Post Summary Corrections Data Availability Changes

BACKGROUND:

On June 4, 2011, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) deployed Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) capabilities to file Post Summary Corrections (PSC) for Consumption and Antidumping/Countervailing (AD/CVD) entry summaries (entry type 01 and 03) via Electronic Data Interchange (EDI).

During the initial PSC deployment, two new filer ownership definitions were added to the system to determine what level of information would be returned via the entry summary query and ACE Reports. The two new filer ownership definitions were **Owner** and **Semi-Private Owner**. ACE compares the “Entry Filer Code” on the B-record of the entry summary query with the “Filer Code” on the entry summary block control table for the latest entry summary version on file. If the filer codes matched, then the filer submitting the entry summary query was considered the **Owner**. However, if the filer was not the current Owner, but was an Owner on a previous entry summary version, then the filer was considered a **Semi-private Owner**. Pursuant to this initial PSC deployment, only the **Owner** was able to access to the latest version of the entry summary.

UPDATED CAPABILITY:

CBP has enhanced the PSC functionality in ACE by now providing entry summary data to filers of all versions of the entry summary. Changes were made on July 27, 2013 to the outbound response message of the ACE ABI entry summary and Census warning queries. On September 7, 2013, CBP deployed these changes to ACE Reports making the latest entry summary information details available to current or previous owners of the entry summary. Therefore, separation of information between owner and semi-private owner no longer exists. CBP will be publishing a Federal Register Notice in the near future announcing these changes.
