Export Committee

After much discussion between the trade and CBP, CBP will be moving forward with the development of an automated export manifest for all modes of transportation. The Export committee will be working with the Multi-Modal Manifest and ITDS committees in the first stages of developing operational user requirements for the implementation of this functionality.

ITDS Committee

As referenced by the Export committee above, the ITDS committee will be working with the Multi-Modal Manifest and ITDS committees on requirements development design for the automated export manifest for all modes of transportation. The ITDS committee will be specifically focused on the roles of the PGAs in export manifest processing.

Multi-Modal Manifest Committee

MMM Committee Meeting: The full MMM Committee was hosted at USDA APHIS on July 19-20 and was briefed on ACE by Cynthia Allen and her team. On the second day of meetings Vincent Annunziato and his team from Booz Allen Hamilton (BAH) led a thorough discussion of "Cargo Release" and received a number of comments. Committee comments on "Cargo Release" were recorded by the BAH team and are being incorporated into the developmental discussion.

ACE M1 Workgroup: Ocean Carriers and Port Authorities are working together and with CBP to complete "Early Adopter Phase." The Committee has pushed out information to all members and to the broader trade community announcing the deployment, encouraging participation, and coordinating development. The Committee also takes this opportunity to praise CBP's ABO and OFO for the ongoing open and thorough communication.

Manifest Diversion Work Group: This month we again received information from the ABO that this issue may, contrary to our earlier understanding, be an active issue. The Committee has a Task Group ready to discuss 'next steps.'

Automated Export Manifest Work Group: At our July 26 meeting, CBP announced that they may have found funding, separate from ACE funds, adequate to the development of this functionality. At this point, it may be possible to deliver a multi-modal export manifest within 18 months. This issue has overlapping functionality with the TSN Export Committee and the TSN ITDS Committee. As such, work will be coordinated with all interested TSN Committee members and between the three Committees. In August CBP will activate a "Small Work Group" to meet bi-weekly and will host a teleconference monthly for wider audience participation. The Committee will meet in teleconference on August 12 to lay the foundation to begin work. Bill Delansky has been appointed as the Program Officer by Customs.

The next **Full MMM Committee meeting** will be held at USDA APHIS, 4700 River Road, Riverdale, MD on October 25 and 26.
