



Account Management Committee

The Account Management Committee met on January 22, 2013 to discuss among other things the agenda for the Committee meeting at the TSN Plenary Session. The Committee also identified the outstanding GIFs submitted to CBP by the Committee that they would like to receive an update on from CBP. That list will be forwarded to CBP since the TSN meeting is now planned for the spring. Committee members expressed concern about the data gap in Cargo Entry Reports that exists since data from Simplified Entries is not included in the ACE Cargo Entry Reports. As CBP moves to expand the Simplified Entry Pilot and introduces new Agile Pilots this data gap will grow because trade will not have visibility to the data through reports.

The Committee discussed the PGA Message Set GIF that was drafted earlier with Susan Dyszel and decided that the GIF really should be more than one GIF since it was addressing both 1) the need to include PGA Message Set data in reports which would be available to all users and, 2) the ability to update or correct specific PGA data either submitted electronically or through the Document Image System. The Committee is in the process of updating the GIF and the draft will be sent for review and comment.

Concern was also expressed that there is not a full understanding of the implementation impacts of the PGA Message Set, particularly as it relates to the relationship between brokers, importers and the PGAs. PGAs will have greater visibility and forms will be replaced by data. The communication to the importing community is important. What is the information that is needed; when is it needed; what increased scrutiny/edits might be expected; how is the importer going to supply the data (not just the top five importers). This matter was referred to the TLC for further discussion and resolution.

Automated Export Task Group: Export, Multi-Modal Manifest, ITDS Joint Committees

- The Automated Export Task Group met with CBP (Bill Delansky) on January 28th. Bill briefed the task group on the status of the automated export processing and AES Re-engineering efforts being conducted by CBP. Bill has scheduled another Task Group meeting for early March to keep the trade up to date on these efforts. The AES Re-Engineering effort is part of the new AGILE software development methodology and at some point the trade will be asked to participate in the Agile team meetings.
- The trade's automated export processing user requirement document was completed in October 2012. Those user requirements determined to be in scope will be used by CBP in current automated export processing functional development efforts. Those user requirements

that are in “pending review” status were submitted to CBP for further internal legal and policy review.
