

AUTOMATED COMMERCIAL ENVIRONMENT – DEPLOYMENT A NEW ACE FEATURES

In November 2013, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) implemented new ACE features that will further enhance automated trade processing and continue the march toward a Single Window to Government for import and export transactions.



By the end of 2016, ACE will become the Single Window, the primary system through which the international trade community will submit data and documentation required by all Federal agencies for imports and exports and the government will determine their admissibility.

CARGO RELEASE

Expands the Cargo Release (also known as Simplified Entry) pilot

Streamlines processes and furthers the build of full Cargo Release in ACE

- Electronic Entry Corrections/Cancellations
- Split Shipments
- Partial Quantities (without In-Bond)
- In-Bond Shipments

PGA INTEGRATION

Two critical agency pilots provide further step toward Single Window vision

- New pilots of PGA Message Set with Environmental Protection Agency and Food Safety and Inspection Service targeted to begin by the end of calendar year 2013
- Eliminates the redundant manual entry of Agricultural findings data for CBP personnel, resulting in a 33% reduction in workload

ENTRY SUMMARY

New validations will increase the validity of incoming data

Changes to ACE Reports
