



Account Management Committee Surety Subcommittee Report

The Surety Account Subcommittee and e-Bond Subcommittee had a joint call to discuss the importance of the Automated Surety Interface data that sureties receive from ACS. The call was scheduled as a result of recent talk of the eventual shut down of ACS when ACE becomes the system of record and also based on the February 8, 2012 determination that GIF 959 is not in scope for cargo release. The Subcommittee Trade Chairs are working on an explanation of the importance of the ASI data being transmitted for entries that currently exist in ACS (any updates/liquidations/bills) as well as all new entries (with updates/liquidation/bills) in ACE. They are also drafting comments in response to CBP's follow up to the meeting regarding the tracking and prioritization of GIF 959 and ASI in the future.

Export, Multi-Modal Manifest, ITDS Joint Committee Report (Automated Export Manifest Task Group)

- The AEM Task Group held a teleconference with CBP on March 14 to discuss the revalidation of the trade's export manifest user requirements. Regular meetings will be held with the Task Group as they work with their individual committees on the revalidation effort.
- The next meeting of the AEM Task Group is scheduled for April 18.
- The trade co-chairs of the MMM, Export, and ITDS Committees are coordinating the work of the Automated Export Manifest (AEM) Task Group. The AEM Task Group was formed to coordinate the review and development of trade user requirements related to the automated export manifest. The task group is reviewing trade export manifest user requirements that are currently documented to determine if they: 1) Are accurate; 2) Requires updating; 3) Can be deleted; 4) Require new user requirements.
