**1. TSN Committee Update**

**Account Management Committee**

No activity to report for this month.

**Entry Committee**

No new activity to report for July 2010.

*On-going business:* The Entry Committee continues to meet via conference call on the first Wednesday of each month. Several items are still being considered within CBP and there remain several open action items from the last monthly meeting, including: (1) the status of the task team that will work on the hybrid technical document requested by the trade (trade POCs for this task team have already been recommended); (2) the status of Entry GIF requesting PSC for type 03 entries; (3) further clarification has been requested on the unknown MID. (*Note: CSMS Message 10-000187 has been issued advising that CBP is discontinuing the use of the unknown Manufacturer Identification Number (MID) as data to report the manufacturer (or supplier) effective September 15, 2010*)

**Export Committee**

No new business to report for July 2010.

*On-going business:* The MMM Export Manifest Task Group in conjunction with the Export committee is developing an export manifest business case for submission to CBP and the Census Bureau. The export committee has also developed and submitted an Export Manifest GIF (CSPO-GIF-940) that is currently documented in the CBP data base. The Export committee is awaiting the draft export manifest business case from the MMM committee for review and comment. The next steps will be for the Export and MMM committee to jointly develop the export manifest business case for presentation to CBP and Census for future discussion on implementing this functionality in ACE.

**ITDS Committee**

The Committee has no new business to report for July.

*On-going business:* The ITDS committee has scheduled a teleconference for August 6, 2010 to continue discussions with the CBP ITDS team on the: 1) CBP/ITDS CONOPS; 2) M1 PGA cargo release issues; 3) Product Information Codes; 4) PGA message sets; 5) Imaging/Scanning capability; and 6) DUNS number

**Legal Policy Committee**

**Multi-Modal Manifest Committee**

The MMM committee conducted a full MMM committee meeting on July 14<sup>th</sup> in conjunction with the CESAC meetings on July 12-13, 2010. The MMM committee has established several Task Groups to develop business cases and requirements for future automated manifest and cargo release functionality. The Task Groups met internally during the month and briefed the full MMM committee on the status of their business case/requirement development activities at the July 14<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**Manifest Diversion Task Group:**

The task group prepared a manifest diversion business case for review and discussion at the July 14 MMM committee meeting.

**In-Bond Task Group:**

The In-Bond task group continues to develop its business case for review by CBP. The task group needs a few more sessions with the CBP in-bond project manager(s) prior to a scheduled November 3 MMM committee meeting.

**House Bill of Lading Release Task Group:**

The Task Group presented its business case for review and review and consideration.

**Automated Export Manifest Task Group:**

The task group is preparing a business case for review and discussion at the November 3 MMM committee meeting.

**2. ACE News**

The following important messages impacting ACE were issued during July/August, 2010:

- **CSMS# 10-000186** (issued 8/2/2010) – Change to Authorized Data Extract Reports. The number of rows available when running an ADE report increased from 1,000,000 to 2,000,000 rows effective August 1, 2010.
- **CSMS# 10-000187** (issued 8/2/2010) – Discontinuation of unknown MIDs. Effective September 15, 2010, CBP is discontinuing the use of unknown MIDs as data to report the manufacturer or supplier.
- **CSMS# 10-000188/189** (issued 8/5/2010) – e-Manifest: Trucks User Guide – English/Spanish

The Cargo Systems Messaging Service (CSMS) is a subscription-based, broadcast message system that provides CBP automated systems users with electronic updates via e-mail.
