AMO is looking for Air Interdiction Agents (pilots) at the GS-1881-11 level to fill positions along the U.S. Southwest border and the Caribbean. This position has an annual salary ranging from \$51,298.00 to \$73,115.00, and promotion potential to the GS-13 level.

MAJOR DUTIES

- > Performs aviation law enforcement operating airplanes, helicopters and unmanned aircraft systems to detect, interdict and prevent acts of terrorism and the unlawful movement of people, illegal drugs and other contraband toward and across the U.S. borders.
- > Performs investigative duties including intelligence gathering, apprehending, testifying and acting as liaison with other federal, state, local, tribal and foreign law enforcement agencies.
- > Develops strategies to track aircraft, vessels and people to accomplish an effective and successful interdiction.

KEY REQUIREMENTS

- > Be a U.S. citizen, pass a background security investigation and polygraph exam, have a valid state driver's license and have resided in the United States for at least the last three years.
- > Be under the age of 37 unless you are a qualified Veterans' Preference-eligible candidate or have previous federal law enforcement experience.
- > Have a current FAA Commercial Pilot Certification or equivalent certification, with the following ratings: Airplane, Single-engine land or Multi-engine land instrument rating; and/or Rotorcraft helicopter with instrument rating.
- > Have a current FAA Class I or Class II medical certificate.
- > Have a minimum of 1,500 hours total flight time (100 hours of airplane and/or helicopter within the last 12 months), including 250 Pilot-in-Command and 75 hours instrument and 75 night hours
- > Be able to carry a firearm while performing duties.
- > Complete training programs including Spanish language instruction.
- > Successful completion of the flight evaluation, oral and written exam.



