I&A, OGC and OPS.

DHS still has 2 remain strategic RDTs: an ICE team in GA and another ICE team in CA.

The OPSDEPs reviewed current national intelligence and nothing else is currently on the horizon as a possible mission for this team.



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Washington D.C. FPS has concluded their holiday weekend efforts in D.C. and do not have any further requirements for CBP. All the OFO SRT officers are within commuting distance to the NCR and can be brought back if needed but it is unlikely at this point. A total of were removed from national alert status totals.

CBP team demobilized at the conclusion of their shift on July 5th and returned to their assigned Sector / Field Office.

TIMELINE OF EVENTS:

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20: USBP agents deployed to assist FPS

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Approximately 100 protesters gathered outside of the Hatfield Courthouse, located at 1000 SW 3rd Ave, Portland, OR 97204. At approximately 1230 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), the protesters breached the front door of the courthouse. The protesters then proceeded to assault Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers and U.S. Marshals with rocks and bottles. Portland FPS requested support from the forward deployed USBP SOG team in order to assist in the protection of federal property and provide additional safety and security to the FPS Officers and U.S. Marshals under siege by the protesters.

TIMELINE (PDT):

07/03/2020; 0130 SOG team arrived at the courthouse

07/03/2020; 0151 SOG team preparing to assist FPS, U.S. Marshals and the Portland Police Department in the active riot while attempting to disperse the protesters from the federal property. 07/03/2020; 0253 SOG team holding inside the courthouse Contractors are in route to repair the breached door. Once the contractors arrive, the SOG team and partners (approximately **box**) Officers and Agents) will push outside to create a perimeter in order to facilitate the door repair. Crowd size is approximately 50 to 75 people. Protesters are sporadically throwing bottles and fireworks at the SOG team and partners. No "use of force" applied by SOG personnel at this time. 07/03/2020; 0400 Contractors arrived on-scene and the SOG team and partners pushed out a perimeter. Protesters dispersed without incident. The breached front door of the courthouse is currently under repair.

07/03/2020; 0435 Courthouse door has been secured. No "use of force" was applied by SOG personnel and no injuries reported. SOG team has cleared the scene.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20 to 7/4/20:

On July 3, 2020, all SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/04/2020 at 0100 hours PDT: A group of approximately 30 protesters gathered at the courthouse, became violent and broke a courthouse window. No law enforcement action was taken.

07/04/2020 at 0349 hours PDT: The group of 30 protesters broke the two front doors of the courthouse and were attempting to enter the building. Due to the violent actions of the protesters and safety concerns,

USBP SOG team deployed less lethal (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions to regain control of the building and protect all law enforcement personnel.

07/04/2020 at 0419 hours PDT: The SOG team and other law enforcement partners have pushed the group of protesters away from the courthouse front doors, past the closed off street and off the federal park property.

07/04/2020 at 0427 hours PDT: The protesters returned and came back on to federal park property. Federa law enforcement personnel, to include USB SOG, were able to deter the protesters from advancing further.

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
Protesters are now off federal park property The USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have formed a line on the edge of the federal park property.

07/04/2020 at 0450 hours PDT: USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have returned to the courthouse and are holding a line just outside of the front doors that were destroyed by violent protesters. Contractors are in-route to repair the doors. 40 plus protesters remain in the federal park area and appear to be calm at the moment. No injuries to the SOG team or any other law enforcement partners reported at this time.

07/04/2020 at 0525 PDT (0825 EDT): Contractors are on-scene and are repairing the broken doors Law Enforcement personnel are continuing to remain in a protection posture

07/04/2020 at 0555 hours (0855 EDT): SOG personnel have moved inside the courthouse and the Portland Police Department has assumed outside security. There are only approximately 15 protesters remaining on-scene and appear to be passive at this time.

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
- 2241 hours: SOG BORTAC arrested three subjects that were spray painting the courthouse CCTV cameras. - 2302 hours: Violent protesters are throwing rocks and shooting fireworks M60 mortars at the courthouse. Protesters broke the plate glass above the courthouse doors and are throwing pain and mace inside the courthouse. No injuries to law enforcement personnel reported.
- 07/04/2020 at 2319 hours (PST): SOG BORTAC dispersed the aggressive protesters away for the courthouse and off of the federal park property with (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions.
- 07/04/2020 at 2336 hours (PST): Protesters returned to the federal park property and were once again dispersed by SOG BORTAC with (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions.
- 07/04/2020 at 2357 hours (PST): Portland PD has assumed perimeter security of the federal courthouse property and is making arrests. SOG team leaders are conducting equipment checks and personnel welfare checks. No injuries to the SOG personnel at this time.
- 07/05/2020 at 0010 hours PDT (0310 EDT): Violent protesters are using frozen water bottles, paint, large rocks, bottle rockets/large fireworks, green laser pointers and M60 firework mortars to assault law enforcement personnel. SOG personnel have been struck by these items, but no signification injuries have been reported.
- 07/05/2020 at 0028 hours PDT (0328 EDT): SOG personnel have reassumed their defensive positions as Portland PD has vacated the area.
- 07/05/2020 at 0045 hours PDT (0345 EDT): Violent protesters continue to attack law enforcement and SOG team members had another exchange with the protesters as they attempted to get within close distance of the building and law enforcement personnel. SOG was forced to use within close the crowd.
- 07/05/2020 at 0145 hours PDT (0445 EDT): Protesters tossed a large explosive device into the courthouse foyer where the SOG team was staged. SOG BORTAC exited the courthouse and dispersed the protesters off of the federal park property using (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions. The protesters continued to actively assault SOG personnel with bottle rockets and mortar style fireworks as they retreated off of the federal property.
- 07/05/2020 at 0235 hours PDT (0535 EDT): SOG BORTAC arrested two subjects. One subject was deploying harmful DPSS lasers directly into the face of SOG BORTAC Operators. The other subject assaulted SOG operators with a shield as they arrested the subject with the laser. Both are currently in custody of the FPS.
- 07/05/2020 at 0415 PDT (0715 EDT): FPS Officers made several announcements directing the protesters to vacate the federal property directly in front of the courthouse doors or they would be arrested for trespassing. FPS personnel then directed USBP SOG personnel to arrest any subject that was refusing the lawful order to leave the federal property. As SOG personnel came out of the courthouse to make arrests, an individual shined a harmful DPSS laser directly into the faces of SOG personnel. SOG BORTAC was able to take the subject into custody and arrested him for assault. A subsequent search of the subject revealed a pipe bomb, a fused explosive device, a machete and a buck knife.

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 07/05/2020 at 0545 (PST): Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.



- BLW Mobile Field Force (MFF), comprised of Border Patrol Search Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR), Border Patrol Tactical (BORTAC), and Mobile Response Team (MRT) team members traveled to Seattle to provide support to FPS on July 2, 2020 and returned to BLW today, July 5, 2020.
- BLW provided SOG MFF agents deployed to Portland with less lethal munition resupplies sent via GOV on July 5, 2020. The SOG agents remain counted towards national alert totals.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/5/20 to 7/6/20: 2000-0600 hours PDT

On July 5, 2020 at 2030 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed USBP SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at (b)(7)(E) along w th Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

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07/05/20 at 1000 hours PST: A support request for additional less lethal munitions was submitted to Blaine Sector for the CBP SOG team in Portland, OR

7/5/20 at 1118 hours PST: Bellingham Station agents departed with less lethal munitions in route to Portland, OR.

07/05/20 at 1700 hours PST: Munitions have arrived in Portland and delivered to SOG operators. 07/05/2020 at 2137 hours PST: Protesters are throwing fireworks and shooting M60 mortars at a dump truck that is loading wood in front of the courthouse. A construction crew is working in front of the courthouse completing the boarding of windows broken by last night's violent protests.

07/05/2020 at 2145 hours: SOG BORTAC dispersed the protesters away from the courthouse and into the federal park property with officer presence holding a line in the front of the park.

07/05/2020 at 2210 hours: SOG BORTAC observation posts have visual of a male subject with a harmful green laser in hand. Subject did not use the laser on any personnel.

07/05/2020 at 2244 hours: Construction crews have completed work and vans are being escorted out of the area by HSI SRT. Teams have moved back into the courthouse with no further incident.

07/05/2020at 2340 hours: One subject was deploying a harmful purple laser directly at the eyes and face of SOG BORTAC and FPS personnel that are in an observation post. Protester has been identified as a female subject wearing a black top and white helmet with reddish hair.

07/06/2020 at 2410 hours PST: SOG BORTAC arrested two subjects that were deploying harmful lasers directly into the eyes and faces of the SOG BORTAC agents that were in an observation point. The first subject is a male and was encountered on the steps of the courthouse. He was arrested by SOG BORTAC and is currently in FPS custody. The second subject was a female that had previously been identified as pointing a dangerous laser at agents. During the apprehension of the female, she requested to speak with a medic. SOG BORSTAR and BORTAC agents engaged in a conversation with the subject, while a US Marshall provided cover. While ascertaining the subject's health, she reached for a knife and placed it to her throat. The US Marshall deployed his Taser to prevent her from injuring herself. The SOG BORSTAR Agent jumped on the subject and physically removed the knife from her throat. Due to the heroic and quick reactions of the US Marshall and SOG BORSTAR agent, the subject did not harm herself. Portland EMS arrived and the subject has been transported to the hospital.

While walking back to the courthouse SOG BORTAC Agents were assaulted by criminal protesters throwing bottles and fireworks. Another protester pointed a harmful laser at SOG personnel's eyes and faces. The subject was apprehended shortly after by SOG BORTAC.

07/06/2020 at 0215 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene Information from social media confirms that protesters will not return tonight. Intel received indicates that protesters will be possibly moving to other targets rather than the Federal Courthouse due to heavy federal enforcement actions. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

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CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/6/20 to 7/7/20: 2000-0600 hours PST

On July 6, 2020 at 2130 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/06/20 at 0800 hours PST: (b)(7)(E) AMO departed (b)(7)(E) in-route to (b)(7)(E) WV to pick up less lethal munitions resupply.

07/06/20 at 1030 hours PST: AMO arrived at (b)(7)(E) WV airfield

07/06/20 at 1230 hours PST: AMO departed (b)(7)(E) WV in-route to Portland, OR 07/06/20 at 1830 hours PST: AMO arrived in Portland, OR

07/06/20 at 2130 hours PST: All USBP SOG personnel are staged at the **(b)(7)(E)** with FPS, USMS, and HSI SRT law enforcement personnel.

07/06/20 at 2237 hours PST: Three separate groups of protesters are gathering in front of the Hayfield Courthouse on 3rd Street. The first group of protesters is approximately 100-150 protesters in size standing on 3rd and Main St. The second group of protesters is approximately 50 people. They are wearing protective gear to include gas masks and have been seen with leaf blowers. The third group of protesters are staged near the Elk Monument and have been assaulting USBP SOG personnel that are in an observation position with harmful lasers pointing them directly at the eyes and faces. Law enforcement personnel are currently holding a position in the foyer of the courthouse and planning is ongoing for an attempt to arrest assaultive subjects. 07/06/2020 at 2355 hours PST: Protesters have moved east away from the courthouse. Protesters appear to be staging in front of the Justice Center building next to the courthouse. Information gathered from social media indicates that the protesters are being told not to incite Federal Agencies within the Federal Courthouse. USBP SOG team is prepared to respond to other locations if requested.

07/07/2020 at 0045 hours PS USBP SOG arrested three subjects that were pointing harmful green lasers directly into the eyes and faces of USBP SOG and FPS personnel in observation positions All three subjects are currently in custody of the FPS.

07/07/2020 at 0147 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by SOG personnel. Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last two nights. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

On July 7, 2020 at 2100 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/08/2020 at 2400 hours PST: USBP SOG Operators were conducting observation on suspicious subjects near the Edith Green Federal Building. During this time, USBP SOG personnel were targeted with harmful green lasers. As a result of the laser deployment, USBP SOG personnel attempted to perform an arrest. A foot pursuit ensued from the federal building into the Chapman Park area were several other protesters were congregated.

A group of over 200 protesters saw our personnel chasing the subject. The protesters began assaulting agents with rocks and bottles as they ran towards the USBP SOG team. The subject is also responsible for the injuries to HSI Special Agent (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) whom is currently unable to work due to the injury. SOG recon teams were sent to canvas the federal park area in an attempt to confirm the identity the subject. During this sweep, the recon team positively identified the individual and reported his location back to the command center. The recon team sent a picture of the individual for confirmation and positive ID was established. USBP SOG command formulated a plan to deploy 3 mobile teams comprised of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshals and HSI SRT with FPS support and SOG BORTAC over watch to apprehend the individual. The teams converged on the individual in the northeast corner of Lownsdale Square Park near the corner of 3rd avenue and SW Salmon Street. The subject attempted to flee the area, but what apprehended by the combined units. The subject was escorted back to the Hatfield Courthouse without incident. No less lethal was deployed. Two law enforcement personnel sustained minor injuries during the apprehension, one SOG BORTAC agent and one US Marshal. The subject was asked and stated that he had not sustained any injuries and declined any medical attention.

07/09/2020 at 0130 PDT (0430 EDT): A white SUV crossover that according to social media posts is a 2018 Kia Sportage with Oregon license plate [[00(0),(00/7)(C)]] was driving recklessly through the protesters and throwing out fireworks. The vehicle appeared to crash into the foundation of the Elk statue in Chapman Park. A crowd of protesters converged on the vehicle to confront the occupants. After some arguing, the protesters allowed the vehicle to leave the scene. As the vehicle was leaving, an individual in the vehicle was reported to have fired 5 or 6 shots into the air above the heads of the protesters. No protesters were reported to have been injured. Soon afterwards, social media posts and live streams claimed that the vehicle was still in the general location. SOG BORTAC and FPS deployed mobile teams to canvass the area in a search for the vehicle.

07/09/2020; 0230 PDT (0530 EDT): Situation Update: The mobile teams consisting of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshals, and FPS personnel searched the area with negative results on locating the suspects' vehicle. All law enforcement personnel have returned to the Hatfield

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Courthouse without injury. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. The Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last three nights.

On July 10, 2020 at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

The teams were divided between (D)(7)(E) locations;



07/11/2020 at 2110 hours PDT (0010 EDT): A subject was told to leave the federal property at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. When he refused, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS deployed to arrest the subject. The subject ran through the park to evade arrest. When law enforcement pursued, the began to be assaulted by the crowd. The primary subject was arrested and well as another subject that assaulted a US Marshal. (b)(7)(E) and was deployed by USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS to push the crowd away from the law enforcement personnel who were being assaulted. The situation is very fluid and updates will follow as details are received.

07/11/2020 at 2330 hours PDT (0230 EDT): All law enforcement personnel are back in their respective buildings. There was an additional arrest of a subject for failure to leave the federal property. The

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protesters are using shields, umbrellas, gas masks and goggles. They continue to engage law enforceme personnel and then retreat into the crowd. This crowd of protesters are much different from the previous night of protesters. They are better organized and more violent. They are much more willing to engage with law enforcement. Protesters were walking a young child between the crowd and the law enforcement personnel. A warning was given to them to depart from federal property and they eventually complied with the request.

A USBP SOG recon team reported a sUAS launching location in the park and provided the coordinates to the [(b)(7)(E)] Social media is showing video of an individual whom they claim was injured from less lethal munitions. EMS responded and the subject was taken to the hospital. No further information available at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0025 hours PDT (0325 EDT): The crowd of protesters had been repeatedly crossing the property line at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. They were ignoring warnings over the loud speaker to move back from the building. The protesters then began throwing hard objects and shooting fireworks at law enforcement personnel. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS personnel deployed less lethal munitions to include (b)(7)(E) and against the crowd of protesters pushing them back into the park across the street from the courthouse. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0110 hours PDT (0410 EDT): The law enforcement personnel at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse attempted to move back inside after giving the protesters warnings not to follow them onto the sidewalk surrounding the building. As law enforcement personnel moved into the building, the protesters followed them and began throwing objects at them. In conjunction with Portland Police Bureau, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS pushed protesters out of the area. Federal law enforcement personnel moved back into the building. Portland Police Bureau remained at the edge of the perimeter keeping the protesters out the downtown area. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

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assault law enforcement personnel. In defiance of the warning, rioters were observed assaulting law enforcement personnel with lasers and by throwing hard objects to include glass bottles. The Director briefed that the operational posture to be taken would be to seal the courthouse and hold a non-reactive posture to all minor violations without a Law Enforcement response or resolution. 07/13/2020 at 0015 PDT (0315 EDT): Protesters attempted to barricade the front doors of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse with sheets of plywood. They also set-up plywood barriers at the edge of the sidewalk and tied fishing line across the steps of the front of the courthouse. From live stream video, mallets, wrist rockets and tasers have been observed in the crowd. One individual was observed shooting

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the courthouse and the Justice Center with the wrist rocket. Law Enforcement witnessed over 20 individual instances of vandalism to the courthouse throughout the night.

07/13/2020 at 0125 hours PDT (0425 EDT): Violent protesters attempted arson of the courthouse by building a fire with wood from a bonfire they had built in the middle of the street. The protesters were unable to get the plywood protecting the building to light.

07/13/2020 at 0300 PDT (0600 EDT): USBP SOG agents arrested a subject that was identified as having assaulted law enforcement personnel with a laser on a previous evening.

07/13/2020 at 0400 PDT (0700 EDT): USBP SOG mobile units arrested the subject that attempted arson of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse after most of the protesters had left the area.

07/13/2020 at 0430 PDT (0730 EDT): Protesters have dispersed and all USBP SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No less lethal munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/13/20 to 7/14/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

On July 13, 2020 San Diego Sector Special Operations Detachment (SDC/SOD) personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) along with key leaders from the USBP SOG element in order take over the mission and provide seamless support to FPS.

At 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), USBP SDC/SOD, SOG BORTAC key leaders, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the Law Enforcement Posture from the previous night, would remain the same. A large crowd, approximately 400-500 protestors, gathered and focused attention at the Portland Police Association (PPA) Building (Non-Federal), located at 1868 N Lombard St, Portland, OR 97209 (Approximately 4 miles away from the Hatfield Courthouse). Portland Police Bureau (PPB) Officers Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer Updated: July 19, 2020, 1000hrs

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were on location and protecting the facility while city workers were boarding up the glass. Situational reporting indicates that the protest is against Police Unions, believed to be protecting Police Officers, and to further the movement to defund police.

7/13/20 at 2345 hours PDT (0245 EDT): Rioters began to assault Portland Police Officers at the Police Association Building with harmful laser pointers and set mattresses on fire to block routes of ingress/egress.

7/14/20 at 0008 hours PDT (0308 EDT): Rioters began assaulting Portland Police Officers and City Workers with rocks and bricks, one of the Officers was struck in the helmet with a large rock. Portland Police maneuvered crowd control elements to disperse the crowd.

7/14/20 at 0011 hours PDT (0311 EDT): PPB declared the demonstration a riot and have begun moving the crowd away from the PPA Building.

7/14/20 at 0025 hours PDT (0325 EDT): PPB continues to be assaulted with hard objects and encounter resistance from the large group of rioters.

7/14/20 at 0100 hours PDT (0400 EDT): PPB continues to push the rioters away from the PPA building. They continue to be assaulted intermittently with objects.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PDT (0500 EDT): PPB pushed the crowd approximately two blocks away from the PPA and are holding ground.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PDT (0500 EDT): The crowd in front of the Hatfield Courthouse remained small and peaceful.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PDT (2345 EDT): Open source reporting indicated a group of 300-400 protestors gathered at the Portland City Hall would be relocating to the Pioneer Courthouse. The protestors are moving from the City Hall building and arriving in Pioneer Square located directly in front of the Pioneer Courthouse. Protestors are currently peaceful.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PDT (2345 EDT): FPS deployed Officers and SDC/SOD deployed mobile units agents) to the Pioneer Courthouse for situational awareness. (b)(7)(E) law enforcement are deployed into the crowd at Lownsdale Park in front of the Hatfield Courthouse to observe and gain situational awareness.

07/14/20 at 2100 hours PDT (0000 EDT): Protestors departed from Pioneer Square and relocated to the Justice Center, just north of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protester numbers are 300-400. Protestors remain peaceful.

07/14/20 at 2318 hours PDT (0018 EDT): A subject placed a plywood board with nails pointing up in front of the Hatfield Courthouse Front door in an attempt to prevent law enforcement from exiting the building.**No Law enforcement response was initiated.

07/14/20 at 2320 hours PDT (0220 EDT): Protestors have barricaded several streets, setting up signs to indicate the area is the "Chinook Land Autonomous Territory" "CLOT". Open source reporting indicates the PNW Youth Liberation Front is organizing the occupation.

Portland Police Bureau (PPB) has indicated that they will not allow the protestors to occupy the parks.

PPB advised they intend to clear the park and all barricades before 7:00AM (PST)

07/14/20 at 2330 hours PDT (0230 EDT): A fire was reported in Terry Schrunk Plaza (Federal Property) to the east of the Edith Green Federal Building. FPS Officers investigated and determined it to be a bottle Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer

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full of flammable liquid. FPS extinguished the fire and returned to the Edith Green Building. No arrests or subjects were identified associated to the fire.

07/15/20 at 0020 hours PDT (0320 EDT): Agents at the Edith Green Federal building report that unknown persons are attempting to assault agents and officers within the building with lasers. SDC/SOD is deploying mobile units and (b)(7)(E) agents to attempt to identify the persons committing assaults with lasers. Negative contact was made.

07/15/20 at 0110 hours PDT (0410 EDT): Protestors relocated to block streets around the Justice Center in an attempt to interrupt the shift change of the Portland Police Bureau (PPB).

07/15/20 at 0124 hours PDT (0424 EDT): PPB deployed their crowd control units to push the crowd away from the Justice Center. PPB Officers are being actively assaulted with lasers, hard objects and glass bottles. PPB crowd control units were able to draw the crowd away from the Justice Center. Shift change occurred without further incident.

07/15/20 at 0125 hours PDT (0425 EDT): Two ICE ERO SRT agents were assaulted with a green laser to the eyes at the Edith Green Federal Building. Officers were able to get a description of the subject, the Private Security Officer recorded the assaulter on CCV camera. (b)(7)(E) agents in the area are attempting to locate the subject.

0224 hours PST: (b)(7)(E) agents made Positive Identification of the assaulter. Subject was located walking south on 3^{rd,} toward Madison in a small group. Agents will continue to maintain visual until the subject enters an area away from the protestors. SDC/SOD mobile units will attempt to make the arrest once clear.

SDC/SOD observation team has also gained visual of the subject walking in a group. 0236 hours PDT (0536 EDT): SDC/SOD Mobile Units approached the location of the subject and encountered a group of individuals that fled on foot. Two individuals, both matching the description of the assaulter, were detained and transported to the Hatfield Courthouse for positive identification.

- Neither subject was positively identified as the assaulter, neither had possession of a laser,
- Both subject were identified and released.

07/15/20 at 0130 hours PDT (0330 EDT): Rioters were observed breaking in to a double door underground access point near 3rd and Salmon. Rioters removed unidentified metal material from the access point and are using it to barricade streets. Break in was not on Federal Property. PPB did not respond.

07/15/2020 at 0300 hours PDT (0600 EDT): The crowds were remaining peaceful and all personnel were ordered released by FPS. As FPS and ERO SRT were exiting the Edith Green Federal Building, their vehicles were assaulted with lasers and hard objects. SDC/SOD BORTAC has vehicles remaining at the Edith Green Building and were attempting to re-enter the building. Protestors blocked the ingress route to the parking structure.

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0315 hours PDT (0615 EDT): FPS contacted PPB to provide assistance. PPB advised that they would not be responding.

0325 hours PDT (0625 EDT): ERO SRT returned to assist SDC/SOD re-enter the building to recover their vehicles.

0340 hours PDT (0640 EDT): ERO SRT blocked the street to allow SDC/SOD to re-enter the Edith Green Building, but were unable to hold the street as they were being assaulted with hard objects. Exit was blocked by rioters and law enforcement personnel were not able to depart the area.

0345 hours PDT (0645 EDT): SDC/SOD exited the Edith Green Building on foot and ordered the crowd (approx. 50-75 subjects) to back away from Federal property to allow the vehicles to exit. The crowd refused several orders to depart Federal property. SDC/SOD was assaulted with hard objects. SDC/SOD deployed less lethal and (b)(7)(E) munitions in order to disperse the hostile rioters. SDC/SOD pushed the rioters away from the Edith Green Federal Building but the crowd refused to stay away. SDC/SOD pushed the crowd from the Edith Green Building to the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. SDC/SOD was met at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse by FPS and entered the building.

PPB advised they intend to have officers present in both squares in order to prevent any destruction or unauthorized removal of the fencing. FPS will also have officers present in TSP to prevent the destruction of or removal of fencing and to prevent trespassing onto Federal property.

DHS Acting Secretary Wolf (AS1) visited the Hatfield Courthouse and met with leadership from FPS, US Marshals Office, FBI, HSI, CBP, and ICE. AS1 met with Federal personnel that have been conducting operations in Portland in order to protect Federal facilities and property. AS1 held a press conference with select media. AS1 departed the Hatfield Courthouse at approximately 1800 hours (PDT)

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At 1700 PDT, July 16, 2020, USBP SDC SOD, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the Law Enforcement Posture from the previous nights, at the Hatfield Courthouse, would remain the same. The posture will be reactive only by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will be allowed. Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points. The posture will be more proactive in TSP in order to prevent destruction or removal of fencing.

Burnside Street, Portland, OR. (Approximately 4 miles east from the Hatfield Courthouse). Approximately 50 protesters are gathered in front of the Hatfield Courthouse at the intersection of 3rd Avenue and Main Street.

Good Morning: Please see the attached CBP Law Enforcement Support 1000 hours report for Portland, Oregon. Changes since the last report have been highlighted below in RED.

Violent protestors forcibly breached the federal courthouse by ripping off plywood and battering the building with a fire extinguisher. Violent protestors assaulted personnel with powerful lasers, rocks, plywood pieces, balloons filled with human feces, and other hard objects. Less lethal was deployed by CBP in order to disperse the unruly mob. FPS arrested several individuals for assault and failure to comply. No employee injuries reported, No arrests were made by CBP, and all CBP personnel have been released.

Law Enforcement Officers from CBP will report to Portland, Oregon tonight for the 19th night of law enforcement support tonight.

At 1700 PST, July 20, 2020, USBP SDC/SOD, OFO SRT, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders attended a briefing at the Edith Green Federal Building. 

<u>RFA REQUEST FOR CONTINGENCY PLANNING IN ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI</u> From DHS OPS:

BLUF: At this time for St. Louis, the FBI continues to plan on having adequate resources in the city and do not have plans on utilizing DHS contingency forces at this Therefore, DHS will only execute our contingency if something totally unexpected were to o At this point, there is a low probability that any DHS forces will be needed in St. Louis.

FBI and DOJ forces along with other State/local agencies have the situation well in hand. That said, DHS OPS is offering contingencies.

- 1. <u>Air surveillance</u>: CBP/AMO can offer up (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) with (b)(7)(E) capability. It will take these aircraft approximately hours to get on scene from initial request (about hours for pre-flight preps and about hours flight time to St. Louis).
- 2. Ground Forces: In addition to funding limitations noted last evening and authorities issues
 - 1. FPS:
 - 1. Inside St. Louis, FPS will have District Commander Area Commanders and officers (total (NY/NE)). Within a hour radius of St. Louis, FPS could call in an additional officers for a maximum of (NY/NE).
 - 2. FPS will also provide LNOs to the various command posts and EOC inside St. Louis for coordination.

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- 3. FPS was going to inquire with SAC on how to get local authorities/powers crossdesignated to DHS LEOs if DHS LEOs were requested for suppor <u>off</u> of Federal property. If used for security around federal facilities, we are all set with our own organic authorities to include other DHS components who could be brought in to augment FPS. Currently though, no DHS component has LE powers off of federal property unless the locals convey such authority. If your SAC ever sought about using DHS LEOs in that role, we would seek assistance in coordinating with the locals to get the appropriate legal authorities cross-designated to DHS.
- 4. Funding for DHS support on non-federal property is the other issue requiring a funding solution to avoid an Anti-Deficiency Act (ADA) violation. Funding is a <u>non-issue</u> if DHS is kept to securing federal property.
- 2. ICE:
 - ICE has a standby Rapid Deployment Team of on a (b)(7)(E) at Benning, GA. If additional DHS ground forces were requested, we would launch this team first. USCG would be the transport provider. Once this team arrived in St. Louis, the aircraft could gas up and relaunch to Detroit to pick up the ICE team and return to St. Louis.
 - Both teams in GA and MI are proactively working to get USMS deputization completed today. If this ICE contingency were utilized and the team(s) were employed off federal property, they would both need local authorities transferred as well. And there's the funding piece noted above for off federal property support.

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






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Washington D.C. FPS has concluded their holiday weekend efforts in D.C. and do not have any further requirements for CBP. All the OFO SRT officers are within commuting distance to the NCR and can be brought back if needed but it is unlikely at this point. A total of were removed from national alert status totals.

CBP team demobilized at the conclusion of their shift on July 5th and returned to their assigned Sector / Field Office.

TIMELINE OF EVENTS:

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20: USBP agents deployed to assist FPS

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Approximately 100 protesters gathered outside of the Hatfield Courthouse, located at 1000 SW 3rd Ave, Portland, OR 97204. At approximately 1230 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), the protesters breached the front door of the courthouse. The protesters then proceeded to assault Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers and U.S. Marshals with rocks and bottles. Portland FPS requested support from the forward deployed USBP SOG team in order to assist in the protection of federal property and provide additional safety and security to the FPS Officers and U.S. Marshals under siege by the protesters.

TIMELINE (PDT):

07/03/2020; 0130 SOG team arrived at the courthouse

07/03/2020; 0151 SOG team preparing to assist FPS, U.S. Marshals and the Portland Police Department in the active riot while attempting to disperse the protesters from the federal property. 07/03/2020; 0253 SOG team holding inside the courthouse Contractors are in route to repair the breached door. Once the contractors arrive, the SOG team and partners (approximately Officers and Agents) will push outside to create a perimeter in order to facilitate the door repair. Crowd size is approximately 50 to 75 people. Protesters are sporadically throwing bottles and fireworks at the SOG team and partners. No "use of force" applied by SOG personnel at this time. 07/03/2020; 0400 Contractors arrived on-scene and the SOG team and partners pushed out a perimeter. Protesters dispersed without incident. The breached front door of the courthouse is currently under repair.

07/03/2020; 0435 Courthouse door has been secured. No "use of force" was applied by SOG personnel and no injuries reported. SOG team has cleared the scene.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20 to 7/4/20:

On July 3, 2020, all SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, I U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/04/2020 at 0100 hours PDT: A group of approximately 30 protesters gathered at the courthouse, became violent and broke a courthouse window. No law enforcement action was taken.

07/04/2020 at 0349 hours PDT: The group of 30 protesters broke the two front doors of the courthouse and were attempting to enter the building. Due to the violent actions of the protesters and safety concerns, USBP SOG team deployed less lethal (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions to regain control of the

building and protect all law enforcement personnel.

07/04/2020 at 0419 hours PDT: The SOG team and other law enforcement partners have pushed the group of protesters away from the courthouse front doors, past the closed off street and off the federal park property.

07/04/2020 at 0427 hours PDT: The protesters returned and came back on to federal park property. Federa law enforcement personnel, to include USB SOG, were able to deter the protesters from advancing further.


Protesters are now off federal park property The USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have formed a line on the edge of the federal park property.

07/04/2020 at 0450 hours PDT: USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have returned to the courthouse and are holding a line just outside of the front doors that were destroyed by violent protesters. Contractors are in-route to repair the doors. 40 plus protesters remain in the federal park area and appear to be calm at the moment. No injuries to the SOG team or any other law enforcement partners reported at this time.

07/04/2020 at 0525 PDT (0825 EDT): Contractors are on-scene and are repairing the broken doors Law Enforcement personnel are continuing to remain in a protection posture

07/04/2020 at 0555 hours (0855 EDT): SOG personnel have moved inside the courthouse and the Portland Police Department has assumed outside security. There are only approximately 15 protesters remaining on-scene and appear to be passive at this time.

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
- 2241 hours: SOG BORTAC arrested three subjects that were spray painting the courthouse CCTV cameras. The SOG team utilized a (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) during the arrest. The subjects were handed over to the U.S. Marshals.
- 2302 hours: Violent protesters are throwing rocks and shooting fireworks M60 mortars at the courthouse. Protesters broke the plate glass above the courthouse doors and are throwing pain and mace inside the courthouse. No injuries to law enforcement personnel reported.
- 07/04/2020 at 2319 hours (PST): SOG BORTAC dispersed the aggressive protesters away for the courthouse and off of the federal park property with (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions.
- 07/04/2020 at 2336 hours (PST): Protesters returned to the federal park property and were once again dispersed by SOG BORTAC with (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions.
- 07/04/2020 at 2357 hours (PST): Portland PD has assumed perimeter security of the federal courthouse property and is making arrests. SOG team leaders are conducting equipment checks and personnel welfare checks. No injuries to the SOG personnel at this time.
- 07/05/2020 at 0010 hours PDT (0310 EDT): Violent protesters are using frozen water bottles, paint, large rocks, bottle rockets/large fireworks, green laser pointers and M60 firework mortars to assault law enforcement personnel. SOG personnel have been struck by these items, but no signification injuries have been reported.
- 07/05/2020 at 0028 hours PDT (0328 EDT): SOG personnel have reassumed their defensive positions as Portland PD has vacated the area.
- 07/05/2020 at 0045 hours PDT (0345 EDT): Violent protesters continue to attack law enforcement and SOG team members had another exchange with the protesters as they attempted to get within close distance of the building and law enforcement personnel. SOG was forced to use to disperse the crowd.
- 07/05/2020 at 0145 hours PDT (0445 EDT): Protesters tossed a large explosive device into the courthouse foyer where the SOG team was staged. SOG BORTAC exited the courthouse and dispersed the protesters off of the federal park property using (b)(7)(E) and direct (b)(7)(E) munitions. The protesters continued to actively assault SOG personnel with bottle rockets and mortar style fireworks as they retreated off of the federal property.
- 07/05/2020 at 0235 hours PDT (0535 EDT): SOG BORTAC arrested two subjects. One subject was deploying harmful DPSS lasers directly into the face of SOG BORTAC Operators. The other subject assaulted SOG operators with a shield as they arrested the subject with the laser. Both are currently in custody of the FPS.
- 07/05/2020 at 0415 PDT (0715 EDT): FPS Officers made several announcements directing the protesters to vacate the federal property directly in front of the courthouse doors or they would be arrested for trespassing. FPS personnel then directed USBP SOG personnel to arrest any subject that was refusing the lawful order to leave the federal property. As SOG personnel came out of the courthouse to make arrests, an individual shined a harmful DPSS laser directly into the faces of SOG personnel. SOG BORTAC was able to take the subject into custody and arrested him for assault. A subsequent search of the subject revealed a pipe bomb, a fused explosive device, a machete and a buck knife.

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 07/05/2020 at 0545 (PST): Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.



- BLW Mobile Field Force (MFF), comprised of Border Patrol Search Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR), Border Patrol Tactical (BORTAC), and Mobile Response Team (MRT) team members traveled to Seattle to provide support to FPS on July 2, 2020 and returned to BLW today, July 5, 2020.
- BLW provided SOG MFF agents deployed to Portland with less lethal munition resupplies sent via GOV on July 5, 2020. The SOG agents remain counted towards national alert totals.

On July 5, 2020 at 2030 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed USBP SOG personnel reported to the **(b)(7)(E)** located at **(b)(7)(E)** The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the **(b)(7)(E)** along w the Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

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07/05/20 at 1000 hours PST: A support request for additional less lethal munitions was submitted to Blaine Sector for the CBP SOG team in Portland, OR

7/5/20 at 1118 hours PST: Bellingham Station agents departed with less lethal munitions in route to Portland, OR.

07/05/20 at 1700 hours PST: Munitions have arrived in Portland and delivered to SOG operators. 07/05/2020 at 2137 hours PST: Protesters are throwing fireworks and shooting M60 mortars at a dump truck that is loading wood in front of the courthouse. A construction crew is working in front of the courthouse completing the boarding of windows broken by last night's violent protests.

07/05/2020 at 2145 hours: SOG BORTAC dispersed the protesters away from the courthouse and into the federal park property with officer presence holding a line in the front of the park.

07/05/2020 at 2210 hours: SOG BORTAC observation posts have visual of a male subject with a harmful green laser in hand. Subject did not use the laser on any personnel.

07/05/2020 at 2244 hours: Construction crews have completed work and vans are being escorted out of the area by HSI SRT. Teams have moved back into the courthouse with no further incident.

07/05/2020at 2340 hours: One subject was deploying a harmful purple laser directly at the eyes and face of SOG BORTAC and FPS personnel that are in an observation post. Protester has been identified as a female subject wearing a black top and white helmet with reddish hair.

07/06/2020 at 2410 hours PST: SOG BORTAC arrested two subjects that were deploying harmful lasers directly into the eyes and faces of the SOG BORTAC agents that were in an observation point. The first subject is a male and was encountered on the steps of the courthouse. He was arrested by SOG BORTAC and is currently in FPS custody. The second subject was a female that had previously been identified as pointing a dangerous laser at agents. During the apprehension of the female, she requested to speak with a medic. SOG BORSTAR and BORTAC agents engaged in a conversation with the subject, while a US Marshall provided cover. While ascertaining the subject's health, she reached for a knife and placed it to her throat. The US Marshall deployed his Taser to prevent her from injuring herself. The SOG BORSTAR Agent jumped on the subject and physically removed the knife from her throat. Due to the heroic and quick reactions of the US Marshall and SOG BORSTAR agent, the subject did not harm herself. Portland EMS arrived and the subject has been transported to the hospital.

While walking back to the courthouse SOG BORTAC Agents were assaulted by criminal protesters throwing bottles and fireworks. Another protester pointed a harmful laser at SOG personnel's eyes and faces. The subject was apprehended shortly after by SOG BORTAC.

07/06/2020 at 0215 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene Information from social media confirms that protesters will not return tonight. Intel received indicates that protesters will be possibly moving to other targets rather than the Federal Courthouse due to heavy federal enforcement actions. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

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CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/6/20 to 7/7/20: 2000-0600 hours PST

On July 6, 2020 at 2130 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all or referred forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/06/20 at 0800 hours PST: (b)(7)(E) AMO departed (b)(7)(E) in-route to (b)(7)(E) WV to pick up less lethal munitions resupply.

07/06/20 at 1030 hours PST: AMO arrived at (b)(7)(E) WV airfield

07/06/20 at 1230 hours PST: AMO departed (b)(7)(E) WV in-route to Portland, OR 07/06/20 at 1830 hours PST: AMO arrived in Portland, OR

07/06/20 at 2130 hours PST: All USBP SOG personnel are staged at the **(b)(7)(E)** with FPS, USMS, and HSI SRT law enforcement personnel.

07/06/20 at 2237 hours PST: Three separate groups of protesters are gathering in front of the Hayfield Courthouse on 3rd Street. The first group of protesters is approximately 100-150 protesters in size standing on 3rd and Main St. The second group of protesters is approximately 50 people. They are wearing protective gear to include gas masks and have been seen with leaf blowers. The third group of protesters are staged near the Elk Monument and have been assaulting USBP SOG personnel that are in an observation position with harmful lasers pointing them directly at the eyes and faces. Law enforcement personnel are currently holding a position in the foyer of the courthouse and planning is ongoing for an attempt to arrest assaultive subjects. 07/06/2020 at 2355 hours PST: Protesters have moved east away from the courthouse. Protesters appear to be staging in front of the Justice Center building next to the courthouse. Information gathered from social media indicates that the protesters are being told not to incite Federal Agencies within the Federal Courthouse. USBP SOG team is prepared to respond to other locations if requested.

07/07/2020 at 0045 hours PS USBP SOG arrested three subjects that were pointing harmful green lasers directly into the eyes and faces of USBP SOG and FPS personnel in observation positions All three subjects are currently in custody of the FPS.

07/07/2020 at 0147 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by SOG personnel. Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last two nights. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

PATH FORWARD: July 6th

Portland Team: Monday July 6th from 2000-0600 (PDT), USBP SOG team will report to the (b)(7)(E) for assignments with FPS

On July 7, 2020 at 2100 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with server Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers (U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and server Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/08/2020 at 2400 hours PST: USBP SOG Operators were conducting observation on suspicious subjects near the Edith Green Federal Building. During this time, USBP SOG personnel were targeted with harmful green lasers. As a result of the laser deployment, USBP SOG personnel attempted to perform an arrest. A foot pursuit ensued from the federal building into the Chapman Park area were several other protesters were congregated.

A group of over 200 protesters saw our personnel chasing the subject. The protesters began assaulting agents with rocks and bottles as they ran towards the USBP SOG team. USBP SOG immediately discontinued the foot pursuit and began to return to the Edith Green Federal Building as they were being pursued by a mob of 100 protesters assaulting them with rocks and bottles. In order to move protesters away from the entrance of the Federal Building, USBP SOG deployed (b)(7)(E)

No SOG personnel were injured, one FPS Officer rolled his ankle.

07/08/2020 at 0240 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/8/20 to 7/9/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

 On July 8, 2020 at 1700 hours PDT (2000 EDT), all errel forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with errel Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers errel U.S.

 Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and errel Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

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07/08/2020 at 2110 hours PDT (0010 EDT): An individual that has been observed assaulting law enforcement personnel with a laser and destroying federal property (a video surveillance camera) over the last couple of days was seen by the USBP SOG observation team in Lownsdale Square Park. The subject is also responsible for the injuries to HSI Special Agent (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) whom is currently unable to work due to the injury. SOG recon teams were sent to canvas the federal park area in an attempt to confirm the identity the subject. During this sweep, the recon team positively identified the individual and reported his location back to the command center. The recon team sent a picture of the individual for confirmation and positive ID was established. USBP SOG command formulated a plan to deploy mobile teams comprised of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshals and HSI SRT with FPS support and SOG BORTAC over watch to apprehend the individual. The teams converged on the individual in the northeast corner of Lownsdale Square Park near the corner of 3rd avenue and SW Salmon Street. The subject attempted to flee the area, but what apprehended by the combined units. The subject was escorted back to the Hatfield Courthouse without incident. No less lethal was deployed. Two law enforcement personnel sustained minor injuries during the apprehension, one SOG BORTAC agent and one US Marshal. The subject was asked and stated that he had not sustained any injuries and declined any medical attention.

Subject's name is (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) DOB (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Subject is currently in the custody of the U.S. Marshals Service.

FPS will be filing an affidavit in support of criminal complaints.

07/09/2020 at 0055 PDT (0355 EDT): Update on the subject arrested earlier in the evening Subject is a reported missing person, Subject is now in the custody of the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office

07/09/2020 at 0130 PDT (0430 EDT): A white SUV crossover that according to social media posts is a 2018 Kia Sportage with Oregon license plate [b)(6),(b)(7)(C)] was driving recklessly through the protesters and throwing out fireworks. The vehicle appeared to crash into the foundation of the Elk statue in Chapman Park. A crowd of protesters converged on the vehicle to confront the occupants. After some arguing, the protesters allowed the vehicle to leave the scene. As the vehicle was leaving, an individual in the vehicle was reported to have fired 5 or 6 shots into the air above the heads of the protesters. No protesters were reported to have been injured. Soon afterwards, social media posts and live streams claimed that the vehicle was still in the general location. SOG BORTAC and FPS deployed mobile teams to canvass the area in a search for the vehicle.

07/09/2020; 0230 PDT (0530 EDT): Situation Update: The mobile teams consisting of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshals, and FPS personnel searched the area with negative results on locating the suspects' vehicle. All law enforcement personnel have returned to the Hatfield

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Courthouse without injury. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. The Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last three nights.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/10/20 to 7/11/20: 1700-0300 hours PDT

07/11/2020 at 0400 hours PDT (0700 EDT): Nothing additional to report. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by SOG personnel. N injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

On July 10, 2020 at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all form forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

The teams were divided between (6)(7)(E) locations;



07/11/2020 at 2110 hours PDT (0010 EDT): A subject was told to leave the federal property at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. When he refused, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS deployed to arrest the subject. The subject ran through the park to evade arrest. When law enforcement pursued, the began to be assaulted by the crowd. The primary subject was arrested and well as another subject that assaulted a US Marshal. (b)(7)(E) and was deployed by USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS to push the crowd away from the law enforcement personnel who were being assaulted. The situation is very fluid and updates will follow as details are received.

07/11/2020 at 2330 hours PDT (0230 EDT): All law enforcement personnel are back in their respective buildings. There was an additional arrest of a subject for failure to leave the federal property. The

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protesters are using shields, umbrellas, gas masks and goggles. They continue to engage law enforceme personnel and then retreat into the crowd. This crowd of protesters are much different from the previous night of protesters. They are better organized and more violent. They are much more willing to engage with law enforcement. Protesters were walking a young child between the crowd and the law enforcement personnel. A warning was given to them to depart from federal property and they eventually complied with the request.

07/11/2020 at 2345 hours PDT (0245 EDT): Protesters are crowding the property line for the Hatfield Federal Courthouse and are ignoring multiple warnings. Protester radio traffic stated that they were moving shields and umbrellas forward to ward off CS gas canisters. FPS used a loud speaker to move the crowd back. A USBP SOG recon team reported a sUAS launching location in the park and provided the coordinates to the the social media is showing video of an individual whom they claim was injured from less lethal munitions. EMS responded and the subject was taken to the hospital. No further information available at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0025 hours PDT (0325 EDT): The crowd of protesters had been repeatedly crossing the property line at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. They were ignoring warnings over the loud speaker to move back from the building. The protesters then began throwing hard objects and shooting fireworks at law enforcement personnel. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS personnel deployed less lethal munitions to include (b)(7)(E) and (b)(P) against the crowd of protesters pushing them back into the park across the street from the courthouse. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0110 hours PDT (0410 EDT): The law enforcement personnel at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse attempted to move back inside after giving the protesters warnings not to follow them onto the sidewalk surrounding the building. As law enforcement personnel moved into the building, the protesters followed them and began throwing objects at them. Less lethal munitions were deployed to include and and the protesters follower personnel moved back into the building and continued to issue warnings to stay off federal property. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0155 hours PDT (0455 EDT): A protester was observed defacing the Hatfield Federal Courthouse and another was refusing to leave the federal property. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS deployed and arrested both individuals. Less lethal munitions were deployed to include and and ((b)(7)(E) Portland Police Bureau declared the area surrounding the federal buildings downtown closed to the public. In conjunction with Portland Police Bureau, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS pushed protesters out of the area. Federal law enforcement personnel moved back into the building. Portland Police Bureau remained at the edge of the perimeter keeping the protesters out the downtown area. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0330 hours PDT (0630 EDT): Prior to the USBP SOG, SOG US Marshal and FPS deployment, rioters were issued warnings via a loud speaker to remain off of federal property and to not Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer Updated: July 21, 2020, 1000hrs.

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assault law enforcement personnel. In defiance of the warning, rioters were observed assaulting law enforcement personnel with lasers and by throwing hard objects to include glass bottles. Observation pos teams were able to positively identify one of the subjects deploying the lasers. [bit706] teams were deployed from the side of the courthouse resulting in an additional two arrests for assault with lasers. The subject that was tagging the building later assaulted law enforcement officers when he threw a beer bottle at them. USBP SOG agents observed the assault and made the arrest. No law enforcement personnel were injured. Two of the three subjects were transported to medical facilities for treatment. No further details on their condition are currently available. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene.

On July 12, 2020 at 1700 hours PDT (2000 EDT), USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the decision had been made, collectively, by the United States Marshal for the District of Oregon, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and the FPS Regional Director to reduce the proactive posture by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The Director briefed that the operational posture to be taken would be to seal the courthouse and hold a non-reactive posture to all minor violations without a Law Enforcement response or resolution. The Director advised that Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse would only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

After the brief, all more forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) The USBP SOG team conducted an operations brief and were (b)(7)(E) deployed in (b)(7)(E) to the (b)(7)(E) and to the Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers are deployed between the three Federal buildings U.S. Marshal's Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) and some Enforcement and Removal (ERO) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

07/13/2020 at 0015 PDT (0315 EDT): Protesters attempted to barricade the front doors of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse with sheets of plywood. They also set-up plywood barriers at the edge of the sidewalk and tied fishing line across the steps of the front of the courthouse. From live stream video, mallets, wrist rockets and tasers have been observed in the crowd. One individual was observed shooting

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the courthouse and the Justice Center with the wrist rocket. Law Enforcement witnessed over 20 individual instances of vandalism to the courthouse throughout the night.

07/13/2020 at 0125 hours PDT (0425 EDT): Violent protesters attempted arson of the courthouse by building a fire with wood from a bonfire they had built in the middle of the street. The protesters were unable to get the plywood protecting the building to light.

07/13/2020 at 0300 PDT (0600 EDT): USBP SOG agents arrested a subject that was identified as having assaulted law enforcement personnel with a laser on a previous evening.

07/13/2020 at 0400 PDT (0700 EDT): USBP SOG mobile units arrested the subject that attempted arson of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse after most of the protesters had left the area.

07/13/2020 at 0430 PDT (0730 EDT): Protesters have dispersed and all USBP SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No less lethal munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/13/20 to 7/14/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

On July 13, 2020 San Diego Sector Special Operations Detachment (SDC/SOD) personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) along with key leaders from the USBP SOG element in order take over the mission and provide seamless support to FPS.

A large crowd, approximately 400-500 protestors, gathered and focused attention at the Portland Police Association (PPA) Building (Non-Federal), located at 1868 N Lombard St, Portland, OR 97209 (Approximately 4 miles away from the Hatfield Courthouse). Portland Police Bureau (PPB) Officers Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer Updated: July 21, 2020, 1000hrs

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were on location and protecting the facility while city workers were boarding up the glass. Situational reporting indicates that the protest is against Police Unions, believed to be protecting Police Officers, and to further the movement to defund police.

7/13/20 at 2345 hours PDT (0245 EDT): Rioters began to assault Portland Police Officers at the Police Association Building with harmful laser pointers and set mattresses on fire to block routes of ingress/egress.

7/14/20 at 0008 hours PDT (0308 EDT): Rioters began assaulting Portland Police Officers and City Workers with rocks and bricks, one of the Officers was struck in the helmet with a large rock. Portland Police maneuvered crowd control elements to disperse the crowd.

7/14/20 at 0011 hours PDT (0311 EDT): PPB declared the demonstration a riot and have begun moving the crowd away from the PPA Building.

7/14/20 at 0025 hours PDT (0325 EDT): PPB continues to be assaulted with hard objects and encounter resistance from the large group of rioters.

7/14/20 at 0100 hours PDT (0400 EDT): PPB continues to push the rioters away from the PPA building. They continue to be assaulted intermittently with objects.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PDT (0500 EDT): PPB pushed the crowd approximately two blocks away from the PPA and are holding ground.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PDT (0500 EDT): The crowd in front of the Hatfield Courthouse remained small and peaceful.

7/14/20 at 0215 hours PDT (0515 EDT): Nothing significant to report at the Federal Facilities. All USBP personnel have been released. No arrests were made. No vandalism reported. No Use of Force incidents.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PDT (2345 EDT): Open source reporting indicated a group of 300-400 protestors gathered at the Portland City Hall would be relocating to the Pioneer Courthouse. The protestors are moving from the City Hall building and arriving in Pioneer Square located directly in front of the Pioneer Courthouse. Protestors are currently peaceful.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PDT (2345 EDT): FPS deployed Officers and SDC/SOD deployed mobile units agents) to the Pioneer Courthouse for situational awareness. (b)(7)(E) law enforcement are deployed into the crowd at Lownsdale Park in front of the Hatfield Courthouse to observe and gain situational awareness.

07/14/20 at 2100 hours PDT (0000 EDT): Protestors departed from Pioneer Square and relocated to the Justice Center, just north of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protester numbers are 300-400. Protestors remain peaceful.

07/14/20 at 2318 hours PDT (0018 EDT): A subject placed a plywood board with nails pointing up in front of the Hatfield Courthouse Front door in an attempt to prevent law enforcement from exiting the building.**No Law enforcement response was initiated.

07/14/20 at 2320 hours PDT (0220 EDT): Protestors have barricaded several streets, setting up signs to indicate the area is the "Chinook Land Autonomous Territory" "CLOT". Open source reporting indicates the PNW Youth Liberation Front is organizing the occupation.

Portland Police Bureau (PPB) has indicated that they will not allow the protestors to occupy the parks.

PPB advised they intend to clear the park and all barricades before 7:00AM (PST)

07/14/20 at 2330 hours PDT (0230 EDT): A fire was reported in Terry Schrunk Plaza (Federal Property) to the east of the Edith Green Federal Building. FPS Officers investigated and determined it to be a bottle Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer

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full of flammable liquid. FPS extinguished the fire and returned to the Edith Green Building. No arrests or subjects were identified associated to the fire.

07/15/20 at 0020 hours PDT (0320 EDT): Agents at the Edith Green Federal building report that unknown persons are attempting to assault agents and officers within the building with lasers. SDC/SOD is deploying mobile units and (b)(7)(E) agents to attempt to identify the persons committing assaults with lasers. Negative contact was made.

07/15/20 at 0110 hours PDT (0410 EDT): Protestors relocated to block streets around the Justice Center in an attempt to interrupt the shift change of the Portland Police Bureau (PPB).

07/15/20 at 0124 hours PDT (0424 EDT): PPB deployed their crowd control units to push the crowd away from the Justice Center. PPB Officers are being actively assaulted with lasers, hard objects and glass bottles. PPB crowd control units were able to draw the crowd away from the Justice Center. Shift change occurred without further incident.

07/15/20 at 0125 hours PDT (0425 EDT): Two ICE ERO SRT agents were assaulted with a green laser to the eyes at the Edith Green Federal Building. Officers were able to get a description of the subject, the Private Security Officer recorded the assaulter on CCV camera. (b)(7)(E) agents in the area are attempting to locate the subject.

0224 hours PST[(b)(7)(E)] agents made Positive Identification of the assaulter. Subject was located walking south on 3rd toward Madison in a small group. Agents will continue to maintain visual until the subject enters an area away from the protestors. SDC/SOD mobile units will attempt to make the arrest once clear.

SDC/SOD observation team has also gained visual of the subject walking in a group. 0236 hours PDT (0536 EDT): SDC/SOD Mobile Units approached the location of the subject and encountered a group of individuals that fled on foot. Two individuals, both matching the description of the assaulter, were detained and transported to the Hatfield Courthouse for positive identification.

- Neither subject was positively identified as the assaulter, neither had possession of a laser,
- Both subject were identified and released.

07/15/20 at 0130 hours PDT (0330 EDT): Rioters were observed breaking in to a double door underground access point near 3rd and Salmon. Rioters removed unidentified metal material from the access point and are using it to barricade streets. Break in was not on Federal Property. PPB did not respond.

07/15/2020 at 0300 hours PDT (0600 EDT): The crowds were remaining peaceful and all personnel were ordered released by FPS. As FPS and ERO SRT were exiting the Edith Green Federal Building, their vehicles were assaulted with lasers and hard objects. SDC/SOD BORTAC has vehicles remaining at the Edith Green Building and were attempting to re-enter the building. Protestors blocked the ingress route to the parking structure.

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0315 hours PDT (0615 EDT): FPS contacted PPB to provide assistance. PPB advised that they would not be responding.

0325 hours PDT (0625 EDT): ERO SRT returned to assist SDC/SOD re-enter the building to recover their vehicles.

0340 hours PDT (0640 EDT): ERO SRT blocked the street to allow SDC/SOD to re-enter the Edith Green Building, but were unable to hold the street as they were being assaulted with hard objects. Exit was blocked by rioters and law enforcement personnel were not able to depart the area.

0345 hours PDT (0645 EDT): SDC/SOD exited the Edith Green Building on foot and ordered the crowd (approx. 50-75 subjects) to back away from Federal property to allow the vehicles to exit. The crowd refused several orders to depart Federal property. SDC/SOD was assaulted with hard objects. SDC/SOD deployed less lethal and (b)(7)(E) munitions in order to disperse the hostile rioters. SDC/SOD pushed the rioters away from the Edith Green Federal Building but the crowd refused to stay away. SDC/SOD pushed the crowd from the Edith Green Building to the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. SDC/SOD was met at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse by FPS and entered the building.

0400 hours PDT (0700 EDT): SDC/SOD was escorted by FPS and additional agents back to the Edith Green Building to recover their vehicles.

07/15/2020 at 0415 hours PDT (0715 EDT): No other significant incidents to report at the Federal Facilities. No arrests were made and no injuries to law enforcement reported. All USBP personnel have been released.

FPS reports that on four occasions tonight, individuals were witnessed by security camera defacing/vandalizing the Hatfield Courthouse. **No Law Enforcement response.

Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and the City of Portland cleared Lownsdale Square and Chapman Square o all tents and temporary structures that had been occupying the space during the morning of July 16, 2020. Temporary fencing was installed around both squares, both are city property. General Services Administration installed temporary fencing around Terry Schrunk Plaza (TSP), which is Federal property. PPB advised they intend to have officers present in both squares in order to prevent any destruction or unauthorized removal of the fencing. FPS will also have officers present in TSP to prevent the destruction of or removal of fencing and to prevent trespassing onto Federal property.

DHS Acting Secretary Wolf (AS1) visited the Hatfield Courthouse and met with leadership from FPS, US Marshals Office, FBI, HSI, CBP, and ICE. 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At 1700 PDT, July 16, 2020, USBP SDC SOD, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the Law Enforcement Posture from the previous nights, at the Hatfield Courthouse, would remain the same. The posture will be reactive only by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will be allowed. Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points. The posture will be more proactive in TSP in order to prevent destruction or removal of fencing.

Burnside Street, Portland, OR. (Approximately 4 miles east from the Hatfield Courthouse). Approximately 50 protesters are gathered in front of the Hatfield Courthouse at the intersection of 3rd Avenue and Main Street.

07/16/2020 at 2245 hours PST: Open source reporting indicates that protesters have taken the fence from the area of Lownsdale park, near the intersection of 4th Avenue and Salmon Street and used it as a barricade to block the street. PPB responded with a rapid response/crowd control unit and has repaired/secured the fence. PPB issued a warning to protesters that if they attempt to relocate or damage the fence, they will be subject to arrest. PPB has returned to their previous positions.

07/16/2020 at 2302 hours PST: Portland Police reported being struck with hard objects and glass bottles near the intersection of 4th Avenue and Madison Street. FPS Officers, located in TPS, identified one of the assaulting subjects and deployed less lethal munitions against the assaulters to protect PPB.

07/16/2020 at 2325 hours PST: BORTAC supported FPS Officers to removed protesters trespassing on federal property at the Edith Green Federal Building. While attempting to remove protesters, agents were assaulted with frozen water bottles, hard objects and a flaming object. Less lethal munitions were deployed.

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07/17/2020 at 0000 hours PST: PPB reported that a vehicle rushed their line at the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office/ Portland Police Bureau South Precinct at a high rate of speed. PPB was forced to T-bone the suspect vehicle in order to stop the vehicle from colliding into officers.

07/17/2020 at 0002 hours PST: BORTAC and FPS Officers returned to the Hatfield Courthouse.

07/17/2020 at 0026 hours PST: Northwest perimeter fence at Lownsdale Square has been removed by protesters and is being utilized as a barricade at 4th and Main.

07/17/2020 at 0126 hours PST: Protesters began to breach the TSP fence (federal property) across from the Edith Green Building. FPS and BORTAC pushed the protesters from the federal property where the breach occurred. No arrests were made.

07/17/2020 at 0201 hours PST: Breach temporarily fixed. BORTAC returned back to Edith Green Building.

07/17/2020 at 0248 hours PST: No additional significant incidents to report at the Federal Facilities. No arrest were made. All USBP personnel have been released.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/17/20 to 7/18/20:

At 1700 PST, July 17, 2020, USBP SDC/SOD, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders attended a briefing at the Edith Green Federal Building. Law Enforcement personnel will be deployed at the (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) The posture will be reactive only by teams. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will not solicit a law enforcement response. Federal enforcement action from the Federal buildings will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points. SDC/SOD will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

07/17/2020 at 2100 hours PST: Approximately 200 protesters are gathered in the downtown area (Lownsdale Square, Chapman Square and Terry Schrunk Plaza(TSP)).

07/17/2020 at 2102 hours PST: A section of perimeter fence around TSP that the city of Portland installed was taken down by the protesters.

07/17/2020 at 2136 hours PST: Federal agents (ERO SRT) positioned inside the (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) were assaulted by a green laser that is being directed at law enforcement's eyes and face.

07/17/2020 at 2200 hours PST: SDC/SOD supported the FPS Team in removing fencing that was placed at the entry/exits of Edith Green building. This fencing was used in an attempt to barricade law

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enforcement in the building. While clearing the entry/exits Federal agents were assaulted by green lasers being directed in their eyes and face.

07/17/2020 at 2211 hours PST: Violent subjects began to assault Federal Law Enforcement personnel by shining harmful lasers into officers / agent's eyes and face. Law Enforcement personnel were attempting to clear the exits of the Edith Green building and protesters refused to leave despite multiple warnings that they were trespassing. Protesters refused to leave federal property and continued to assault Federal Law Enforcement personnel with harmful lasers. Less lethal **(b)(7)(E)** munitions were deployed by teams. Spent less lethal munitions casing were recovered by the violent protesters and thrown at the agents.



Please see the attached CBP Law Enforcement Support report for 07/21/2020 1000 hours. Changes since yesterday's report have been highlighted below in RED.

BLUF: CBP Law Enforcement Officers from USBP SDC SOD, USBP SOG, USBP HQ and OFO SRT reported to Portland, Oregon for the 18th night of law enforcement support. Violent protestors forcibly

breached the federal courthouse by ripping off plywood and battering the building with a fire extinguisher. Violent protestors assaulted personnel with powerful lasers, rocks, plywood pieces, balloons filled with human feces, and other hard objects. Less lethal was deployed by CBP in order to disperse the unruly mob. FPS arrested several individuals for assault and failure to comply. No employee injuries reported, No arrests were made by CBP, and all CBP personnel have been released.





CBP Is Standing By And Ready To Support Federal, State, And Local Requests For Assistance

BLUF: A violent crowd size of approximately 1000 people was gathered downtown. The Portland Police Bureau (PPB) declared the current situation as a riot. Violent opportunist threw four "Molotov Cocktails" and shot commercial grade fireworks at the Hatfield Courthouse. The violent opportunists were given multiple warnings before CBP agents/officers arrested them. CBP personnel were assaulted with lasers, hard thrown objects, a balloon filled with paint. These assaults resulted in an injured toe, a bloody nose, and burning to several agent's/officer's neck and chest area. A total of six arrests were made, four by CBP.

GSA installed concrete barrier (K-Rail) with fencing around the Hatfield Courthouse.

AMO (b)(7)(E) flew overhead providing aerial situational awareness. AMO personnel are working on establishing (b)(7)(E).

Executive Summary:

On June 26, the President issued an Executive Order Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, he directed that DHS "shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property."

The DHS Acting Secretary, Chad F. Wolf, issued a memorandum, "DHS Support to Protect Federal Facilities and Property through July 4th Holiday Weekend," directing that three Civil Disturbance Units (CDU) be deployed, one each to Portland, OR; Seattle, WA; and the District of Columbia, no later than 2 July to be used in a reserve force role. He further directed that [burne] QRF CDUs be established and

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placed on standby to be used as a strategic reserve that can be deployed within hours of notification by the Department. QRFs are to be established by 2 July.

CBP is also supporting additional law enforcement assistance requests over the holiday weekend.

CURRENT STATUS

From July 2nd through July 6th, 2020, <u>CBP will pre-deploy agents/officers</u> to support FPS in Portland, OR, Seattle, WA, and Washington, DC, and <u>maintain agents/officers in standby</u> through the July 4th holiday weekend in order to protect federal facilities and property.

BLUF: At this time for St. Louis, the FBI continues to plan on having adequate resources in the city and do not have plans on utilizing DHS contingency forces at this Therefore, DHS will only execute our contingency if something totally unexpected were to o At this point, there is a low probability that any DHS forces will be needed in St. Louis.

FBI and DOJ forces along with other State/local agencies have the situation well in hand. That said, DHS OPS is offering contingencies.

- Air surveillance: CBP/AMO can offer up (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) with (b)(7)(E) capability. It will take these aircraft approximately hours to get on scene from initial request (about hours for pre-flight preps and about hours flight time to St. Louis).
- 2. Ground Forces: In addition to funding limitations noted last evening and authorities issues

 - 1. Inside St. Louis, FPS will have District Commander, Area Commanders and ficers (total). Within a hour radius of St. Louis, FPS could call in an additional officers for a maximum of].

- 3. FPS was going to inquire with SAC on how to get local authorities/powers crossdesignated to DHS LEOs if DHS LEOs were requested for suppor <u>off</u> of Federal property. If used for security around federal facilities, we are all set with our own organic authorities to include other DHS components who could be brought in to augment FPS. Currently though, no DHS component has LE powers off of federal property unless the locals convey such authority. If your SAC ever sought about using DHS LEOs in that role, we would seek assistance in coordinating with the locals to get the appropriate legal authorities cross-designated to DHS.
- 4. Funding for DHS support on non-federal property is the other issue requiring a funding solution to avoid an Anti-Deficiency Act (ADA) violation. Funding is a <u>non-issue</u> if DHS is kept to securing federal property.
- 2. <u>ICE</u>:








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Washington D.C. FPS has concluded their holiday weekend efforts in D.C. and do not have any further requirements for CBP. CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20: USBP agents deployed to assist FPS

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Approximately 100 protesters gathered outside of the Hatfield Courthouse, located at 1000 SW 3rd Ave, Portland, OR 97204. At approximately 1230 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), the protesters breached the front door of the courthouse. The protesters then proceeded to assault Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers and U.S. Marshals with rocks and bottles. Portland FPS requested support from the forward deployed USBP SOG team in order to assist in the protection of federal property and provide additional safety and security to the FPS Officers and U.S. Marshals under siege by the protesters.

TIMELINE (PDT):

07/03/2020; 0130 SOG team arrived at the courthouse

07/03/2020; 0151 SOG team preparing to assist FPS, U.S. Marshals and the Portland Police Department in the active riot while attempting to disperse the protesters from the federal property. 07/03/2020; 0253 SOG team holding inside the courthouse Contractors are in route to repair the breached door. Once the contractors arrive, the SOG team and partners (approximately Officers and Agents) will push outside to create a perimeter in order to facilitate the door repair. Crowd size is approximately 50 to 75 people. Protesters are sporadically throwing bottles and fireworks at the SOG team and partners. No "use of force" applied by SOG personnel at this time. 07/03/2020; 0400 Contractors arrived on-scene and the SOG team and partners pushed out a perimeter. Protesters dispersed without incident. The breached front door of the courthouse is currently under repair.

07/03/2020; 0435 Courthouse door has been secured. No "use of force" was applied by SOG personnel and no injuries reported. SOG team has cleared the scene.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20 to 7/4/20:

On July 3, 2020, all SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E). The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the courthouse along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/04/2020 at 0100 hours PDT: A group of approximately 30 protesters gathered at the courthouse, became violent and broke a courthouse window. No law enforcement action was taken.

07/04/2020 at 0349 hours PDT: The group of 30 protesters broke the two front doors of the courthouse and were attempting to enter the building. Due to the violent actions of the protesters and safety concerns, USBP SOG team deployed less lethal (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions to regain control of the

building and protect all law enforcement personnel.

07/04/2020 at 0419 hours PDT: The SOG team and other law enforcement partners have pushed the group of protesters away from the courthouse front doors, past the closed off street and off the federal park property.

07/04/2020 at 0427 hours PDT: The protesters returned and came back on to federal park property. Federa law enforcement personnel, to include USB SOG, were able to deter the protesters from advancing further.

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
Protesters are now off federal park property The USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have formed a line on the edge of the federal park property.

07/04/2020 at 0450 hours PDT: USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have returned to the courthouse and are holding a line just outside of the front doors that were destroyed by violent protesters. Contractors are in-route to repair the doors. 40 plus protesters remain in the federal park area and appear to be calm at the moment. No injuries to the SOG team or any other law enforcement partners reported at this time.

07/04/2020 at 0525 PDT (0825 EDT): Contractors are on-scene and are repairing the broken doors Law Enforcement personnel are continuing to remain in a protection posture

07/04/2020 at 0555 hours (0855 EDT): SOG personnel have moved inside the courthouse and the Portland Police Department has assumed outside security. There are only approximately 15 protesters remaining on-scene and appear to be passive at this time.

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
- 2241 hours: SOG BORTAC arrested three subjects that were spray painting the courthouse CCTV cameras. The SOG team utilized a (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) during the arrest. The subjects were handed over to the U.S. Marshals.
- 2302 hours: Violent protesters are throwing rocks and shooting fireworks M60 mortars at the courthouse. Protesters broke the plate glass above the courthouse doors and are throwing pain and mace inside the courthouse. No injuries to law enforcement personnel reported.
- 07/04/2020 at 2319 hours (PST): SOG BORTAC dispersed the aggressive protesters away for the courthouse and off of the federal park property with (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E)
- 07/04/2020 at 2336 hours (PST): Protesters returned to the federal park property and were once again dispersed by SOG BORTAC with (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions.
- 07/04/2020 at 2357 hours (PST): Portland PD has assumed perimeter security of the federal courthouse property and is making arrests. SOG team leaders are conducting equipment checks and personnel welfare checks. No injuries to the SOG personnel at this time.
- 07/05/2020 at 0010 hours PDT (0310 EDT): Violent protesters are using frozen water bottles, paint, large rocks, bottle rockets/large fireworks, green laser pointers and M60 firework mortars to assault law enforcement personnel. SOG personnel have been struck by these items, but no signification injuries have been reported.
- 07/05/2020 at 0028 hours PDT (0328 EDT): SOG personnel have reassumed their defensive positions as Portland PD has vacated the area.
- 07/05/2020 at 0045 hours PDT (0345 EDT): Violent protesters continue to attack law enforcement and SOG team members had another exchange with the protesters as they attempted to get within close distance of the building and law enforcement personnel. SOG was forced to use CS to disperse the crowd.
- 07/05/2020 at 0145 hours PDT (0445 EDT): Protesters tossed a large explosive device into the courthouse foyer where the SOG team was staged. SOG BORTAC exited the courthouse and dispersed the protesters off of the federal park property using (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) munitions. The protesters continued to actively assault SOG personnel with bottle rockets and mortar style fireworks as they retreated off of the federal property.
- 07/05/2020 at 0235 hours PDT (0535 EDT): SOG BORTAC arrested two subjects. One subject was deploying harmful DPSS lasers directly into the face of SOG BORTAC Operators. The other subject assaulted SOG operators with a shield as they arrested the subject with the laser. Both are currently in custody of the FPS.
- 07/05/2020 at 0415 PDT (0715 EDT): FPS Officers made several announcements directing the protesters to vacate the federal property directly in front of the courthouse doors or they would be arrested for trespassing. FPS personnel then directed USBP SOG personnel to arrest any subject that was refusing the lawful order to leave the federal property. As SOG personnel came out of the courthouse to make arrests, an individual shined a harmful DPSS laser directly into the faces of SOG personnel. SOG BORTAC was able to take the subject into custody and arrested him for assault. A subsequent search of the subject revealed a pipe bomb, a fused explosive device, a machete and a buck knife.

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 07/05/2020 at 0545 (PST): Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.



- BLW Mobile Field Force (MFF), comprised of Border Patrol Search Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR), Border Patrol Tactical (BORTAC), and Mobile Response Team (MRT) team members traveled to Seattle to provide support to FPS on July 2, 2020 and returned to BLW today, July 5, 2020.
- BLW provided SOG MFF agents deployed to Portland with less lethal munition resupplies sent via GOV on July 5, 2020. The SOG agents remain counted towards national alert totals.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/5/20 to 7/6/20: 2000-0600 hours PDT

On July 5, 2020 at 2030 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed USBP SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E). The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along w th Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, we U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

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07/05/20 at 1000 hours PST: A support request for additional less lethal munitions was submitted to Blaine Sector for the CBP SOG team in Portland, OR

7/5/20 at 1118 hours PST: Bellingham Station agents departed with less lethal munitions in route to Portland, OR.

07/05/20 at 1700 hours PST: Munitions have arrived in Portland and delivered to SOG operators. 07/05/2020 at 2137 hours PST: Protesters are throwing fireworks and shooting M60 mortars at a dump truck that is loading wood in front of the courthouse. A construction crew is working in front of the courthouse completing the boarding of windows broken by last night's violent protests.

07/05/2020 at 2145 hours: SOG BORTAC dispersed the protesters away from the courthouse and into the federal park property with officer presence holding a line in the front of the park.

07/05/2020 at 2210 hours: SOG BORTAC observation posts have visual of a male subject with a harmful green laser in hand. Subject did not use the laser on any personnel.

07/05/2020 at 2244 hours: Construction crews have completed work and vans are being escorted out of the area by HSI SRT. Teams have moved back into the courthouse with no further incident.

07/05/2020at 2340 hours: One subject was deploying a harmful purple laser directly at the eyes and face of SOG BORTAC and FPS personnel that are in an observation post. Protester has been identified as a female subject wearing a black top and white helmet with reddish hair.

07/06/2020 at 2410 hours PST: SOG BORTAC arrested two subjects that were deploying harmful lasers directly into the eyes and faces of the SOG BORTAC agents that were in an observation point. The first subject is a male and was encountered on the steps of the courthouse. He was arrested by SOG BORTAC and is currently in FPS custody. The second subject was a female that had previously been identified as pointing a dangerous laser at agents. During the apprehension of the female, she requested to speak with a medic. SOG BORSTAR and BORTAC agents engaged in a conversation with the subject, while a US Marshall provided cover. While ascertaining the subject's health, she reached for a knife and placed it to her throat. The US Marshall deployed his Taser to prevent her from injuring herself. The SOG BORSTAR Agent jumped on the subject and physically removed the knife from her throat. Due to the heroic and quick reactions of the US Marshall and SOG BORSTAR agent, the subject did not harm herself. Portland EMS arrived and the subject has been transported to the hospital.

While walking back to the courthouse SOG BORTAC Agents were assaulted by criminal protesters throwing bottles and fireworks. Another protester pointed a harmful laser at SOG personnel's eyes and faces. The subject was apprehended shortly after by SOG BORTAC.

07/06/2020 at 0215 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene Information from social media confirms that protesters will not return tonight. Intel received indicates that protesters will be possibly moving to other targets rather than the Federal Courthouse due to heavy federal enforcement actions. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

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CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/6/20 to 7/7/20: 2000-0600 hours PST

07/06/20 at 2130 hours PST: All USBP SOG personnel are staged at the **(b)(7)(E)** with FPS, USMS, and HSI SRT law enforcement personnel.

07/06/20 at 2237 hours PST: Three separate groups of protesters are gathering in front of the Hayfield Courthouse on 3rd Street. The first group of protesters is approximately 100-150 protesters in size standing on 3rd and Main St. The second group of protesters is approximately 50 people. They are wearing protective gear to include gas masks and have been seen with leaf blowers. The third group of protesters are staged near the Elk Monument and have been assaulting USBP SOG personnel that are in an observation position with harmful lasers pointing them directly at the eyes and faces. Law enforcement personnel are currently holding a position in the foyer of the courthouse and planning is ongoing for an attempt to arrest assaultive subjects. 07/06/2020 at 2355 hours PST: Protesters have moved east away from the courthouse. Protesters appear to be staging in front of the Justice Center building next to the courthouse. Information gathered from social media indicates that the protesters are being told not to incite Federal Agencies within the Federal Courthouse. USBP SOG team is prepared to respond to other locations if requested.

07/07/2020 at 0045 hours PST: USBP SOG arrested three subjects that were pointing harmful green lasers directly into the eyes and faces of USBP SOG and FPS personnel in observation positions. All three subjects are currently in custody of the FPS.

07/07/2020 at 0147 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by SOG personnel. Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last two nights. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

PATH FORWARD: July 6th

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CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/7/20 to 7/8/20: 2000-0600 hours PST

On July 7, 2020 at 2100 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) . The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

07/08/2020 at 2400 hours PST: USBP SOG Operators were conducting observation on suspicious subjects near the Edith Green Federal Building. During this time, USBP SOG personnel were targeted with harmful green lasers. As a result of the laser deployment, USBP SOG personnel attempted to perform an arrest. A foot pursuit ensued from the federal building into the Chapman Park area were several other protesters were congregated.

A group of over 200 protesters saw our personnel chasing the subject. The protesters began assaulting agents with rocks and bottles as they ran towards the USBP SOG team. USBP SOG immediately discontinued the foot pursuit and began to return to the Edith Green Federal Building as they were being pursued by a mob of 100 protesters assaulting them with rocks and bottles. In order to move protesters away from the entrance of the Federal Building, USBP SOG deployed (b)(7)(E)

No SOG personnel were injured, one FPS Officer rolled his ankle.

07/08/2020 at 0240 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/8/20 to 7/9/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

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07/08/2020 at 2110 hours PDT (0010 EDT): An individual that has been observed assaulting law enforcement personnel with a laser and destroying federal property (a video surveillance camera) over the last couple of days was seen by the USBP SOG observation team in Lownsdale Square Park. The subject is also responsible for the injuries to HSI Special Agent (19)(6), (19)(7)(0)), whom is currently unable to work due to the injury. SOG recon teams were sent to canvas the federal park area in an attempt to confirm the identity the subject. During this sweep, the recon team positively identified the individual and reported his location back to the command center. The recon team sent a picture of the individual for confirmation and positive ID was established. USBP SOG command formulated a plan to deploy mobile teams comprised of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshals and HSI SRT with FPS support and SOG BORTAC over watch to apprehend the individual. The teams converged on the individual in the northeast corner of Lownsdale Square Park near the corner of 3rd avenue and SW Salmon Street. The subject attempted to flee the area, but what apprehended by the combined units. The subject was escorted back to the Hatfield Courthouse without incident. No less lethal was deployed. Two law enforcement personnel sustained minor injuries during the apprehension, one SOG BORTAC agent and one US Marshal. The subject was asked and stated that he had not sustained any injuries and declined any medical attention.

Subject's name is (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) DOB (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Subject is currently in the custody of the U.S. Marshals Service, FPS will be filing an affidavit in support of criminal complaints.

07/09/2020 at 0055 PDT (0355 EDT): Update on the subject arrested earlier in the evening Subject is a reported missing person, Subject is now in the custody of the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office

07/09/2020 at 0130 PDT (0430 EDT): A white SUV crossover that according to social media posts is a 2018 Kia Sportage with Oregon license plate (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) was driving recklessly through the protesters and throwing out fireworks. The vehicle appeared to crash into the foundation of the Elk statue in Chapman Park. A crowd of protesters converged on the vehicle to confront the occupants. After some arguing, the protesters allowed the vehicle to leave the scene. As the vehicle was leaving, an individual in the vehicle was reported to have fired 5 or 6 shots into the air above the heads of the protesters. No protesters were reported to have been injured. Soon afterwards, social media posts and live streams claimed that the vehicle was still in the general location. SOG BORTAC and FPS deployed mobile teams to canvass the area in a search for the vehicle.

07/09/2020; 0230 PDT (0530 EDT): Situation Update: The mobile teams consisting of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshals, and FPS personnel searched the area with negative results on locating the suspects' vehicle. All law enforcement personnel have returned to the Hatfield

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Courthouse without injury. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. The Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last three nights.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/10/20 to 7/11/20: 1700-0300 hours PDT

07/11/2020 at 0400 hours PDT (0700 EDT): Nothing additional to report. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by SOG personnel. N injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

PATH FORWARD: July 11-12

San Diego Sector SOD will provide agents if necessary for a rotation with SOG personnel in Portland. Final decision pending from FPS.

AMO has been placed on standby for a return flight on either Tuesday (14th) or Wednesday (15th)

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/11/20 to 7/12/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

On July 10, 2020 at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E) . The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) along with Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, I.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

The teams were divided between three locations;



07/11/2020 at 2110 hours PDT (0010 EDT): A subject was told to leave the federal property at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. When he refused, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS deployed to arrest the subject. The subject ran through the park to evade arrest. When law enforcement pursued, the began to be assaulted by the crowd. The primary subject was arrested and well as another subject that assaulted a US Marshal. (b)(7)(E) and was deployed by USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS to push the crowd away from the law enforcement personnel who were being assaulted. The situation is very fluid and updates will follow as details are received.

07/11/2020 at 2330 hours PDT (0230 EDT): All law enforcement personnel are back in their respective buildings. There was an additional arrest of a subject for failure to leave the federal property. The

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protesters are using shields, umbrellas, gas masks and goggles. They continue to engage law enforceme personnel and then retreat into the crowd. This crowd of protesters are much different from the previous night of protesters. They are better organized and more violent. They are much more willing to engage with law enforcement. Protesters were walking a young child between the crowd and the law enforcement personnel. A warning was given to them to depart from federal property and they eventually complied with the request.

07/11/2020 at 2345 hours PDT (0245 EDT): Protesters are crowding the property line for the Hatfield Federal Courthouse and are ignoring multiple warnings. Protester radio traffic stated that they were moving shields and umbrellas forward to ward off CS gas canisters. FPS used a loud speaker to move the crowd back. A USBP SOG recon team reported a sUAS launching location in the park and provided the coordinates to the burnel. Social media is showing video of an individual whom they claim was injured from less lethal munitions. EMS responded and the subject was taken to the hospital. No further information available at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0025 hours PDT (0325 EDT): The crowd of protesters had been repeatedly crossing the property line at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. They were ignoring warnings over the loud speaker to move back from the building. The protesters then began throwing hard objects and shooting fireworks at law enforcement personnel. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS personnel deployed less lethal munitions to include (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) against the crowd of protesters pushing them back into the park across the street from the courthouse. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0155 hours PDT (0455 EDT): A protester was observed defacing the Hatfield Federal Courthouse and another was refusing to leave the federal property. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals and FPS deployed and arrested both individuals. Less lethal munitions were deployed to include and and arrested both individuals. In defiance of the warning, rioters were observed assaulting law enforcement personnel with lasers and by throwing hard objects to include glass bottles. Observation pos teams were able to positively identify one of the subjects deploying the lasers. (b)(7)(E) teams were deployed from the side of the courthouse resulting in an additional two arrests for assault with lasers. The subject that was tagging the building later assaulted law enforcement officers when he threw a beer bottle at them. USBP SOG agents observed the assault and made the arrest. No law enforcement personnel were injured. Two of the three subjects were transported to medical facilities for treatment. No further details on their condition are currently available. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/12/20 to 7/13/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

On July 12, 2020 at 1700 hours PDT (2000 EDT), USBP SOG, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the decision had been made, collectively, by the United States Marshal for the District of Oregon, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), and the FPS Regional Director to reduce the proactive posture by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The Director briefed that the operational posture to be taken would be to seal the courthouse and hold a non-reactive posture to all minor violations without a Law Enforcement response or resolution. The Director advised that Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse would only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

07/13/2020 at 0015 PDT (0315 EDT): Protesters attempted to barricade the front doors of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse with sheets of plywood. They also set-up plywood barriers at the edge of the sidewalk and tied fishing line across the steps of the front of the courthouse. From live stream video, mallets, wrist rockets and tasers have been observed in the crowd. One individual was observed shooting

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the courthouse and the Justice Center with the wrist rocket. Law Enforcement witnessed over 20 individual instances of vandalism to the courthouse throughout the night.

07/13/2020 at 0125 hours PDT (0425 EDT): Violent protesters attempted arson of the courthouse by building a fire with wood from a bonfire they had built in the middle of the street. The protesters were unable to get the plywood protecting the building to light.

07/13/2020 at 0300 PDT (0600 EDT): USBP SOG agents arrested a subject that was identified as having assaulted law enforcement personnel with a laser on a previous evening.

07/13/2020 at 0400 PDT (0700 EDT): USBP SOG mobile units arrested the subject that attempted arson of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse after most of the protesters had left the area.

07/13/2020 at 0430 PDT (0730 EDT): Protesters have dispersed and all USBP SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No less lethal munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/13/20 to 7/14/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

On July 13, 2020 San Diego Sector Special Operations Detachment (SDC/SOD) personnel reported to the Edith Green Federal Building along with key leaders from the USBP SOG element in order take over the mission and provide seamless support to FPS.

At 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), USBP SDC/SOD, SOG BORTAC key leaders, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the Law Enforcement Posture from the previous night, would remain the same. The posture will be reactive only by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will not be reacted to by law enforcement. Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

After the brief, forward deployed SDC/SOD personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E). The SDC/SOD team conducted an operations brief and were deployed at the (b)(7)(E) and the (b)(7)(E) . Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers are deployed between the three Federal buildings. In the SDC/SOD will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

A large crowd, approximately 400-500 protestors, gathered and focused attention at the Portland Police Association (PPA) Building (Non-Federal), located at 1868 N Lombard St, Portland, OR 97209 (Approximately 4 miles away from the Hatfield Courthouse). 50 Portland Police Bureau (PPB) Officers Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer Updated: July 22, 2020, 1000hrs

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were on location and protecting the facility while city workers were boarding up the glass. Situational reporting indicates that the protest is against Police Unions, believed to be protecting Police Officers, and to further the movement to defund police.

7/13/20 at 2345 hours PDT (0245 EDT): Rioters began to assault Portland Police Officers at the Police Association Building with harmful laser pointers and set mattresses on fire to block routes of ingress/egress.

7/14/20 at 0008 hours PDT (0308 EDT): Rioters began assaulting Portland Police Officers and City Workers with rocks and bricks, one of the Officers was struck in the helmet with a large rock. Portland Police maneuvered crowd control elements to disperse the crowd.

7/14/20 at 0011 hours PDT (0311 EDT): PPB declared the demonstration a riot and have begun moving the crowd away from the PPA Building.

7/14/20 at 0025 hours PDT (0325 EDT): PPB continues to be assaulted with hard objects and encounter resistance from the large group of rioters.

7/14/20 at 0100 hours PDT (0400 EDT): PPB continues to push the rioters away from the PPA building. They continue to be assaulted intermittently with objects.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PDT (0500 EDT): PPB pushed the crowd approximately two blocks away from the PPA and are holding ground.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PDT (0500 EDT): The crowd in front of the Hatfield Courthouse remained small and peaceful.

7/14/20 at 0215 hours PDT (0515 EDT): Nothing significant to report at the Federal Facilities. All USBP personnel have been released. No arrests were made. No vandalism reported. No Use of Force incidents.

PATH FORWARD: July 14-15

Portland Team: USBP SOG team will demobilize and return to El Paso, Texas via ground and AMO air.

SDC/SOD will assume mission lead for USBP beginning July 15, 2020.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/14/20 to 7/15/20:

At 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), July 14, 2020, USBP SDC/SOD, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Command that the Law Enforcement reactive posture from the previous nights at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse would remain the same. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will not result in law enforcement action.

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Federal response from the Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

SDC/SOD personnel conducted an operations brief and were deployed as mobile units and to the (b)(7)(E) [. [arease Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers are deployed between the three Federal buildings.[arease U.S. Marshal's Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel are staged at the (b)(7)(E) and [arease Enforcement and Removal (ERO) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel are staged at the (b)(7)(E) [. SDC/SOD will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

7/14/20 at 2030 hours PDT (2330 EDT): Open source reporting indicated that protestors are organizing to arrive in front of the Pioneer Courthouse / Federal U.S. Court of Appeal for the 9th circuit. Field reports indicated that there are currently 15-30 protestors at the Pioneer Courthouse.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PDT (2345 EDT): Open source reporting indicated a group of 300-400 protestors gathered at the Portland City Hall would be relocating to the Pioneer Courthouse. The protestors are moving from the City Hall building and arriving in Pioneer Square located directly in front of the Pioneer Courthouse. Protestors are currently peaceful.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PDT (2345 EDT): FPS deployed for situational awareness. (b)(7)(E) law enforcement are deployed into the crowd at Lownsdale Park in front of the Hatfield Courthouse to observe and gain situational awareness.

07/14/20 at 2100 hours PDT (0000 EDT): Protestors departed from Pioneer Square and relocated to the Justice Center, just north of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protester numbers are 300-400. Protestors remain peaceful.

07/14/20 at 2318 hours PDT (0018 EDT): A subject placed a plywood board with nails pointing up in front of the Hatfield Courthouse Front door in an attempt to prevent law enforcement from exiting the building.**No Law enforcement response was initiated.

07/14/20 at 2320 hours PDT (0220 EDT): Protestors have barricaded several streets, setting up signs to indicate the area is the "Chinook Land Autonomous Territory" "CLOT". Open source reporting indicates the PNW Youth Liberation Front is organizing the occupation.

Portland Police Bureau (PPB) has indicated that they will not allow the protestors to occupy the parks.

PPB advised they intend to clear the park and all barricades before 7:00AM (PST)

07/14/20 at 2330 hours PDT (0230 EDT): A fire was reported in Terry Schrunk Plaza (Federal Property) to the east of the Edith Green Federal Building. FPS Officers investigated and determined it to be a bottle Office: CBP SITROOM- Senior Watch Officer

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full of flammable liquid. FPS extinguished the fire and returned to the Edith Green Building. No arrests or subjects were identified associated to the fire.

07/15/20 at 0020 hours PDT (0320 EDT): Agents at the Edith Green Federal building report that unknown persons are attempting to assault agents and officers within the building with lasers. SDC/SOD is deploying mobile units and (b)(7)(E) agents to attempt to identify the persons committing assaults with lasers. Negative contact was made.

07/15/20 at 0110 hours PDT (0410 EDT): Protestors relocated to block streets around the Justice Center in an attempt to interrupt the shift change of the Portland Police Bureau (PPB).

07/15/20 at 0124 hours PDT (0424 EDT): PPB deployed their crowd control units to push the crowd away from the Justice Center. PPB Officers are being actively assaulted with lasers, hard objects and glass bottles. PPB crowd control units were able to draw the crowd away from the Justice Center. Shift change occurred without further incident.

07/15/20 at 0125 hours PDT (0425 EDT): Two ICE ERO SRT agents were assaulted with a green laser to the eyes at the Edith Green Federal Building. Officers were able to get a description of the subject, the Private Security Officer recorded the assaulter on CCV camera. (b)(7)(E) agents in the area are attempting to locate the subject.

0224 hours PST: (b)(7)(E) agents made Positive Identification of the assaulter. Subject was located walking south on 3^{rd} toward Madison in a small group. Agents will continue to maintain visual until the subject enters an area away from the protestors. SDC/SOD mobile units will attempt to make the arrest once clear.

SDC/SOD observation team has also gained visual of the subject walking in a group. 0236 hours PDT (0536 EDT): SDC/SOD Mobile Units approached the location of the subject and encountered a group of individuals that fled on foot. Two individuals, both matching the description of the assaulter, were detained and transported to the Hatfield Courthouse for positive identification.

- o Neither subject was positively identified as the assaulter, neither had possession of a laser,
- Both subject were identified and released.

07/15/20 at 0130 hours PDT (0330 EDT): Rioters were observed breaking in to a double door underground access point near 3rd and Salmon. Rioters removed unidentified metal material from the access point and are using it to barricade streets. Break in was not on Federal Property. PPB did not respond.

07/15/2020 at 0300 hours PDT (0600 EDT): The crowds were remaining peaceful and all personnel were ordered released by FPS. As FPS and ERO SRT were exiting the Edith Green Federal Building, their vehicles were assaulted with lasers and hard objects. SDC/SOD BORTAC has vehicles remaining at the Edith Green Building and were attempting to re-enter the building. Protestors blocked the ingress route to the parking structure.

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0315 hours PDT (0615 EDT): FPS contacted PPB to provide assistance. PPB advised that they would not be responding.

0325 hours PDT (0625 EDT): ERO SRT returned to assist SDC/SOD re-enter the building to recover their vehicles.

0340 hours PDT (0640 EDT): ERO SRT blocked the street to allow SDC/SOD to re-enter the Edith Green Building, but were unable to hold the street as they were being assaulted with hard objects. Exit was blocked by rioters and law enforcement personnel were not able to depart the area.

0345 hours PDT (0645 EDT): SDC/SOD exited the Edith Green Building on foot and ordered the crowd (approx. 50-75 subjects) to back away from Federal property to allow the vehicles to exit. The crowd refused several orders to depart Federal property. SDC/SOD was assaulted with hard objects. SDC/SOD deployed less lethal and (b)(7)(E) munitions in order to disperse the hostile rioters. SDC/SOD pushed the rioters away from the Edith Green Federal Building but the crowd refused to stay away. SDC/SOD pushed the crowd from the Edith Green Building to the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. SDC/SOD was met at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse by FPS and entered the building.

0400 hours PDT (0700 EDT): SDC/SOD was escorted by FPS and additional agents back to the Edith Green Building to recover their vehicles.

07/15/2020 at 0415 hours PDT (0715 EDT): No other significant incidents to report at the Federal Facilities. No arrests were made and no injuries to law enforcement reported. All USBP personnel have been released.

FPS reports that on four occasions tonight, individuals were witnessed by security camera defacing/vandalizing the Hatfield Courthouse. **No Law Enforcement response.

PATH FORWARD: July 15-16

All USBP SOG personnel will depart Portland, OR on July 15, 2020. will begin travel by GOV, will be transported by AMO via a flight.

SDC/SOD will assume mission lead for USBP beginning July 15, 2020.

FPS will be installing anti-climb fencing around the Hatfield Courthouse. Contract was approved on and install is approx. 5-7 days.

AS1 will conduct a site visit on Thursday 7/16/20 at the Hatfield Courthouse.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/14/20 to 7/15/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

July 15, 2020, at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PST), USBP SDC/SOD, SOG US Marshalls, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Command that the Law Enforcement reactive posture from the previous nights at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse would remain the same. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will not result in law enforcement action.

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Federal response from the Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

PATH FORWARD: July 15-16

Portland Police Bureau advised that they plan to have workers install a fence around Chapman Square and Lownsdale Park at 05:00 AM on July 16, 2020. PPB plans to empty the park and maintain a security presence until the fence is complete.

Teams will arrive back at the Hatfield Courthouse at approximately 1300 hours (PST) to prepare for the arrival and visit of AS1.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/16/20 to 7/17/20:

Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and the City of Portland cleared Lownsdale Square and Chapman Square o all tents and temporary structures that had been occupying the space during the morning of July 16, 2020. Temporary fencing was installed around both squares, both are city property. General Services Administration installed temporary fencing around Terry Schrunk Plaza (TSP), which is Federal property. PPB advised they intend to have officers present in both squares in order to prevent any destruction or unauthorized removal of the fencing. FPS will also have officers present in TSP to prevent the destruction of or removal of fencing and to prevent trespassing onto Federal property.

DHS Acting Secretary Wolf (AS1) visited the Hatfield Courthouse and met with leadership from FPS, US Marshals Office, FBI, HSI, CBP, and ICE. AS1 met with Federal personnel that have been conducting operations in Portland in order to protect Federal facilities and property. AS1 held a press conference with select media. AS1 departed the Hatfield Courthouse at approximately 1800 hours (PDT)

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At 1700 PDT, July 16, 2020, USBP SDC SOD, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the Law Enforcement Posture from the previous nights, at the Hatfield Courthouse, would remain the same. The posture will be reactive only by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will be allowed. Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points. The posture will be more proactive in TSP in order to prevent destruction or removal of fencing.

Agitators are continuing to attempt to initiate hostile actions from the protestors through social media. Certain actors are targeting Federal agents and officers and are attempting to initiate hostile actions against Federal agents.

07/16/2020 at 2245 hours PST: Open source reporting indicates that protesters have taken the fence from the area of Lownsdale park, near the intersection of 4th Avenue and Salmon Street and used it as a barricade to block the street. PPB responded with a rapid response/crowd control unit and has repaired/secured the fence. PPB issued a warning to protesters that if they attempt to relocate or damage the fence, they will be subject to arrest. PPB has returned to their previous positions.

07/16/2020 at 2302 hours PST: Portland Police reported being struck with hard objects and glass bottles near the intersection of 4th Avenue and Madison Street. FPS Officers, located in TPS, identified one of the assaulting subjects and deployed less lethal munitions against the assaulters to protect PPB.

07/16/2020 at 2325 hours PST: BORTAC supported FPS Officers to removed protesters trespassing on federal property at the Edith Green Federal Building. While attempting to remove protesters, agents were assaulted with frozen water bottles, hard objects and a flaming object. Less lethal munitions were deployed.

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07/17/2020 at 0000 hours PST: PPB reported that a vehicle rushed their line at the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office/ Portland Police Bureau South Precinct at a high rate of speed. PPB was forced to T-bone the suspect vehicle in order to stop the vehicle from colliding into officers.

07/17/2020 at 0002 hours PST: BORTAC and FPS Officers returned to the Hatfield Courthouse.

07/17/2020 at 0026 hours PST: Northwest perimeter fence at Lownsdale Square has been removed by protesters and is being utilized as a barricade at 4th and Main.

07/17/2020 at 0126 hours PST: Protesters began to breach the TSP fence (federal property) across from the Edith Green Building. FPS and BORTAC pushed the protesters from the federal property where the breach occurred. No arrests were made.

07/17/2020 at 0201 hours PST: Breach temporarily fixed. BORTAC returned back to Edith Green Building.

07/17/2020 at 0248 hours PST: No additional significant incidents to report at the Federal Facilities. No arrest were made. All USBP personnel have been released.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/17/20 to 7/18/20:

At 1700 PST, July 17, 2020, USBP SDC/SOD, SOG US Marshals, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders attended a briefing at the Edith Green Federal Building. Law Enforcement personnel will be deployed at the <u>(b)(7)(E)</u> and <u>(b)(7)(E)</u>. The posture will be reactive only by teams. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will not solicit a law enforcement response. Federal enforcement action from the Federal buildings will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points. SDC/SOD will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

07/17/2020 at 2100 hours PST: Approximately 200 protesters are gathered in the downtown area (Lownsdale Square, Chapman Square and Terry Schrunk Plaza(TSP)).

07/17/2020 at 2102 hours PST: A section of perimeter fence around TSP that the city of Portland installed was taken down by the protesters.

07/17/2020 at 2136 hours PST: Federal agents (ERO SRT) positioned inside the (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) were assaulted by a green laser that is being directed at law enforcement's eyes and face.

07/17/2020 at 2200 hours PST: SDC/SOD supported the FPS Team in removing fencing that was placed at the entry/exits of Edith Green building. This fencing was used in an attempt to barricade law

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enforcement in the building. While clearing the entry/exits Federal agents were assaulted by green lasers being directed in their eyes and face.

07/17/2020 at 2211 hours PST: Violent subjects began to assault Federal Law Enforcement personnel by shining harmful lasers into officers / agent's eyes and face. Law Enforcement personnel were attempting to clear the exits of the Edith Green building and protesters refused to leave despite multiple warnings that they were trespassing. Protesters refused to leave federal property and continued to assault Federal Law Enforcement personnel with harmful lasers. Less lethal (b)(7)(E) munitions were deployed by teams. Spent less lethal munitions casing were recovered by the violent protesters and thrown at the agents.

07/17/2020 at 2218 hours PST: Law enforcement teams returned into (b)(7)(E). One subject was arrested by FPS and cited for failure to comply.

07/17/2020 at 2240 hours PST: Portland Police Bureau (PPB) broadcasted over their service radio frequency that protesters might set up booby traps in front of the entry/exits buildings and threatened to kill officers.

07/17/2020 at 2249 hours PST: Aerial fireworks being deployed in downtown area.

07/17/2020 at 2255 hours PST: The number of protesters has increased to approximately 800.

07/17/2020 at 2333 hours PST: The Subject arrested by FPS is identified as (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and charged with 41 CFR 102-74.385 (Failure to comply).

07/17/2020 at 2357 hours PST: Protesters attempted to barricade the Hatfield Courthouse by stacking up city chain link fence panels in the entry/exits points. SOG US Marshals deployed (b)(7)(E) munitions to

07/18/2020 at 0019 hours PST: Protesters left Hatfield Courthouse carrying additional chain link fencing towards Edith Green. Protesters barricaded an entry/exit at Edith Green with chain link fencing and deployed large fireworks near the entry/exit in an apparent attempt to burn the building.

07/18/2020 at 0039 hours PST: Protesters barricaded an entry/exit at the Justice Center with chain link fencing and deployed large fireworks near the entry/exit in an apparent attempt to burn the building.

07/18/2020 at 0131 hours PST: PPB made an "Unlawful Assembly Announcement" to the crowd and stated that they had 5 minutes to clear the area.

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07/18/2020 at 0139 hours PST: All Federal teams with PPB began to disperse the protesters from the downtown area. While attempting to disperse the crowd, agents were assaulted with glass bottles, hard objects, multiple large fireworks and lasers. Less lethal munitions were deployed to stop the violent attack and protect other law enforcement personnel.

07/18/2020 at 0214 hours PST: Federal teams were able to disperse the crowd, removed barricades from the Federal buildings and returned back inside the Federal buildings. PPB continued to move the protesters away from the downtown area.

07/18/2020 at 0230 hours PST: PPB was able to disperse the protesters and moved the crowd approximately 8 city blocks. The Downtown area currently is clear of protesters.

07/18/2020 at 0309 hours PST: No additional significant incidents to report at the Federal Facilities. No additional arrest were made. All USBP personnel have been released.

*During the dispersal of the crowd at approximately 0139-0214, a USBP agent was struck on his right leg (above the knee) with a hard object. The injury did not require medical attention. (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E)

Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum is to provide guidance for direct support to the Federal Protective Service and our interagency partners to protect all federal facilities and property.

Introduction: The Department plays a key role in protecting Federal facilities and property primarily through the Federal Protective Service (FPS) and in partnership with other DHS law enforcement Components, interagency partners, and state and local partners. Recently, we have seen numerous instigators, criminals and other bad actors use peaceful protests to harm people and property, both Federal and private. For the past month, these bad actors have continued their unlawful activity which has resulted in numerous threats, disruption, and damage to Federal facilities and property.

Background: On June 26, the President issued the following Executive Order: Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, the President directed that DHS "shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property."

In furtherance of this directive, I have formalized the DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT) to provide an ongoing assessment of potential civil unrest and property destruction and to address internal resource allocation and potential surge activity to ensure the continuing protection of people and property.

Additionally, with the consent of other Departments and Agencies, I have determined that it is in the public interest and fiscally sound for FPS to partner with other federal law enforcement to execute the direction of the President. To that end, DHS began coordination with the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of the Interior (DOI) to establish information/intelligence sharing and resource coordination as outlined in the order.

Action: The upcoming July 4th holiday weekend has the potential for increased distruptive activity at specific locations across the country that could threaten our personnel and the Federal facilities and property they protect. DHS will be forward leaning in preparing to protect Federal facilities and property.

Components with law enforcement personnel will coordinate with the Office of Operations Coordination and the FPS to:

DHS' Office of Operations Coordination will continue to facilitate Department-level information sharing, reporting, and all other supporting actions across the Components and with our DOJ/DOI partners. FPS will continue to serve as the Department's lead for the protection of Federal facilities and property and shall be supported by Operational Components and all other DHS organizations.

Components should use existing guiding principles and risk assessments in support of this mission, ensuring the safety and security of our personnel.



Narrative: Information was received on June 10, 2020 from the **(b)(7)(E)** (b)(7)(E) regarding possible planned protest at the San Luis Port of Entry for June 11, 2020 (document attached). These protests have been an ongoing series of demonstrations against police brutality and racism in policing. Through (b)(7)(E) and other sources there is a possibility of an attempt to disrupt port operations traffic at the San Luis Port of Entry. The Port of San Luis has formulated the following plan of action.

PORT SECURITY:

Operational security is a CBP responsibility. San Luis Port officials will ensure that security is planned and executed during every phase of the event and that all managers are aware of procedures. Primary objectives include ensuring control of information and preventing protesters from planning and conducting operations against CBP.



Sir – Good morning. Please find attached key developments over the past 24 hours regarding civil unrest and associated violence/vandalism.

BLUF: Except for Portland, OR, protest activities were small and generally peaceful on 30 Jun. There were no reports of attempts to remove any memorials, and no reported significant impacts to federal facilities. National Guard Bureau (NGB) state activations for civil disturbance support continue in seven states and DC, with (b)(7)(E) total activated personnel as of 30 Jun, down from a peak of (b)(7)(E) in 34 states on 7 Jun.

DHS actions completed yesterday:

1. Two OPSDEP calls held yesterday with components. Finalized deployments by location and component. Attained C2 and info-sharing protocol agreement amongst all components. 2. FPS held 2 cross designation training sessions with DHS LE components. Approximately DHS LEOs underwent 1 hr online training for cross-designation by FPS. 2 more training sessions planned for today and 2 more training sessions planned for tomorrow.

3.Received overnight requirement from DOI/NPS for by DHS LEOs to augment park security at the Gettysburg National Battlefield on July 4th. DOI indicated they are willing to fund the deployment.

DHS actions planned for today:

1.OPSDEP call planned for 1130 to discuss sourcing solution to the DOI request for DHS LEOs. 2.FPS to coordinate between the US Park Police and DHS LE components to ensure DHS LEOs are cross-designated by USPP to provide support on DOI land (Our LEOs supporting DOI would be dual cross-designated by both FPS and USPP).

3.Continue FPS cross-designation training (2 sessions) and commence cross-designation by USPP. 4.Info-sharing coordination call planned for 1030 with DOI and DOJ.

DESIGNATION OF 40 U.S.C. § 1315 LAW ENFORCEMENT FOR UNITED STATES CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION PERSONNEL

With the consent of the Acting Commissioner of the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), and pursuant to my delegated authorities from the Under Secretary of Management, as memorialized in DHS Delegation No. 02500 § II(D) (Dec. 18, 2019) and Title 40, United States Code, Section 1315(b)(1), I designate you as a law enforcement officer for duty in connection with your support of the Federal Protective Service (FPS) in the protection of federal property and persons on the impacted federal property that are under FPS's protection responsibility.

This designation is limited to law enforcement functions on the federal property assigned to you by FPS. This designation expires 60 days from the date of my signature.

While engaged in the performance of official duties, you have the authority to use the following police powers:

"You are authorized to conduct investigations; require and receive information relating to offenses; serve and execute search and arrest warrants; serve subpoenas and summons; administer oaths; make arrests without warrant; take actions to preserve the peace while protecting federal government facilities and personnel; bear firearms; and perform other activities for the promotion of Homeland Security in accordance with Title 40 United States Code Section 1315 as created by the Homeland Security Act of 2002."

Prior to utilizing this authority, you are required to receive legal briefings provided by FPS legal advisors on 40 U.S.C. § 1315 authorities and jurisdiction, to include relevant criminal statutory and regulatory provisions enforceable on the federal property.

Executive Summary:

On June 26, the President issued an Executive Order Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, he directed that DHS "shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property."

The DHS Acting Secretary, Chad F. Wolf, issued a memorandum, "DHS Support to Protect Federal Facilities and Property through July 4th Holiday Weekend," directing that three Civil Disturbance Units (CDU) be deployed, one each to Portland, OR; Seattle, WA; and the District of Columbia, no later than 2 July to be used in a reserve force role. He further directed that within QRF CDUs be established and placed on standby to be used as a strategic reserve that can be deployed within hours of notification by the Department. QRFs are to be established by 2 July.

EXECUTION

From July 2nd through July 6th, 2020, <u>**CBP will provide**</u> trained and equipped personnel to support FPS in Portland, OR, Seattle, WA, and Washington, DC, through the July 4th holiday weekend in order to protect federal facilities and property.

<u>Portland, OR (pax)</u>: USBP SOG will deploy agents (b)(7)(E) from El Paso, TX to Portland, OR via GOV in order to arrive and be ready to support FPS by 02 July Deployed via ground 6/30/20 Washington, DC (pax): OFO SRT will provide SRT Officers as a (b)(7)(E) within Washington, DC.

<u>Seattle, WA (manupart</u>) OFO SRT will provide (b)(7)(E) SRT Officers from the Seattle, WA area to support FPS in Seattle, WA. USBP will provide agents from the Blaine, WA Sector (BLW) and agents from the Spokane, WA Sector, (SPW) to support FPS in the Seattle, WA area.

Standby (pax): USBP SOG will maintain agents on standby in El Paso, TX as a QRF, able to deploy to any location within the continental United States (CONUS) within hours of notification via AMO flight(s).

AMO will stage (b)(7)(E) aircraft and necessary flight crews in Corpus Christie, TX, on standby, to provide air transport to the USBP SOG QRF in El Paso, TX to a location TBD. Estimated flight time from Corpus Christie, TX to El Paso, TX is and hours.

TRAINING

All agents and officers will complete FPS cross designation and appropriate OCC training prior to 2 July.

FPS established a one-hour web based training program for the required 40 USC 1315 cross-designation All CBP personnel identified to support FPS in Portland, Seattle, Washington D.C., and the Standby team have, or are in the process, of completing the web based training.

An additional CBP personnel have already completed the FPS cross designation training in June as part of previous efforts.

FPS Training and Professional Development Directorate and OGS/FPS Attorney Advisors are available during the training sessions to answer any questions CBP personnel have.

FPS, with the consent of Acting Commissioner Morgan, issued a cross designation letter of 40 USC 1315 law enforcement authority for CBP (attached).

OCC is coordination and providing 4th amendment and use of force refresher training to all CBP personnel supporting FPS (same as they did for the NCR response in June)

BLUF: Except for Portland, OR, protest activities were small and generally peaceful on 30 Jun. There were no reports of attempts to remove any memorials, and no reported significant impacts to federal facilities. National Guard Bureau (NGB) state activations for civil disturbance support continue in seven states and DC, with (b)(7)(E) total activated personnel as of 30 Jun, down from a peak of (b)(7)(E) in 34 states on 7 Jun.

DHS actions completed yesterday:

*Two OPSDEP calls held yesterday with components. Finalized deployments by location and component. Attained C2 and info-sharing protocol agreement amongst all components. *FPS held 2 cross designation training sessions with DHS LE components. Approximately with DHS LEOs underwent 1 hr online training for cross-designation by FPS. 2 more training sessions planned for today and 2 more training sessions planned for tomorrow.

*Received overnight requirement from DOI/NPS for DHS LEOs to augment park security at the Gettysburg National Battlefield on July 4th. DOI indicated they are willing to fund the deployment.

DHS actions planned for today:

*OPSDEP call planned for 1130 to discuss sourcing solution to the DOI request for DHS LEOs. *FPS to coordinate between the US Park Police and DHS LE components to ensure DHS LEOs are cross-designated by USPP to provide support on DOI land (Our LEOs supporting DOI would be dual cross-designated by both FPS and USPP).

*Continue FPS cross-designation training (2 sessions) and commence cross-designation by USPP. *Info-sharing coordination call planned for 1030 with DOI and DOJ.

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

MILWAUKEE, WI – Milwaukee Police Chief Alfonso Morales warned at a news conference on Friday that officers are being followed home and police families are now being targeted.

He made the comments during the announcement of a federal arrest made in the last week, and got heated when talking about the rising threat officers face on the job. He shall lie city-needs to do a better job at taking care of police. \equiv Menu

"I'm angry because a political figure approached me yesterday and said the rumor amongst us in the political group, here in the City of Milwaukee, we're told that that officer shot himself.

There was a person in an auto that fired three shots at that officer. I'm angry because we're not being believed that a police officer was shot," Morales said.

He reiterated the rising threat.

"PEOPLE ARE TRYING TO KILL POLICE OFFICERS. We have officers that are being followed home, the Madison sheriff had his house surrounded. Why are our families, why are our families now being targeted? You talk about crucify, what are we going to get by doing that? That has to stop."

He said the media and others are quick to point a finger at every cop.

"Something happens in another city, another state, and it's very, very easy to jump on the bandwagon and say Milwaukee can do better. Shame on those, that's an easy narrative, it's a very easy narrative to jump on," Morales said.

Then he talked about how the mob mentality is to blame.

"2 Las ago, an angry mob came before people to say, 'Crucify that man', that man being Jesus Christ. What are angry mobs doing today? We say we're civilized, but are we really?

Let's think about that — and that includes you, media – you play a big role in changing the perceptions that are out there." he added.

When the media asked who he was saying was crucified by an angry mob, Morales said police officers.

"Law enforcement throughout our nation is being crucified. That's what they want, that's what these angry mobs are doing. There's several different types of groups out there protesting.

There's peaceful protesters that are angry for what happened in Minnesota and we get that, we'll work with that," he said, "but there's also people taking advantage to loot our cities, to burn our cities, and make no mistake, throughout the nation, there's individuals or groups out there that want to burn a police station down. That is not going to fix anything."

Of course Democrat State Senator Lena Taylor decided to attack the police chief.

"He's upset about police being crucified, no, what happened instead is Mr. Floyd was suffocated with somebody's knee," said State Senator Lena Taylor. Ta Lee, ent on to warp Biblical scripture to fit her agenda.

WSB reported that the first incident occurred outside a home in Duluth sometime after 10 p.m.

That's when a 911 call came in that a Gwinnett County Police Department car was on fire at that location. The flames had been put out by the time responding officers arrived.

WXIA reported that according to witnesses, three black males were spotted running away from the scene.

Not long after, according to WSB, a second 911 call came in that someone tried to set a patrol car on fire in Lawrenceville.

When police got there, they found a fire on the ground behind the patrol vehicle and put it out with a fire extinguisher.

WXIA says the vehicle was also dented and that witnesses saw a dark-colored car take off shortly after the attack.

"We're very lucky that they were unsuccessful in starting any fires to our police cars that could cause any significant damage," Gwinnett Police Department Corporal Michele Pihera said.

According to the Gwinnett Daily Post, Lawrenceville police found that vehicle and arrested Alvin Joseph, 21. Turns out just days be $\exists \dots, \exists u \$ had been arrested at a protest at Sugarloaf Mills in \equiv Menu Lawrenceville.

Police had to use a Taser to subdue him... and he was released hours later.

In the back of the car after those attacks, police also found and arrested Lakaila Mack, 20.

Hours later they caught a third suspect, 21-year-old Ebuka Chike-Morah.

That bust came by investigators from the Gwinnett Arson Unit, the Gwinnett Police Department, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

Police said they were able to secure a search warrant on Chike-Morah's vehicle along with the car Joseph was driving.

They said they found more accelerant that matched items used for the Molotov cocktails inside one of their cars – that's according to the Gwinnett Daily Post.

Now for the charges:

Joseph – Possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, interference with government property, and two counts each of possession of

to $L \square$ the commission of a crime, criminal trespass, possession and manufacturing a destructive device, and first-degree arson.

Chike–Morah and Mack – Two counts each of interference with government property, possession of tools for the commission of a crime, criminal trespass, possession and manufacturing a destructive device, and first–degree arson.

These weren't the only attacks.

Police say the windows of a third patrol vehicle parked outside another officer's residence near Lawrenceville were smashed in earlier in the week.

It wasn't connected to the firebombing attacks.

Then in Gainesville, in a seemingly unrelated incident, a patrol vehicle was torched outside an officer's home and six other Gainesville police cars were damaged during riots in that area.

That's according to the Atlanta Journal-Constitution.

Gainesville police posted about the damage on social media:

"As representatives of our community and as your police agency, we want to share with you details regarding the events and challenges that we have been facing this past week.

Not only are officers having to deal with the dangers of their daily duties such as having rocks, bottles and fireworks thrown at them, now they are dealing with attacks at their own homes.

Just prior to this, a female officer received medical treatment after being attacked by a man wielding a sharp weapon. The officer sustained injuries to her head.

Sadly, this has been our reality the past few days. We say all of this to let you know that we are proud to serve our community. It came from the Boston field office of the FBI about law enforcement being targeted at their homes.

The warning was sent out in an Internal Document obtained by ABC 5.

It says that the F.B.I. had "received credible intelligence that rioters are looking for officers' home addresses via public records."

The report comes on the heels of two men being charged with criminal trespassing. This, after they were found in the backyard of a Chicago Police officer with a gasoline can.

It happened Monday night to a Chicago Police Captain – although the men claimed they had simply run out of gas.

According to CBS Chicago, there is no evidence that the captain was specifically targeted ... but the men had a gasoline can and a lighter on them when they were arrested

And in Tucson, Arizona, the Tucson Police Officers Association reported that one of their members was targeted at his home this $_{\sim}$ week.



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In the Facebook Post, they stated the following:

"Last night one of our members had his home and personally owned vehicle vandalized. He does not take a police car home. He do the ine flag or any pro cop stickers. The only way to explain this damage was that he was targeted. Targeted for the job he does. Targeted because he answered the call to serve his community."


The Association continued:

"This is unacceptable. How does something like this further the discussion that our country so desperately needs to have? How does scaring the family of a police officer help to improve relationships?"

"For the better part of two weeks police officers all over this country have been targeted because of the uniform they wear. Officers have been shot and killed, stabbed and ran over by vehicles. Sadly, these types of incidents are doing nothing to help the country heal. This must stop. We can do better."

Since the original article dropped, we've received dozens of messages from police officers across the country reporting similar situations.

As a result, Law enforcement officials from across the country have reached out to Law Enforcement Today asking us to warn police across America about the potential threat.

Many of the officers we've spoken with have reported that their departments have made internal changes over the past few days to ensure both the on-duty and off-duty safety of their officers.

Transparently – our team debated internally whether or not to cover this story. We are America's largest law enforcement owned and operated media outlet, and we are unapologetically pro-police.

Al in the don't hesitate to call out and provide media coverage of Menu bau appres, our priority is in giving the voice to law enforcement that they're often denied in the mainstream media.

The last thing we want to do is put officers at risk by giving bad people ideas.

But soon after this threat started spreading like wildfire online, we had law enforcement from across the country reach out. They pointed out that the threat is already circulating.

Many have asked us to address it so that departments are aware of it and can take precautions to make changes, if they deem it necessary – especially given how quickly it's circulating.

They made a valid point – it's better to be aware of a potential danger and take precautions than to not know about it because of a national breakdown in communication.

It's worth noting that we have NOT received any confirmation of this from the FBI. With that said, a number of agencies have confirmed for us off the record that they're aware of it and are making internal changes. We've been asked for obvious reasons to not report which agencies they are.

In the of different communities in states ranging from \equiv Menu Camornia and Texas to Florida – reports have come in that small groups of individuals appear to be canvassing neighborhoods and taking pictures of homes that have police cruisers in the driveways.

"I can absolutely confirm this," told us one police spokesman, who asked that his department be kept anonymous because of the threats. "We've received multiple reports throughout the weekend both in terms of phone calls and alerts that neighborhood residents are putting out on community watch apps."

It comes as police are receiving direct, personal threats through social media, calls and emails.

"We and our children are receiving threats," one police lieutenant told Law Enforcement Today.

The departments we spoke with said that they're currently making policy changes so that take-home police cruisers are either garaged or – for now – left at the police departments.

"We expect danger when on the job," said one sergeant. "But this is different. They are threatening to burn down our homes and kill our families."

Of the lave also told us that they're instructing officers to make Menu other changes, such as making sure uniforms aren't hanging in personal vehicles while driving into work.

"Effective starting this past weekend, no police vehicles – including unmarked vehicles – will be brought up," one Captain told Law Enforcement Today. "This isn't to punish our guys – it's to protect them and their families."

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Sir – Good morning. Please find attached key DHS developments over the past 24 hours regarding civil unrest and associated violence/vandalism. A detailed timeline surrounding events in Portland, OR from last night and this morning is at the end of this email.

BLUF: Large protests began in the early evening on July 4th in Portland, OR and turned violent late in the night, lasting until early morning where at least five arrests overnight were made for damaging government property and assaulting federal officers. In Seattle, WA, the Washington State Patrol is holding a driver for a purposeful act of striking two protesters with a vehicle. Numerous protests were held around the country with most being peaceful. Some demonstrations did turn violent or cause property damage. Significant incidents are reported in the attached document. Additionally, there is an attached graphic showing the major concentration of deployed or standby DHS forces. This graphic <u>is not</u> all-inclusive. Currently, there are <u>large</u>. National Guard personnel deployed across 10 states and DC for civil disturbance support.

DHS actions completed 04 July:

• Conducted coordination call to respond to FPS request for reinforcements to Portland, OR to arrive by the evening of 04 July.

OLaunched the USBP strategic Rapid Deployment Team (RDT) from El Paso, TX.

DHS actions planned for today:

• 1030 EDT DOI/DOJ/DHS information sharing coordination call. Continue collaboration on the virtual EOC with the other Departments and Agencies.

- Staff the (b)(7)(E) upon activation today.
- Remain vigilant and flexible to respond to threats or requests for interagency assistance.

Portland, OR Disturbance Timeline from evening of July 4th : (Preliminary information / Data could change as additional facts become known / All times are approximate and in Eastern Daylight Savings Time (EDT) / Information is for situational awareness purposes only and is not considered "official". Times are "as reported by" OPCENs)

• At 2337 EDT, FPS Denver MegaCenter reported in Portland, OR, there were approximately 200 demonstrators in the area of the Justice Center and the Hatfield Courthouse at 1000 Southwest 3rd Avenue that were generally peaceful.

• At 0054 EDT 05 July, protestors were shooting fireworks at the building on the west side and on the front steps.

• At 0110 EDT, several hundred demonstrators gathered in Chapman and Lownsdale Square. Portland police declared a riot due to the gathering near the U.S. District Courthouse and the Multnomah County Justice Center.

• At 0111 EDT, approximately 750 protestors were in the park.

• At 0112 EDT, there was a subject in front of the courthouse yelling and attempting to smash the plywood boards.

• At 0124 EDT, a subject crawled up the building to spray paint a camera and knocked the camera down.

• At 0141 EDT, the USBP RDT team utilized (b)(7)(E) to arrest the subjects tampering with the camera. The subjects were handed over to the U.S. Marshals.

• At 0202 EDT, violent protesters are throwing rocks and shooting fireworks M60 mortars at the courthouse. Protesters broke the plate glass above the courthouse doors and are throwing paint and mace inside the courthouse. No injuries to law enforcement personnel reported.

• At 0203 EDT, FPS Denver MegaCenter reported at least 1,000 protestors in the area. The protestors are throwing rocks and balloons filled with paint at the glass to the building.

• At 0205 EDT, units are going to try to push the protestors away from the building.

· At 0240 EDT, a vehicle tried to run over a Portland Police Officer.

• At 0310 EDT, violent protesters are using frozen water bottles, paint, large rocks, bottle rockets/large fireworks, green laser pointers and M60 firework mortars to assault law enforcement personnel. USBP RDT personnel have been struck by these items, but no significant injuries have been reported.

 At 0328 EDT, USBP RDT personnel have reassumed their defensive positions as Portland PD has vacated the area.

• At 0345 EDT, Violent protesters continue to attack law enforcement and USBP RDT members had another exchange with the protesters as they attempted to get within close distance of the building and law enforcement personnel. USBP RDT was forced to use to disperse the crowd.

• At 0409 EDT, FPS Denver MegaCenter reported protestors are setting fire to the pioneer statue in Pioneer Square Park (indications are a State-owned statue)

• At 0413 EDT, there was a subject with two Samurai swords in the area.

• At 0416 EDT, there was a group of 250-300 protestors carrying fuel and materials to the front of the Hatfield Courthouse to start a fire.

• At 0430 EDT, there was another fire at the corner of Lownsdale Square Park and there were protestors that had lasers and were pointing them at Inspectors.

• At 0437 EDT, protestors were trying to shoot fireworks into the lobby.

At 0445 EDT, protesters tossed a large explosive device into the courthouse foyer where the USBP RDT was staged. USBP RDT exited the courthouse and dispersed the protesters off of the federal park property using (b)(7)(E) munitions. The protesters continued to actively assault USBP RDT personnel with bottle rockets and mortar style fireworks as they retreated off of the federal property.

• At 0535 EDT, USBP RDT arrested two subjects. One subject was deploying harmful lasers directly into the face of USBP RDT operators. The other subject assaulted USBP RDT operators with a shield as they arrested the subject with the laser. Both are currently in custody of the FPS.

• At 0632 EDT, (b)(7)(E) from Elizabeth City NC to Salem, OR landed with USMS SOG team.

• At 0707 EDT, FPS advised that there are demonstrators in the park area that were throwing fireworks and trying to start a fire.

• At 0710 EDT, FPS advised that rocks were being thrown at the front of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protestors are pointing lasers at the Inspectors and a subject being detained has a machete.

At 0715 EDT, FPS Officers made several announcements directing the protesters to vacate the federal
property directly in front of the courthouse doors or they would be arrested for trespassing. FPS
personnel then directed USBP RDT personnel to arrest any subject that was refusing the lawful order to
leave the federal property. As USBP RDT personnel came out of the courthouse to make arrests, an
individual shined a harmful laser directly into the faces of USBP RDT personnel. USBP RDT was able to
take the subject into custody and arrested him for assault. A subsequent search of the subject revealed a
pipe bomb, a fused explosive device, a machete and a buck knife.

• At 0724 EDT, FPS advised that the subject in custody appears to have a pipe bomb.

• At 0727 EDT, received FBI update courtesy of the FBI Dep Director. (Below is verbatim as reported by FBI officials to the FBI Dep Director and forwarded to DHS)

OPretty successful night for us. Our main value was the planning and command and control assistance to FPS, which helped improve agility, integrate ops team efforts, gather evidence and nail down charging decisions.

Osix arrests by DHS units which will lead to federal charges including depredation of federal property, misdemeanor AFO and interfering. Approximately 15 local arrests, five of which we will federalize (green laser targeting surveillance aircraft).

OLots of credit to DHS units and PPB. They surged assets and we had the initiative all night, although one window was broken at the courthouse.

○We expect a quieter night tonight and there won't be as many assets. There should still be plenty to defend the courthouse.

OQuick update to the update. Two more misdemeanor AFO arrests (green lasers at operator's eyes). We are mopping up and closing down.

• At 0845 EDT, Protesters have dispersed and all USBP RDT members have cleared the scene. No injuries reported by the team.

 Conclusion: The situation in Portland remains fluid and details continue to emerge. With the arrival of the (b)(7)(E) and last night's arrests, officials believe they are well postured going into the evening of 5 July. Across the country, DHS forces will maintain an enhanced posture throughout today.

DHS Response to Civil Disturbances

Situational Overview

Large protests began in the early evening on July 4th in Portland. OR and turned violent late in the night, lasting until early morning where at least five arrests overnight were made for damaging government property and assaulting federal officers. In Seattle, WA, the Washington State Patrol is holding a driver for a purposeful act of striking two protesters with a vehicle. Numerous protests were held around the country with most being peaceful. Some demonstrations did turn violent or cause property damage. Significant incidents are reported below. Currently there are National Guard personnel deployed across 10 states and DC for civil disturbance support.

Locations of Interest

- Portland, OR: At 0855 EDT on 4 Jul, USBP RDT personnel moved inside the Federal Courthouse building which was attacked on 3 Jul, leading to a riot declaration. The Portland Police Department assumed outside security.
 - At 1740 EDT 4 Jul, FPS reports approximately 2,000 BLM demonstrators across the street from the Pioneer Courthouse in Pioneer Courthouse Square. Approximately 15-20 protestors were participating in a motorcycle/bicycle blockade impeded traffic. Portland Police and FPS were aware of the protest. FPS is initiating a (b)(7)(E)
 (b)(7)(E)
 (Megacenter 1741 EDT 4 Jul).
 - At 2241 EDT, USBP RDT arrested three subjects that were spray painting the courthouse CCTV cameras. The USBP RDT utilized a (b)(7)(E) during the arrest. The subjects were handed over to the U.S. Marshals. (FPS LEOPS vEOC 0222, 5 Jul).
 - At 2302 EDT, violent protesters were throwing rocks and shooting fireworks at the courthouse. Protesters broke the plate glass above the courthouse doors and were throwing paint and mace inside the courthouse. (SITROOM 0308 EDT 5 Jul).
 - At 0110 EDT 5 Jul, several hundred demonstrators gathered in Chapman and Lownsdale Square. Portland police declared a riot due to the gathering near the U.S. District Courthouse and the Multhomah County Justice Center. (MMC 0226, 5 Jul).
 - At 0140 EDT. (b)(7)(E) Gatherers were ordered to
 vacate the area to the west, and police warned (b)(7)(E)
 (MMC 0226, 5 Jul).
 - At 0203 EDT, FPS Regional Director advised that there are at least 1,000 protestors. Inspectors advise that protestors are throwing rocks, and balloons filled with paint at the glass to the building. At approximately 0240 EDT, FPS Inspector advised that a vehicle tried to run over a Portland Police Officer. (FPS 0244 EDT 5 Jul)
 - At 0310 EDT violent protesters are using frozen water bottles, paint, large rocks, bottle rockets/large fireworks, green laser pointers and M60 firework mortars to assault law enforcement personnel. USBP RDT personnel have been struck by these items, but no signification injuries have been reported. (CBP SITROOM 0636 EDT)
 - At 0328 EDT USBP RDT personnel reassumed their defensive positions as Portland PD has vacated the area. (CBP SITROOM 0636 EDT)
 - At 0345 EDT Violent protesters continue to attack law enforcement and USBP RDT team members had another exchange with the protesters as they attempted to get within close



distance of the building and law enforcement personnel. USBP RDT (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) (CBP SITROOM 0636 EDT)

- At 0409 EDT, FPS reports protestors were setting fire to the pioneer statue (state owned) in Pioneer Square Park. A group of 250-300 protestors carrying fuel and materials headed to the front of the Hatfield Courthouse to start a fire. One individual was seen with two Samurai swords in the area. Another fire was started at the corner of Lownsdale Square Park. (Megacenter 0442 EDT, 5 Jul)
- a At 0445 EDT, Protesters tossed a large explosive device into the courthouse foyer where the USBP RDT was staged. USBP RDT exited the courthouse and dispersed the protesters off the federal park property using CS canisters, area saturation and direct impact munitions. The protesters continued to actively assault USBP RDT personnel with bottle rockets and mortar style fireworks as they retreated off the federal property. (CBP SITROOM 0636 EDT)
- At 0535 EDT, USBP RDT arrested two subjects. One subject was deploying harmful DPSS lasers directly into the face of USBP RDT Operators. The other subject assaulted USBP RDT operators with a shield as they arrested the subject with the laser. Both are currently in custody of the FPS. (CBP SITROOM 0636 EDT)
- At 0723 EDT, there were demonstrators in the park area that were throwing fireworks and trying to start a fire. Rocks were being thrown at the front of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protestors are pointing tasers at the Inspectors and a subject has been detained with a machete. The subject in custody appears to have a pipe bomb. (Denver Megacenter 0733 EDT)

Atlanta, GA:

- At approximately 1400 EDT, hundreds of protesters dressed in black armed with assault rifles marched towards Stone Mountain demanding the carving of Confederate figures on the side of the mountain be removed. Stone Mountain Park Police (SMPP) and workers with the Park's Public Safety Division said they had no issues with the group coming in to exercise their right to free speech. The protesters entered the park from the West Gate, proceeded to the lawn area of the park from where the monument can be viewed. Finally, the group went to Memorial Hall, gave speeches calling on "all rednecks to meet on the field of battle," and left with an escort of SMPP. Both north and west entrances to the park were closed and no one else could enter during the demonstrations. (*Twitter 4 Jul*)
- At 0230 EDT 5 Jul, media reports the GA State Patrol HQ was vandalized. A large police and fire department presence was reported in the area. Several windows were smashed, and there was allegedly a small fire set in the building. It appeared that staff members were being treated with oxygen following the incident. (Media 4 Jul)
- Seattle, WA: Two members of a planned gathering were hit by a car on I-5 in downtown Seattle around 0430 EDT on 4 Jul. One of the victims has since died and the other remains in serious condition. The Washington State Patrol (WSP) said a driver may have entered the freeway through an off-ramp to avoid barriers that were in place for a shutdown due to a gathering. The driver was taken into custody. WSP is still investigating if it was a "purposeful attack". (MMC 0403 5 Jul)
- New York, NY: At 1530 EDT, FPS reported 100 demonstrators were protesting peacefully at Javits Center. NYPD was on location. (FPS 1621 EDT 4 Jul)



- Washington, D.C.: Numerous groups of protestors converged on Washington, D.C. on 4 Jul, ranging in size from less than 30 to almost 1000. The protests were conducted throughout the day and evening in front of the Supreme Court, near the Capitol, at the Washington Monument, at the Trump Hotel, and around the White House. Some right-wing protesters dressed all in black with shields, helmets and goggles periodically clashed with other groups. Large groups of protestors blocked I-395 briefly and others set up tents and tarps on H street, before DPW was dispatched to remove them. Although most protests were peaceful, there were occasions where the protestors had dispersed. There were no reported injuries to law enforcement personnel. No reported damage to federal property. (USSS 1558 EDT 4 Jul) (USSS 1622 EDT 4 Jul) (USSS 2249 EDT 4 Jul) (CTOC 2305 EDT 4 Jul) (USSS 2119 EDT 4 Jul) (USSS 2154 EDT 4 Jul) (USSS 2249 EDT 4 Jul) (CTOC 2305 EDT 4 Jul)
- San Francisco, CA: TSA reports at approximately 1600 EDT, a small group of protestors began demonstrating on the non-sterile side of International G Terminal at San Francisco International Airport. SFPD was on the scene inside and outside, diverting all traffic. (TSA Chat 2107 EDT 4 Jul)
- Gettysburg, PA: Armed militia members, bikers and white nationalists turned up at the grounds of the Gettysburg National Military Park on 4 Jul to defend against a supposed burning of the U.S. flag by leftists. Media is reporting this may have been a hoax created on social media. (Media 5 Jul)

Other Locations

- Eugene, OR: At 1430 EDT, there were approximately 120 peaceful protestors on scene at the Wayne L. Morse U.S. Courthouse. By 1530 EDT, all but 10 peaceful protestors departed without incident. At one point, however, a group of other protestors surrounded an FPS officer yelling profanity. The officer called for a cover unit and Eugene Police responded to assist. Weapons were not deployed, and no other incidents occurred during the protest. (FPS 1602 EDT 4 Jul) (FPS 1603 EDT 4 Jul)
- Chicago, IL: At 1200 EDT 4 Jul, 200 people were peacefully protesting at the federal plaza on Dearborn Street. (FPS 1342 EDT 4 Jul)
- Atlantic City, NJ: At approximately 1300 EDT, a dozen people gathered outside the city's public safety building on Atlantic Avenue. The group shut down traffic on the Albany Avenue drawbridge and officers ordered the crowd to disperse or face arrest. The group moved on after a second warning, then temporarily shut down traffic to the city's major areas for about an hour. The gathering ended near the Atlantic City expressway, where police arrested seven individuals. Shortly after, the crowd dispersed. (Atlantic City PD 4 Jul)
- Nashville, TN: State troopers took at least a dozen demonstrators into custody at the State Capitol. The group of activists at the foot of the Capitol celebrated with a live band and dancing. Some of the group moved a barrier blocking the entrance to the capitol steps, then climbing up the stairs. They stayed there for a short time until troopers moved in, pushing them back down the stairs. Some of the activists refused to move, prompting 55 arrests for criminal trespassing. (Nashville News 5 4 Jul) (Nashville PD 4 Jul)







Subject: Saturday 04 July Developments Surrounding National Civil Disturbances

Sir – Good morning. Please find attached key DHS developments over the past 24 hours regarding civil unrest and associated violence/vandalism. A detailed timeline surrounding events in Portland, OR from last night and this morning is at the end of this email.

**BLUF**: Large protests began in the early evening on July 4th in Portland, OR and turned violent late in the night, lasting until early morning where at least five arrests overnight were made for damaging government property and assaulting federal officers. In Seattle, WA, the Washington State Patrol is holding a driver for a purposeful act of striking two protesters with a vehicle. Numerous protests were held around the country with most being peaceful. Some demonstrations did turn violent or cause property damage. Significant incidents are reported in the attached document. Additionally, there is an attached graphic showing the major concentration of deployed or standby DHS forces. This graphic <u>is not</u> all-inclusive. Currently, there are <u>worke</u> National Guard personnel deployed across 10 states and DC for civil disturbance support.

#### DHS actions completed 04 July:

 Conducted coordination call to respond to FPS request for reinforcements to Portland, OR to arrive by the evening of 04 July.

- o Launched the USBP strategic Rapid Deployment Team (RDT) from El Paso, TX.
  - (b)(7)(E) i members comprised the RDT. .
    - aircrafts provided transport. (b)(7)(E)
  - Team loaded extra (b)(7)(E) to resupply DHS and DOJ forces in . Portland.
- USMS agreed to relocate a USMS SOG team from St. Louis, MO to Portland, OR but required air transportation.
  - Coordinated from Elizabeth City, NC to fly to St. Louis, MO; pick (b)(7)(E) up the (b)(7)(E) and continue flight into Salem, OR (approx. 45 miles from Portland).
- FPS initiated a nationwide deployment of (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) to Portland.
- Coordination call with DOI, DOJ and DHS Headquarters and components held.
  - Virtual EOC continued to be utilized by all agencies.
  - DHS provided LNOs to the FBI SIOC.
- Executed federal security response missions throughout the U.S. in multiple cities.

#### DHS actions planned for today:

- 1030 EDT DOI/DOJ/DHS information sharing coordination call. Continue collaboration on the virtual EOC with the other Departments and Agencies.
- Staff the (b)(7)(E) upon activation today.
- Remain vigilant and flexible to respond to threats or requests for interagency assistance.

#### Portland, OR Disturbance Timeline from evening of July 4th : (Preliminary information / Data could change as additional facts become known / All times are approximate and in Eastern Daylight Savings Time (EDT) / Information is for situational awareness purposes only and is not considered "official". Times are "as reported by" OPCENs)

- At 2337 EDT, FPS Denver MegaCenter reported in Portland, OR, there were approximately 200 demonstrators in the area of the Justice Center and the Hatfield Courthouse at 1000 Southwest 3rd Avenue that were generally peaceful.
- At 0054 EDT 05 July, protestors were shooting fireworks at the building on the west side and on the front steps.
- At 0110 EDT, several hundred demonstrators gathered in Chapman and Lownsdale Square. Portland police declared a riot due to the gathering near the U.S. District Courthouse and the Multnomah County Justice Center.
- At 0111 EDT, approximately 750 protestors were in the park.
- At 0112 EDT, there was a subject in front of the courthouse velling and attempting to smash ۰. the plywood boards.
- At 0124 EDT, a subject crawled up the building to spray paint a camera and knocked the camera down.
- At 0141 EDT, the USBP RDT team utilized (b)(7)(E) to arrest the subjects tampering with the camera. The subjects were handed over to the U.S. Marshals.

- At 0202 EDT, violent protesters are throwing rocks and shooting fireworks M60 mortars at the courthouse. Protesters broke the plate glass above the courthouse doors and are throwing paint and mace inside the courthouse. No injuries to law enforcement personnel reported.
- At 0203 EDT, FPS Denver MegaCenter reported at least 1,000 protestors in the area. The
  protestors are throwing rocks and balloons filled with paint at the glass to the building.
- At 0205 EDT, units are going to try to push the protestors away from the building.
- At 0240 EDT, a vehicle tried to run over a Portland Police Officer.
- At 0310 EDT, violent protesters are using frozen water bottles, paint, large rocks, bottle rockets/large fireworks, green laser pointers and M60 firework mortars to assault law enforcement personnel. USBP RDT personnel have been struck by these items, but no significant injuries have been reported.
- At 0328 EDT, USBP RDT personnel have reassumed their defensive positions as Portland PD has vacated the area.
- At 0345 EDT, Violent protesters continue to attack law enforcement and USBP RDT members had another exchange with the protesters as they attempted to get within close distance of the building and law enforcement personnel. USBP RDT was forced to use to disperse the crowd.
- At 0409 EDT, FPS Denver MegaCenter reported protestors are setting fire to the pioneer statue in Pioneer Square Park (indications are a State-owned statue)
- At 0413 EDT, there was a subject with two Samurai swords in the area.
- At 0416 EDT, there was a group of 250-300 protestors carrying fuel and materials to the front of the Hatfield Courthouse to start a fire.
- At 0430 EDT, there was another fire at the corner of Lownsdale Square Park and there were
  protestors that had lasers and were pointing them at Inspectors.
- At 0437 EDT, protestors were trying to shoot fireworks into the lobby.
- At 0445 EDT, protesters tossed a large explosive device into the courthouse foyer where the USBP RDT was staged. USBP RDT exited the courthouse and dispersed the protesters off of the federal park property using (b)(7)(E)
   The protesters continued to actively assault USBP RDT personnel with bottle rockets and mortar style fireworks as they retreated off of the federal property.
- At 0535 EDT, USBP RDT arrested two subjects. One subject was deploying harmful lasers directly into the face of USBP RDT operators. The other subject assaulted USBP RDT operators with a shield as they arrested the subject with the laser. Both are currently in custody of the FPS.
- At 0632 EDT, USCG C-130 from Elizabeth City NC to Salem, OR landed with USMS SOG team.
- At 0707 EDT, FPS advised that there are demonstrators in the park area that were throwing fireworks and trying to start a fire.
- At 0710 EDT, FPS advised that rocks were being thrown at the front of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protestors are pointing lasers at the Inspectors and a subject being detained has a machete.
- At 0715 EDT, FPS Officers made several announcements directing the protesters to vacate the federal property directly in front of the courthouse doors or they would be arrested for trespassing. FPS personnel then directed USBP RDT personnel to arrest any subject that was refusing the lawful order to leave the federal property. As USBP RDT personnel came out of the courthouse to make arrests, an individual shined a harmful laser directly into the faces of USBP RDT personnel. USBP RDT was able to take the subject into custody and arrested him for assault. A subsequent search of the subject revealed a pipe bomb, a fused explosive device, a machete and a buck knife.
- At 0724 EDT, FPS advised that the subject in custody appears to have a pipe bomb.

- At 0727 EDT, received FBI update courtesy of the FBI Dep Director. (Below is verbatim as reported by FBI officials to the FBI Dep Director and forwarded to DHS)
  - Pretty successful night for us. Our main value was the planning and command and control assistance to FPS, which helped improve agility, integrate ops team efforts, gather evidence and nail down charging decisions.
  - Six arrests by DHS units which will lead to federal charges including depredation of federal property, misdemeanor AFO and interfering. Approximately 15 local arrests, five of which we will federalize (green laser targeting surveillance aircraft).
  - Lots of credit to DHS units and PPB. They surged assets and we had the initiative all night, although one window was broken at the courthouse.
  - We expect a quieter night tonight and there won't be as many assets. There should still be plenty to defend the courthouse.
  - Quick update to the update. Two more misdemeanor AFO arrests (green lasers at operator's eyes). We are mopping up and closing down.
- At 0845 EDT, Protesters have dispersed and all USBP RDT members have cleared the scene. No injuries reported by the team.



## DHS Support to Civil Disturbances

#### Situational Overview

Demonstrations in Portland, OR and Seattle, WA grew violent overnight, as protestors clashed with police, lit fires and damaged property. There were no reports of attempts to remove any memorials although there were attempts to damage the Federal courthouse in Portland. There are (b)(7)(E) National Guard personnel deployed across six states and DC for civil disturbance support. Since 25 May, there have been a total of 63 incidents of damage to federal property or landmarks.

#### Locations of Interest

- Portland, OR: At 0213 ET. 2 Jul. FPS reported protestors were spray painting the new plywood covering the windows of the Mark O. Hatfield U.S. Courthouse, and pulled the plywood off the windows on the 3rd Street side of the building. The approximately 250 protestors also barricaded the street, were lighting aerial fireworks, and started a bon fire in front of the building. FPS and Portland PD responded to the 3rd Avenue side of the building and protestors pulling the plywood fled. The protestors shot fireworks, pointed lasers and threw multiple objects at FPS units. There were no unauthorized entries into the building. Seven FPS units and U.S. Marshals responded, (b)(7)(E) Protestors removed all plywood on the southwest side of the building and threw wood and other objects at the windows. They also threw water balloons with an unknown dark liquid substance inside at FPS. By 0330 ET, protestors had moved across the street, and all FPS personnel were back inside the building. There were no reported injuries.
- Seattle, WA: On 1 Jul. Seattle police arrested at least 31 people while clearing the Capital Hill Occupied Zone (CHOP) and have retaken the East police precinct station house. There are open source reports of some protesters returning to the area. Since 7 Jun, there have been five shootings and two deaths in the vicinity of the CHOP area.
  - At 2245 ET, 1 Jul, FPS reported a demonstration with approximately 150-200 peaceful protesters in the vicinity of the Seattle U.S. District Courthouse. By 0245 ET, 2 Jul, however, the crowd began moving into the exclusion zone and Seattle PD issued warnings to stay back. After repeated warnings, arrests were made, and the crowd began throwing bottles at police. Seattle PD reported (b)(7)(E) There were no reported injuries.
- New York, NY: NYPD arrested three individuals on the morning of 1 Jul after NYPD attempted to clear out protestors camped outside City Hall Park. NYPD eventually pulled back and positioned themselves across the street from the park.
- Washington, DC: There were no reports of injury or damage to federal facilities on 1 Jul. MPD reported very little protest activity overnight.
- Gettysburg, PA: There are reports circulating on social media platforms and open source websites advising members of an anti-fascist group plan to vandalize the Gettysburg National Cemetery in PA on 4 Jul and attack unnamed nationwide residential areas using fireworks to distract and disguise the assaults. Additionally, there is open source information on a possible




U.S. flag burning event on 4 Jul and counter-protests to the event. No specific or credible threats have been identified.


 South Dakota: On 3 July, POTUS, family members, and other dignitaries arrive at Mount Rushmore National Memorial for a 4th of July fireworks celebration. Several Native American groups reportedly plan to protest in the Keystone, SD area. Additionally, an "anti-Trump" rally is scheduled on 3 Jul in Keystone.

#### **Other Locations**

- Los Angeles, CA: At 2305 ET, FPS reported a demonstration with approximately 150 peaceful
  protestors across the street from the U.S. Court House on North Spring Street. The protestors were not
  on federal property.
- **Columbia, SC:** On 1 Jul, police arrested two people for putting an explosive at the base of a statue on the grounds of the state's capitol. The Bureau of Protective Services, which patrols the SC State House grounds, charged a 19-year-old suspect and a 36-year-old suspect, both of Columbia, with third degree arson and using a destructive device. Police said that the two planted an "incendiary device" at the foot of the statue and ignited it, however the device didn't explode and caused no permanent damage to the monument.
- Pembroke, NC: On 1 Jul, a state of emergency was declared and issued a curfew effective immediately. The action is in response to civil unrest, according to the declaration, which specifically prohibits certain gatherings and parades. The curfew is from 2000 – 0600 ET, and the consumption of alcohol is only permitted on private property or in restaurants. Multiple posts on social media are threatening future gatherings and violence.
- Richmond, VA: On 29 Jun, the commonwealth passed an executive order extending a state of emergency declaration in Richmond until 30 Jul, citing "civil unrest" between gatherers and police.
- Denver, CO: There are over 1,000 people who expressed interest in attending the Rise Up 4th of July rally.
- Fulton County, GA: On 1 Jul, Garret Rolfe (former police officer charged in the shooting of Mr. Brooks) posted bond and was released from custody.

NCR Demonstrations

July 2, 2020 - July 4, 2020

1. On 07/02/20, from 7:00 AM to 10:00 PM, the individual Alix C Toulme Jr, will host a demonstration called "Disclosure Rally at the White House!" The purpose of this rally is to "protest the secrecy regarding UFOs and extraterrestrial life." There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 32 are going and 230 are interested.

2. On 07/02/20 at 3:00 PM, the group The Freedom Neighborhood will host a demonstration at Lincoln Park called "Shut Down the Capitol." The purpose of the demonstration is to protest the Emancipation Statue. The group promotes the idea of 'justice by any means' and claims "If you want a revolution, it won't happen by being peaceful". Participant numbers are unknown at this time. No civil disobedience is expected.

The group plans to have a musical jam session and second line in support of the LGBTQ music community. The demonstration will include performances by the Blue Styles Brass Band and other guest musicians. There is no indication of civil disobedience. Participant numbers are unknown.

4. On 07/03/20, from 8:00 AM to 07/04/20 to 10:00 PM, the group Electric Church Podcast will host a demonstration at the Washington Monument called "March to Washington." The purpose of the demonstration is to tell Washington how tired they are of what's happening in the USA. There is no indication of civil disobdedience. According to Facebook, 0 are going and 24 are interested.

5. On 07/03/20, from 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM, the group Salute To America will host a demonstration at Lafayette Park called "Salute To America Candlelight Prayer Vigil." The purpose of the demonstration is to "stand strong together to pry for #PresidentTrump & #America." There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 379 are going and 1.1k are interested.

6. On 07/03/20, from 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM, the group Uyghur Rally will host a demonstration called "Call on President to Denounce Uyghur Oppression" at 1500 Pennsylvania Ave, WDC. The purpose of the event is to "call on the President to denounce the Uyghur oppression and initiate targeted sanctions against guilty Chinese officials." There is no indication of civI disobedience. According to Facebook 0 are going, and 12 are interested.

*The Uyghur and Tibetan Community previously peacefully protested at the White House in 2015. The Uyghur American Association has protested at the Embassy of China since 1999.

7. On 07/03/20, from 12:30 PM to 3:30PM, the group American Muslims for Palestine will host a demonstration at the Embassy of Israel, WDC. The purpose of the demonstration is to protest against Israel's plan to annex the West Bank. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 45 are going, 113 are interested.

******** American Muslims for Palestine is of record for demonstrating at Trump Tower in NYC and the White House Complex; no arrests have been made.

8. On 07/03/20, from 3:30 PM to 8:00 PM, the group Salute to American 2020 – Independence Day in DC plans to host a demonstration at the Spirit of Washington doc for a Salute to America Freedom Cruise. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 74 are going and 354 are interested.

9. On 07/03/20, from 8:00 pm to 9:00 pm, an individual named Diane Atkins, will host a candlelight prayer vigil in Lafayette Park called "Salute To America-Candlelight Prayer Vigil in DC – Trump2020!" The purpose of the vigil is to "stand strong together to pray for #PresidentTrump & #America!" The

group plans to bring "flameless candles." There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 5 are going and 19 are interested.

10. On 07/04/20, from 5:00 AM to 10:00 AM the group Temple Healing Ministries will host a demonstration at Black Lives Matter Plaza called "Ephesians 6:12 Prayer Walk." The purpose of the demonstration is to "walk seven laps around the White House and pray." The group is also requesting participants to bring instruments to "make a joyful noise after the 7th lap." There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 353 are going and 1k are interested. A permit application is pending.

11. On 07/04/20 at 10:00 AM, the group Million Man March on Washington plans to host a demonstration at the MLK Memorial and proceed to the White House and the US Capitol. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 0 going and 13 interested.

12. On 07/04/20, between 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM, UDC Alumni will host a demonstration called, "We Won't Stand for This" on the Supreme Court sidewalk. The purpose of the demonstration is to conduct a "peaceful sit-in for black women." There is no indication of civil disobedience. The number of participants is unknown.

13. On 07/03/20 at 12:00 PM, the group The Freedom Neighborhood will host a demonstration at the Israel Embassy called "Shut Down the Capitol." The purpose of the demonstration is "justice for our Palestine Neighbors". The group promotes the idea of 'justice by any means' and claims "If you want a revolution, it won't happen by being peaceful". Participant numbers are unknown.

14. On 07/03/20 at 6:00 PM, the group DC Victims of Police Brutality will host a demonstration called "Take Back Our Freedom." The demonstration is an overnight sit-in at Freedom Plaza. The purposed of the demonstration is to "demand Mayor Bowser and Chief Newsham address the continued and unchecked harassment, abuse, and violence by MPD against peaceful demonstrators." There is no indication of civil disobedience. Participant numbers are unknown.

15. On 07/04/20, from 12:00 PM to 6:00 PM, the group The Descendants plan to travel from NYC via bus and host a demonstration at the US Capitol. There is no indication of civil disobedience. The number of participants is unknown.

16. On 07/04/20, from 12:00 PM to 11:00 PM, the individual Charlie Ryan (member of the group Progressive Kalamazoo . will host a demonstration on the National Mall (near the Reflecting Pool) called "Power to the People | Political Revolution." The purpose of the demonstration is to conduct a "political revolution in order to save the country and the planet." There is no indication of civil disobedience . According to Facebook, 372 are going and 3.5K are interested.

17. From 07/04/20 to 07/05/20, between 5:30 AM and 6:00 PM, the individual Vearinna Deaton will host a demonstration at the Capitol called "March on Washington DC" The purpose of the demonstration is to request Congress to show their tax returns. There was no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 2 is going and 18 are interested.

18. *Removed* On 07/04/20, at 06:00 AM, the group July 4 // MARCH on DC will host an event called "The Big Day" at the White House. The purpose of the event is unclear, however, the group detail section states "they must understand how many people they have hurt and continue to hurt everyday". There is no indication of civil disobedience. Facebook indicates 21 going and 267 interested.

19. On 07/04/20, from 9:30 AM to 2:30 PM, the individual Mason Frey will host a demonstration at the Lincoln Memorial called, "George Floyd Memorial March On Washington". The purpose of the demonstration is to show "loving memory of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and countless other victims of the racist and diabolical acts performed by the country's police force". There is no indication of civil disobedience, however the Facebook page noted, "while we plan for this event to be relatively peaceful, we cannot guarantee that the actions of people will be as such. We encourage you to be loud, fearless, and to make an impression. Acts of violence, for legal reasons, are not condoned or promoted by this event." According to Facebook, 752 are going and 6.5K are interested.

20. On 07/04/20, at 10:00 AM, the group Hanover, PA – Neighborhood Watch – CPP will host a demonstration called "All Americans Unite – They Can't Stop Us All!" at the Washington Monument. The purpose of the demonstration is "to show the government and our local authorities that we will not allow them to hurt or kill our brothers and sisters anymore". There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 25 are going and 292 are interested.

21. On 07/04/20, from 10:00 AM to 11:00 PM, the group Country Over Party will host a demonstration on the National Mall called "March 4 The Constitution March 4 Our Country March 4 Democracy." The purpose of the demonstration is to "take our country back from the politicians and the money that backs them." There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 1 is going and 6 are interested.

22. On 07/04/20, between 12:00 PM and 11:00 PM, 10 Million Man March will host "10 Million Man March Independence Day." The purpose of their march is to demand their country back. The groups will assemble at the MLK Memorial and proceed to the White House and the US Capitol. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook 60 are interested.

23. On 07/04/20, from 12:00 PM to 3:00 PM, the group Black Out March will host an event called "Black Out March." The purpose of the event is to host a "peaceful movement that seeks to dismantle a systematic imbalance through enacting policy reform, educating the public, and strengthening communities." Tickets are currently being distributed through Eventbrite for free. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 78 are going and 689 are interested.

24. On 07/04/20, from 12:00 PM to 07/05/20 at 12:00 PM, the groups 2 Million Bikers 2 DC ., 2 Million Bikers to DC ., and I am One ., will host a demonstration at the World War II Memorial called "Roar of the Deplorables 2020, Echo in the Alley." The purpose of the demonstration is to "exercise our First amendment and to peaceably assemble to petition the Government for a redress of Grievances. We will as well be Exercising our Free Speech and addressing the ANTI Trump and Anti-American regime that has plagued our Nation for far too long!" [sic] There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 370 are going and 2.6K are interested.

25. On 07/04/20, from 12:00 PM to 10:00 PM, the individual Joshua Jackson . plans to host a demonstration at the Lincoln Memorial, to conduct a March on Washington for Equality. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 10 are going and 78 are interested.

26. On 07/04/20, from 12:30 PM to 2:30 PM, the group Grandma Louis Pies "Save the Children" . plans to host a demonstration at the National Museum of African American History and Culture to hold a Black Lives Matter protest and Unity Human Flag event. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 11 are going and 70 are interested.

27. On 07/04/20 at 1:30 PM, the groups Freedom Fighters DC and Concerned Citizens of DC . will host a demonstration at The Park at Le Droit (between W street and Rhode Island Ave) called "Juliberation: No Justice, No Fourth." The group plans to march "across our nation's capital" no route is known. The purpose of the demonstration is to "demand justice for those who are not yet experiencing the liberty this country promises." There is no indication of civil disobedience. Participant numbers are unknown.

*Freedom Fighters is of record for demonstrating on previous occasions, however, no arrests were made.

28. On 07/04/20, from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM, the group July 4th Protest for Change DC . plans to host a demonstration at the Black Lives Matter Plaza to conduct a July 4th protest. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 13 are going and 145 are interested.

29. On 07/04/20 at 4:00 PM, the groups Family Tree DNA . and Family First Alliance . plan to host a demonstration in WDC to hold a Family Freedom March. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 112 are going.

30. On 07/04/20, at 4:00 PM, the group Refuse Fascism . will host a demonstration called "Trump/Pence Out Now" at Lafayette Park/Black Lives Matter Plaza, Washington, DC. The purpose of this event is to protest against President Trump and American fascism. There is no indication of civil disobedience. The number of participants is unknown. *Refuse Fascism is of record for demonstrating on multiple occasions since 2016 across the US. Some of these demonstrations have resulted in arrests. However, the group recently demonstrated in Lafayette Park on 06/14/20 and no arrests were made on this date.

31. On 07/04/20, the group Abolish the Police . plans to host a demonstration at DuPont Circle and proceed to an undisclosed location to conduct an "FTP March." There is no indication of civil disobedience. The time, destination and number of participants is unknown.

*Abolish the Police is of record since 06/22/20 when approximately 300 demonstrators attempted to etablish a "Black House Autonomous Zone" (BHAZ) in the vicinity of the White House. Demonstrators used sandbags, bike racks, and improvised barriers to construct barricades and several demonstrators climbed atop the Andrew Jackson statue and attempted to topple it using chains and ropes.

32. On 07/04/20 at 6:00 PM, the group TheyThem Collective . will host a demonstration at Dupont Circle called "FTP March." The purpose of the demonstration is to march "until police and ICE are abolished." According to the group's Instagram page, the group will have a "white accomplices orientation" at 6:00 PM and then march at 7:00 PM to an undisclosed location. There is no indication of civil disobedience. The participant numbers are unknown.

33. On 07/04/20 at 9:00 PM, the group Salute to America 2020 – Independence Day in DC plans to host a demonstration on the National Mall area to view the July 4th fireworks. There is no indication of civil disobedience. According to Facebook, 379 are going and 1.1K are interested.



## DHS Support to Civil Disturbances

#### Situational Overview

Demonstrations in Portland, OR and Seattle, WA grew violent overnight, as protestors clashed with police, lit fires and damaged property. There were no reports of attempts to remove any memorials, although there were attempts to damage the Federal courthouse in Portland. There are (b)(7)(E) National Guard personnel deployed across six states and DC for civil disturbance support. Since 25 May, there have been a total of 63 incidents of damage to federal property or landmarks.

#### Locations of Interest

- Portland, OR: At 0213 ET. 2 Jul. FPS reported protestors were spray painting the new plywood covering the windows of the Mark O. Hatfield U.S. Courthouse, and pulled the plywood off the windows on the 3rd Street side of the building. The approximately 250 protestors also barricaded the street, were lighting aerial fireworks, and started a bon fire in front of the building. FPS and Portland PD responded to the 3rd Avenue side of the building and protestors pulling the plywood fled. The protestors shot fireworks, pointed lasers and threw multiple objects at FPS units. There were no unauthorized entries into the building. Seven FPS units and U.S. Marshals responded, (b)(7)(E) Protestors removed all plywood on the southwest side of the building and threw wood and other objects at the windows. They also threw water balloons with an unknown dark liquid substance inside at FPS. By 0330 ET, protestors had moved across the street, and all FPS personnel were back inside the building. There were no reported injuries.
- Seattle, WA: On 1 Jul. Seattle police arrested at least 31 people while clearing the Capital Hill Occupied Zone (CHOP) and have retaken the East police precinct station house. There are open source reports of some protesters returning to the area. Since 7 Jun, there have been five shootings and two deaths in the vicinity of the CHOP area.
  - At 2245 ET, 1 Jul, FPS reported a demonstration with approximately 150-200 peaceful protesters in the vicinity of the Seattle U.S. District Courthouse. By 0245 ET, 2 Jul, however, the crowd began moving into the exclusion zone and Seattle PD issued warnings to stay back. After repeated warnings, arrests were made, and the crowd began throwing bottles at police. Seattle PD reported (b)(7)(E) There were no reported injuries.
- New York, NY: NYPD arrested three individuals on the morning of 1 Jul after NYPD attempted to clear out protestors camped outside City Hall Park. NYPD eventually pulled back and positioned themselves across the street from the park.
- Washington, DC: There were no reports of injury or damage to federal facilities on 1 Jul. MPD reported very little protest activity overnight.
- Gettysburg, PA: There are reports circulating on social media platforms and open source websites advising members of an anti-fascist group plan to vandalize the Gettysburg National Cemetery in PA on 4 Jul and attack unnamed nationwide residential areas using fireworks to distract and disguise the assaults. Additionally, there is open source information on a possible



U.S. flag burning event on 4 Jul and counter-protests to the event. No specific or credible threats have been identified.

 South Dakota: On 3 July, POTUS, family members, and other dignitaries arrive at Mount Rushmore National Memorial for a 4th of July fireworks celebration. Several Native American groups reportedly plan to protest in the Keystone, SD area. Additionally, an "anti-Trump" rally is scheduled on 3 Jul in Keystone.

#### **Other Locations**

- Los Angeles, CA: At 2305 ET, FPS reported a demonstration with approximately 150 peaceful
  protestors across the street from the U.S. Court House on North Spring Street. The protestors were not
  on federal property.
- **Columbia, SC:** On 1 Jul, police arrested two people for putting an explosive at the base of a statue on the grounds of the state's capitol. The Bureau of Protective Services, which patrols the SC State House grounds, charged a 19-year-old suspect and a 36-year-old suspect, both of Columbia, with third degree arson and using a destructive device. Police said that the two planted an "incendiary device" at the foot of the statue and ignited it, however the device didn't explode and caused no permanent damage to the monument.
- Pembroke, NC: On 1 Jul, a state of emergency was declared and issued a curfew effective immediately. The action is in response to civil unrest, according to the declaration, which specifically prohibits certain gatherings and parades. The curfew is from 2000 – 0600 ET, and the consumption of alcohol is only permitted on private property or in restaurants. Multiple posts on social media are threatening future gatherings and violence.
- Richmond, VA: On 29 Jun, the commonwealth passed an executive order extending a state of emergency declaration in Richmond until 30 Jul, citing "civil unrest" between gatherers and police.
- Denver, CO: There are over 1,000 people who expressed interest in attending the Rise Up 4th of July rally.
- Fulton County, GA: On 1 Jul, Garret Rolfe (former police officer charged in the shooting of Mr. Brooks) posted bond and was released from custody.

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# DHS Support to Civil Disturbances

#### Situational Overview

On Wednesday night, demonstrations remained largely peaceful, including those in Washington, DC. National Guard were mobilized in Washington, DC and Dane County, WI in support of local authorities and in response to recent events in those locations. Unlawful activity in Richmond, VA included rockthrowing, vandalism, and a number of arrests. Portland, OR protesters lit dumpster fires and used spray-paint, but there were no injuries or significant damage reported.

#### Locations of Interest

- Washington, DC: Wednesday remained mostly peaceful, with some major roads being blocked by demonstrators in the evening.
  - US Capitol Police reported more than 200 demonstrators gathered around St. John's Church at H and 16th Streets, directly northeast of Lafayette Park. Another group gathered at Gallery Place and proceeded from there to BLM Plaza (16th St from H to K St NW).
  - Road closures impacting the SW/SE Freeway (I-695/395), including many freeway ramps and tunnels, were reported by the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) around 2015 ET due to demonstrators on the freeway. MPD employed rolling street closures once the demonstrators exited the freeway and marched eastbound on Pennsylvania Ave.
  - A demonstration with potential for violence is planned for 1900 ET 25 Jun in Lincoln Park, DC (roughly one mile east of the Capitol Building), where a group claims they will again try to pull down the Emancipation Memorial statue. The size of this group is unknown, but the 23 Jun gathering for this purpose had an estimated 100-200 participants. According to social media, a group of counter-protesters is expected to attend as well.

- Richmond, VA: At 2306 ET, the Richmond Police Department began attempting to clear trespassers from the Robert E. Lee Monument grounds, which have been closed. At 2328 ET, they declared an Unlawful Assembly due to rocks being thrown at law enforcement officers by demonstrators as they moved into the roadway off the Lee Monument grounds. Police made a number of arrests.
  - At 2357 ET after demonstrators dispersed from the monument, Richmond Police responded to a nearby Starbucks where a brick and lit flare had been thrown through a window.



- Media reported demonstrators also marched toward the nearby Matthew Fontaine Maury statue and tried to pull it down using a rope. After failing to do so, the group left.
- The FAA reported lasers were being directed at (b)(7)(E)
   (b)(7)(E) and suspects were arrested.
- Portland, OR: An FPS PSO at the Mark O. Hatfield US Courthouse advised at 2127 PT that there were approximately 400 peaceful protestors in front of the courthouse and the Justice Center.
  - At 0003 PT, protestors started a dumpster fire behind the courthouse, and at 0025 PT, a second fire was started nearby. The fire department extinguished the fires. There were still approximately 200 protestors in the area.
  - At 0054 PT, demonstrators spray painted a security camera on the courthouse building and breached the fence of the Justice Center, adjacent to federal property. Media was on scene.
  - At 0108 PT, about 50 demonstrators remained, and were using fencing from the Justice Center to block an intersection. By 0144 PT, Portland police had gotten them to disperse.
- Seattle, WA: There were no FPS reports of demonstrator activity near federal facilities on Wednesday.
  - The Capitol Hill Occupied Protest (CHOP) zone remains in place, but according to organizers, most demonstrators have departed, with less than three dozen remaining within the zone.
  - A spokesman for the mayor said city leadership and community organizers continue to talk with demonstrators in the zone to encourage them to peacefully leave the area at night.
- Madison, WI: On 24 Jun, the WI Governor issued a press release indicating elements of the (b)(7)(E)
   to local

authorities in response to a request from Dane County authorities.

- The Governor stated civil unrest in Madison, WI Tuesday night resulted in serious injury to bystanders as well as significant damage to state property. In addition to tearing down two statues and assaulting a state senator near the Capitol Tuesday night, those protesting the Tuesday arrest of an activist threw a Molotov cocktail into the City County Building,
- The Governor confirmed: "The Wisconsin National Guard will serve in a limited authorization meant to make sure people can exercise their First Amendment rights while ensuring the safety of members of the public and state buildings and infrastructure,"
- Santa Fe, NM: On 18 Jun, the Mayor of Santa Fe directed that the city "shall contact the proper officials with jurisdiction over the obelisk dedicated to Kit Carson, to determine a course of action for removal of that monument." The obelisk is located on the federally owned plaza of the US Courthouse.
  - The plywood wall around the obelisk erected by GSA over the weekend remains in place. The Mayor of Santa Fe is erecting a similar barrier around a city-owned obelisk, which demonstrators have also damaged. Subjects have been damaging the obelisks under cover of darkness when police presence is minimal.
  - o FPS reports they are demobilizing all personnel who were deployed to support disturbances.



### Other Locations

- New York, NY: There were some tensions between police and demonstrators on Wednesday, but no reports of significant issues regarding New York City demonstrations, and no reported impacts to federal facilities.
  - Media reported a number of demonstrators who had gathered at City Hall Park around 1700 ET on Tuesday had stayed there into Wednesday night.
  - Hundreds of demonstrators were gathered between City Hall and the Brooklyn Bridge on Wednesday, intending to stay there until the NYPD's budget is reduced, with that money reinvested in housing, health care and social services.
- Los Angeles, CA: At 1513 local time, an FPS PSO at the US Court House advised of a BLM demonstration of 250-300 peaceful protesters, mostly across the street at the Hall of Justice.
  - There were 40-45 demonstrators on property. LAPD and County Sheriffs were monitoring.
  - o By 1930 PT, the group had left the area with no reports of impacts to federal facilities.
- Salt Lake City, UT: At 1845 local time, an FPS PSO at the Frank E Moss Courthouse reported 150-200 otherwise peaceful BLM protesters were blocking the intersection on the south side of the building. PSO advised they were protesting off property. By 2030 local time, the group had left the area with no reports of impacts to federal facilities.
- Wilmington, NC: Media reported the Wilmington Police Chief terminated three veteran officers for 'hate-filled speech' noted during a supervisor's routine inspection of video from an in-car camera. An ensuing internal investigation uncovered "extensive standard of conduct violations regarding inappropriate language."

#### **Current Posture**

#### CBP

 As of 24 Jun, USBP agents remained committed to Civil Unrest Support Requests from Federal Law Enforcement Task Force partners to provide enhanced situational awareness capabilities in Toledo and Cleveland, OH, Detroit and Grand Rapids, MI.

#### CISA

* (b)(7)(E) continues to support Seattle's Emergency Operations Center to advise the Seattle Police Department on areas involving critical infrastructure.

#### **FPS**

- In the past 24 hours, FPS responded to demonstration-related activity in Washington, DC, Portland, and five other locations where there were small, peaceful gatherings.
- In the past 24 hours, there was one report of damage to FPS facilities:
  - o Spray-paint on a handicap ramp at One Riverview Square in Miami, FL
  - o Spray-paint on a Mark O Hatfield Courthouse security camera in Portland, OR



#### ICE

- * HSI is reporting no support for civil disturbances for 24 Jun and all SACs are accounted for.
- * ERO Seattle continues to have (b)(7)(E) at the Portland Office on standby for civil disturbance assistance to FPS to protect the ICE building.

#### TSA

- * No TSA personnel or equipment are committed to the civil disturbance efforts.
- * TSA confirms no damage to federally owned property or leases.

#### **Previous Posture and Activities**

**Overview**: From 31 May through 23 June, at least (b)(7)(E) from across the nation responded to requests for support and assistance from other federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. This support, provided both outside and within the National Capital Region (NCR), was primarily to assist in crowd control, securing federal property, protecting life and preserving public safety.

#### Outside the National Capitol Region

At leas (b)(7)(E) deployed to assist other federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies outside the NCR.

#### CBP

- From 31 May through 23 June, CBP (b)(7)(E) outside the NCR to support 59 requests to augment first responders from federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies in eleven states (MI, NJ, NY, TX, WA, OH, CA, AZ, PA, LA, and OR).
- * The mission for CBP was to protect life, public safety, preservation of property, and provide liaison personnel, ground and air surveillance support, and limited logistics.

#### CISA

- Protective Security Advisors (PSAs) continue to conduct information sharing with partners with potential CI impacts and with venues hosting special events.

- Emergency Communications Coordinators worked with several states and urban area communications personnel concerning alternate interoperable communications resources available to state, local, tribal, and territorial partners.
- CISA reported on multiple cyber-actor attempts to hack or corrupt public websites across the nation.

ICE

- * Approximately (b)(7)(E) from field offices across the US responded to multiple requests for assistance outside the NCR from federal, state, local law enforcement agencies. HSI law enforcement personnel assisted law enforcement partners in multiple locations, including in cities in: GA, NY, NC, IL, WI, TX, UT, MO, NV, CA, NJ, PA, OR, FL, AZ, TN, AR, and WA.
- * The assistance requested and provided by HSI varied from location to location. This support included HSI assisting efforts of its federal, state, and local partners to:
  - Secure, protect, and monitor federal, state, and local law enforcement and government facilities.
  - Coordinate inter-departmental response efforts.
  - Conduct physical (non-technical) surveillance for situational law enforcement awareness.
    - Serve as quick reaction forces on standby to respond to active shooter or other emergent situations.
  - Conduct other investigative activities, such as records checks, interviews, and surveillance of organized criminal elements such as gangs who sought to use the protests as cover to commit violent and other crimes.

FPS

- FPS's response to the ongoing unrest has been fluid and dynamic; personnel and equipment respond to facilities where demonstrations and other related activities are occurring.
- FPS has deployed personnel into a small number of cities and has received assistance from within DHS and other federal and local law enforcement partners (as allowed by the locality) for additional support at the properties FPS protects.
- The entire FPS Law Enforcement and contract Protective Security Officer (PSO) workforce is committed to crime prevention, enforcement, investigative and response activities.



- Since 28 May, FPS has responded to over 247 protests and more than 186 attacks at federal facilities. FPS and partner agencies are investigating the over 182 incidents of damage and vandalism, including spray painting of graffiti, rocks thrown through windows, bullets being fired at federal facilities, and one instance of attempted arson.
- FPS is investigating several instances of explosive devices (i.e. Molotov cocktails and fireworks) being thrown at federal facilities and one instance of individuals breaking a window to gain access to a federal facility and attempting to set it on fire.
- * In Oakland, CA an ambush-style drive by shooting resulted in the death of an FPS PSO and the critical injuring of another.

#### Inside the National Capitol Region (NCR)

At its peak, the DHS commitment of surge law enforcement personnel to the Department of Justice (DOJ) effort in the NCR was 859, which occurred on 1 June.

- ICE deployed personnel to respond to requests for law enforcement assistance in the NCR. Approximately
   (b)(7)(E) were deployed; the number of personnel physically deployed each day fluctuated.

### TSA

* Deployed Visible Intermodal Prevention and Response (VIPR) Teams to transportation hubs and federal facilities throughout the NCR.

#### USSS

- * USSS enhanced their protective shifts in support of White House security.
- * USSS obtained civil disturbance equipment, planned additional supplies to enhance protection, and obtained anti-scale fencing to expand the White House perimeter.



- * USSS partnered with CBP to stand up a Quick Reaction Force (QRF); units were on standby.
- * USSS obtained a tethered UAS from CBP which was deployed 2-7 June.

#### USCG

* Select USCG elements in the NCR or otherwise located near significant protest areas aligned with DoD and transitioned to Force Protection Condition (FPCON) CHARLIE (terrorist action or targeting against personnel or facilities is likely).





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

Thanks Chris and good afternoon everyone. The General Services Administration (GSA) reports 330 federal facility locations where sculptures (including approximately 40 statues), paintings, architectural art, and environmental art are located. We are refining GSA's list to determine the exact location of statues that may be vulnerable to destruction during a civil disturbance. Once we determine the locations of the most vulnerable statues we will reach out to you all to see what LE assets you might have available in those locations to support our Federal statue protection efforts.

Our plan would be to cross-designate available DHS Officers and Agents in those locations with our LE authority (40 USC 1315) in advance of actually needing them. The cross-designation is a fairly simple process:

1.FPS Director Patterson sends an email to the individual DHS LE component head requesting both component support of the FPS mission to protect federal property and persons thereon, and consent for component personnel to receive fixed-term 40 USC 1315 LEO cross-designation;

2.The component head communicates both concurrences to support FPS and consent to 40 USC 1315 cross-designation – component head concurrence may come in the form of email, phone call, etc.;
3.The component and FPS regional leadership coordinate a by-name list of component personnel to be cross-designated and FPS verifies that each named Officer/Agent receiving 1315 cross-designation has completed a qualifying foundational training program, usually the FLETC-provided training programs meet the general LE training requirements outlined in the guidelines approved by the Attorney General (attached);

4.FPS Director signs and issues a letter of official 1315 cross-designation applicable to all of the component personnel named on the list – FPS and the component can continue to modify and amend the list as operational demands and resources require; and

5.FPS provides 1315-designated component personnel with truncated legal and tactical training specific to FPS/1315 – we have recorded this training for 1315-designated Officers/Agents to view at the time and location most convenient.

We will get back to you all as soon as we have the statue locations identified.

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

Once finalized, these guidelines will provide DHS's officers and agents with important direction as they perform their duties.

The Department has reviewed the draft guidelines provided to us in accordance with 40 U.S.C. § 1315(f). Pursuant to our review, the Department of Justice approves these guidelines, which are enclosed. Please let us know if there is any further assistance we can provide to facilitate the process.

# AUTHORITY AND SCOPE

On November 25, 2002, the President signed into law the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (the Act), Pub. L. No. 107-296, 116 Stat. 2135 (Nov. 25, 2002). Section 1706 of the Act amended 40 U.S.C. § 1315 to vest in the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (the Secretary), the authority to protect buildings, grounds, and property that are owned, occupied, or secured by the Federal Government (including any agency, instrumentality, or wholly-owned or mixed-ownership corporation thereof) and the persons on the property.

As provided in 40 U.S.C. § 1315(b)(1), the Secretary may designate employees of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) as officers and agents for duty in connection with the protection of property owned, occupied or secured by the Federal Government and persons on the property. Furthermore, 40 U.S.C. § 1315(b)(2) enumerates the powers that these designated officers and agents may exercise in carrying out their official duties and such other activities for the promotion of homeland security as the Secretary may prescribe.

This document, when approved by the Secretary and Attorney General in accordance with 40 U.S.C § 1315(f), constitutes the guidelines that will govern the exercise of the law enforcement powers of DHS officers and agents designated by the Secretary under 40 U.S.C. §1315(b)(1).

## GENERAL TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

A. Law Enforcement Training

Prior to being authorized to exercise the powers set forth in 40 U.S.C. § 1315 (b)(2), designated officers must have completed the Mixed Basic Police Training Program or another approved program at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), or a substantially similar program as approved by the Secretary or the Secretary's designee. Additionally, each criminal investigator or designated officer or agent acting in a similar capacity must also successfully complete the Criminal Investigator Training Program at FLETC, or substantially similar programs as approved by the Secretary or the Secretary or the Secretary's designee.

Officers and agents shall successfully complete periodic refresher and/or post-basic training, in areas that include, for example, search and seizure, arrest, firearms, trial process, the enforcement of criminal and civil laws, and investigative procedures.

# **EXERCISE OF AUTHORITY**

### A. Use of Force

Designated officers and agents are permitted to use that amount of physical force reasonably necessary to assure compliance with lawful commands and overcome all resistance. Designated officers and agents shall comply with all applicable DHS policies on the use of force.

#### B. Deadly Force Policy

Designated officers and agents may use deadly force only when necessary, that is, when an officer or agent has a reasonable belief that the subject of such force poses an imminent danger of death or serious physical injury to the officer or to another person. Deadly force may not be used solely to prevent the escape of a fleeing subject. Designated officers and agents shall comply with the DHS Use of Deadly Force Policy.

#### C. Arrest with a Warrant

When the need to make an arrest is reasonably foreseeable, a warrant shall be obtained. Warrants will be sought only in connection with official activities. Decisions to seek arrest warrants should be coordinated with the appropriate U.S. Attorney's Office or Department of Justice, Criminal Division.

D. Arrest without a Warrant

Pursuant to 40 U.S.C.§ 1315 (b)(2)(C), authority to arrest without a warrant exists for any offense against the United States committed in the presence of the officer or agent or for any felony cognizable under the laws of the United States if the officer or agent has probable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed or is committing a felony.

E. Arrest of Juveniles

In the event an arrest of a juvenile occurs, the Juvenile Delinquency Act of 1974, 18 U.S.C. § 5031 *et seq.*, requires strict compliance with specific procedures. The appropriate U.S. Attorney's Office should be notified before an individual known to a designated officer or agent to be a juvenile is arrested, except in exigent circumstances. In the event of such arrest in exigent circumstances, advice should be sought immediately from the appropriate U.S. Attorney's Office.

F. Searches with Warrants

Designated officers and agents are required to conduct searches under the authority of a search warrant, except under narrow exceptions as defined by law.

#### G. Searches without Warrants

The preference for search warrants is subject to the following exceptions: search incident to a lawful arrest; search by consent; routine inventory search, administrative search, and search under emergency or exigent circumstances.

#### H. Service of Summonses and Subpoenas

Designated officers and agents are authorized to obtain and execute search and arrest warrants, as well as obtain and serve subpoenas and summonses, issued under authority of the United States.

I. Firearms

Only those officers and agents who are authorized in writing and issued a credential to bear firearms shall carry firearms in the performance of their official duties and only in accordance with DHS policies governing the carriage, training, maintenance, and use of firearms and other similar policies pertaining to firearms. This authorization is to be granted only after the officers and agents have successfully completed approved firearms training.

Designated officers and agents will conform firearms training and recertification to DHS or FLETC standards, or other substantially equivalent standards approved by the Secretary or his designee.

## AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE STATE AND LOCAL LAWS

## A. Enforcement of State or Local Laws

In addition to any previous authority granted or agreements in effect, the Secretary or the Secretary's designee may enter into agreements with Federal agencies and state and local governments to obtain authority for designated officers and agents to enforce state and local laws in connection with the protection of property owned or occupied by the Federal Government and persons on the property. When so authorized, designated officers and agents are permitted to take action in the course of their duties consistent with Federal, state or local law.

## **B.** Additional Required Training

Prior to taking any law enforcement action under state or local law pursuant to an agreement described in Part A, designated officers and agents, in addition to complying with the General Training Requirements of these Guidelines, must attend any applicable state and local law enforcement familiarization training and review appropriate materials.

# INVESTIGATIVE PROCEDURES AND TECHNIQUES

# A. Investigations

Designated officers and agents shall be authorized to conduct investigations of violations of law within their jurisdiction. Such investigations shall be conducted in accordance with applicable DHS policies and procedures.

B. Interception of Wire, Oral and Electronic Communications

Designated officers and agents shall be authorized to intercept wire, oral, and electronic communications only in accordance with law, e.g., 18 U.S.C. §§ 2510-2522, 2701-2711, and 3121-2127, and in accordance with DHS and Attorney General policies governing the intercept of such communications.

C. Undercover Operations (UCOs)

Designated officers and agents may conduct undercover operations in accordance with DHS policies, including component policies and procedures. The approval and execution of undercover operations will include adherence to guidelines on UCOs, submitting operational plans with the concurrence of the U.S. Attorney or federal prosecutor responsible for the investigation, and approval by DHS' Undercover Review Committee, including that of the component, as required.

D. Consensual Monitoring in Certain Situations

Designated officers and agents may engage in consensual monitoring in accordance with DHS policy and the Attorney General's May 30, 2002 memorandum on Procedures for Lawful, Warrantless Monitoring of Verbal Communications, requiring the prior approval of the Director or an Associate Director of the Department of Justice Office of Enforcement Operations in specified sensitive circumstances. In such cases, the responsible Federal prosecutor for the investigation shall be consulted before the consensual monitoring occurs.

# NOTIFICATION AND COORDINATION POLICIES

A. Notification to Other Investigative Agencies with Concurrent Federal Jurisdiction

When an investigation might involve the participation of another law enforcement agency with concurrent jurisdiction, designated officers and agents will notify and coordinate their activities with the other agency.

In investigations in which allegations beyond the scope of the authority of DHS arise, the designated officer or agent shall notify the appropriate investigative agency and prosecuting authority of the allegations.

B. Coordination with United States Attorneys

Designated officers and agents will coordinate with the responsible United States Attorney at the earliest reasonable opportunity and will ensure that all investigative activities are conducted consistent with the internal policies of the United States Attorney.

#### DISCLAIMER

These guidelines are set forth solely for the purpose of internal agency guidance. They are not intended to, do not, and may not be relied upon to create any rights, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law by any third party in any manner, civil or criminal, and they do not place any limitations on otherwise lawful activities of the agency. No provision of these Guidelines shall limit the role of DHS organizational elements' performance of law enforcement activities under existing authorities.

These Guidelines shall govern the execution of powers granted in § 1706 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002, Public Law No. 107-296 and in no way diminish any authority or power granted to officers and agents by any other source.

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locations of the most vulnerable statues we will reach out to you all to see what LE assets you might have available in those locations to support our Federal statue protection efforts.

Our plan would be to cross-designate available DHS Officers and Agents in those locations with our LE authority (40 USC 1315) in advance of actually needing them. The cross-designation is a fairly simple process:

1.FPS Director Patterson sends an email to the individual DHS LE component head requesting both component support of the FPS mission to protect federal property and persons thereon, and consent for component personnel to receive fixed-term 40 USC 1315 LEO cross-designation;

2.The component head communicates both concurrences to support FPS and consent to 40 USC 1315 cross-designation – component head concurrence may come in the form of email, phone call, etc.;
3.The component and FPS regional leadership coordinate a by-name list of component personnel to be cross-designated and FPS verifies that each named Officer/Agent receiving 1315 cross-designation has completed a qualifying foundational training program, usually the FLETC-provided training programs meet the general LE training requirements outlined in the guidelines approved by the Attorney General (attached);

4.FPS Director signs and issues a letter of official 1315 cross-designation applicable to all of the component personnel named on the list – FPS and the component can continue to modify and amend the list as operational demands and resources require; and

5.FPS provides 1315-designated component personnel with truncated legal and tactical training specific to FPS/1315 – we have recorded this training for 1315-designated Officers/Agents to view at the time and location most convenient.

We will get back to you all as soon as we have the statue locations identified.

*I've spoken with Kris Cline earlier today and if he hasn't yet, he will soon reach out to you to see about getting personnel "deputized" (For John H and John G – that's my term; not aware of the proper legalese) so we can have DHS LEOs appropriately crossed designated in advance so we aren't jumping through hoops at the last moment trying to respond but are waiting on paperwork. *I should have more to pass later after the meeting that commences at 1645.

The key watch word is to be proactive and prepared to the maximum extent practical. It may be wise for us to jump up on a call tomorrow before the weekend. I'll look to get the staff to set something up. v/r Chris

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# DHS Response to Civil Disturbances

#### Situational Overview

Demonstrations, both peaceful and violent, continued over the last 24 hours. There no reported injuries to federal officers or protestors and no federal arrests. There were three reports of damage to federal facilities Portland, OR (two instances of fence removal and a damaged main entry door), There were two incidents of non-lethal weapons deployment in Portland, one by the US Marshal's Service (USMS) and one by FPS.

In downtown Portland, protestors used fencing to barricade doors on federal properties, shot commercial grade fireworks at federal properties, and targeted personnel and property with lasers and strobes. Protestors attempting to enter the Mark O. Hatfield Federal Courthouse were dispersed by the USMS using tear gas. FPS deployed a (b)(7)(E) to clear protestors attempting to enter an Edith Green-Wendell Wyatt federal building emergency entrance.

Portland protestors broke a window at the Portland Police Association building, approximately four miles north of the federal properties. They lit dumpster fires and threw a lit flare inside the building, prompting the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) to declare a riot. The flare was quickly extinguished, along with the dumpster fires, and the area was cleared by PPB.

Other protests around the country for various causes did not impact federal facilities.

Currently, there are ((MOIE) National Guard personnel deployed across three states (MOIE) in GA, (MOIE) in TX, and (MOIE) in WI) for civil disturbance support. (NGB OPSUM 0533 EDT 19 Jul)

#### Locations of Interest

- Portland, OR (all times PDT):
  - At 2006 PDT 18 Jul, approximately 75 protestors were gathered in front of the city's Justice Center. (FPS Sitrep 156 2300 EDT 18 Jul 20)
  - At 2016 PDT, approximately 125 protestors sat at 3rd Ave and Salmon St, at the northeast corner of the Hatfield Courthouse. (FPS Sitrep w/me) 2300 EDT 18 Jul 20)
  - At 2135 PDT, The USMS reported the Hatfield Courthouse was cleared of all non-USMS personnel and would be locked down for the night. The FPS Temporary Operations Center was moved to the Edith Green Federal Building. (FPS Sitrep intro 0100 EDT 19 Jul 20)
  - By 2146 PDT, protestors had destroyed a panel of the newly constructed anti-climb embassy fence that allowed access to Federal property. (CBP 0652 EDT 19 Jul)
  - By 2227 PDT, approximately 600 had gathered at or near 3rd Ave and Main St. The crowd continued dismantling the fencing and using it to barricade doors at the Justice Center and Hatfield Courthouse. A two-person counter protest unsuccessfully attempted to stop the crowd. (PPB Website; CBP 0652 EDT 19 Jul)
  - At 2249 PDT, the PPB declared a riot near the Portland Police Association (PPA) building (approximately four miles to the north) after a PPA building window was broken and a lit flare was thrown inside. Dumpster fires had also been set. The flare was quickly extinguished,



and the dumpster fires were put out by 2258 PDT when PPB began clearing the area. (PPB Website; Woke.net)

- By 2252 PDT, the west entrance of the Hatfield Courthouse was blocked and unusable. USMS responded after violent opportunists attempted to breach and enter the Hatfield Courthouse main entry, deploying tear gas to disperse the crowd. Other federal partners did not deploy. As USMS personnel were outside the building, protestors threw hard/heavy objects, including the spent less than lethal/chemical munitions casings, at the agents and assaulted them with green lasers. One male subject was detained for failing to comply with FPS directions. The subject was released without further incident, with possible charges pending. (FPS Sitrep O200 EDT 19 Jul; FPS IMC 0435 EDT 19 Jul; CBP 0652 EDT)
- AT 2309 PDT, FPS advised orange smoke and mortars were fired at the Hatfield Courthouse. The FPS Area Commander advised that PPB will not assist in moving protestors away from the federal buildings. (Denver Megacenter 0225 EDT 19 Jul)
- At 0005 PDT 19 Jul, FPS reported the roll-up door on the north side of Hatfield Courthouse was barricaded by protestors. (FPS Sitrep 10/00 0400 EDT 19 Jul)
- By 0020 PDT, protestors blocked eastbound traffic on Madison St and began giving speeches to crowd. A group had gathered between Hatfield Courthouse and the Justice Center. (FPS Sitrep 0400 EDT 19 Jul)
- At 0106 PDT. FPS reported a green laser was directed through the main entrance of the Edith Green Federal Building. There were approximately 75 protestors remaining in the area of the Hatfield Courthouse. (FPS Sitrep interimed 0500 EDT 19 Jul)
- At 0213 PDT, hard objects were thrown towards members of the Multnomah County Sheriff's Department at 3rd Ave and Madison St. (FPS Sitrep 100000 EDT 19 Jul)
- At 0227 PDT, an FPS Inspector deployed an (b)(7)(E) at a protestor who was attempting to make entry into the Madison St emergency exit at the Edith Green Federal Building. (FPS Sitrep and 0600 EDT 19 Jul)

- Columbus, OH: Protest groups had to be separated by law enforcement at the OH Statehouse (state capitol building). A group was hosting the Stand for America Rally on the Statehouse grounds. The rally at the Statehouse was billed as a gathering in support of freedom and the "principles America was founded on." An opposing group marched to the rally. (CBS 10 WBNS)
- Crawfordville, FL: Approximately 100 BLM protestors marched in Crawfordville. Along the route
  was another 100 counter protestors lining the streets. A line of police separated the protestors
  and counter protestors. One protestor was detained but was later released. (WCTV 10)

The Office of Intelligence and Analysis (I&A) reported a Facebook group has been discussing the Residence Inn where most of the DHS employees are staying. They posted a map showing the exact location of the hotel. The information was also released on Twitter, with 193 responses. I&A analyzed the responses for threats and incitements to violence. (FPS Sitrep 10100 EDT 19 Jul)

It is unknown whether our DHS employees are regularly changing hotel locations to avoid being targeted (or whether the Facebook group has even the correct hotel). Regardless, I wanted to ensure this entry was flagged for you and your components' consideration from an OPSEC point of view.
